From Joe Sterrett '76 Goodman Dean of Athletics

Dear Athletics Partners,

We are now several years into our "Shine Forever" capital campaign for Lehigh, and therefore, several years into our efforts to implement a strategic plan for athletics that was developed in concert with the campaign planning and affirmed by the NCAA Self-Study process that we completed a couple of years ago. Clarity of purpose has not been a question; in our varsity programs we aim to recruit outstanding scholar-athletes, provide high quality coaching and support services, and win championships as we endeavor to promote student-athlete learning and develop leadership. In our non-varsity programs, our plan identifies the need for a comprehensive examination of scope, priorities, and resource requirements in the aim of ensuring opportunities that effectively meet the interests and aspirations of an active campus community.

We have determined that the scope of our varsity program is appropriate, so the key evaluations and actions need to be focused on strategies, resource adequacy, and effectiveness in achieving intended results. College athletics operates in an incredibly dynamic and always competitive environment. This requires a vigilant approach to evaluating our ability to achieve our intentions and a willingness to determine the limits of institutional willingness and/or capacity to invest in people or facilities or program support at or beyond the levels that others have elected to invest. At an institution such as Lehigh, where investment in the academic experience and in providing a high quality and safe campus life are non-negotiable priorities, the challenge for the athletics program has not been one of determining how to allocate traditional budget resources but instead one of identifying and then maximizing funding sources that are supplementary to budgetary allocations.

This summer, working very closely with President Alice Gast, we were able to determine that the athletics resource needs at a competitive level in our league would clearly exceed what could be reasonably funded by the institutional budget. This conclusion was not a surprise since we (the Athletics Department) now contribute about 50% of the annual operating resources (excluding financial aid and physical plant expenses) that are spent on the Lehigh Athletics program. However, it was critically and strategically important to reach the point of collective agreement that this "departmentally-generated" funding model was going to have to be the expected approach to funding athletics for the foreseeable future. Even more important, though, was receiving an affirmation from President Gast that athletics at Lehigh, managed and evaluated within the academic and competitive parameters that Lehigh has adopted, are indeed a priority for the

university. It is heartening to know that the university will support and endorse, as an institutional priority, our efforts to expand self-generated resources such as ticket sales, camp income, external events income, corporate partnership income, merchandising, concessions, and most significantly, charitable gifts. The latter element is somewhat remarkable in that we are coming off a year where we achieved a challenging annual fund raising goal of one million dollars, yet still we envision an enormous upside to this area, primarily because our participation rates have so much room to grow.

Achieving a clear understanding about this approach to athletics funding was an essential step to the process of fairly and thoughtfully evaluating the effectiveness of our staffing structure. As we began to re-evaluate the financial goals that ought to be a part of this now clear financial model, the first consideration had to be whether we have sufficient staffing in place to take on the inevitably higher revenue expectations that will need to be adopted. Concurrent with the evaluation of the administrative organization was the need to fairly and thoughtfully assess the level of support we have provided those varsity sports programs that have demonstrated the capacity to influence revenue generation, either directly or indirectly.

The challenges are obvious—the proverbial "bar" has been raised. And it should be raised, for no matter how much anyone feels has been achieved, the reality is that we are coming off our poorest competitive year of the last 18, and our revenue generation effectiveness has not been where it needs to be. Given our now defined financial model for the future, we have to do better. So the "net" outcomes of the "summer of 2007" included numerous advancements and exciting changes (described further on page 12).

I told our staff last spring, at our end of the year meeting, that I had some serious thinking to do over the summer months, and that there were some important decisions that needed to be made. I have fulfilled that pledge over the course of the summer of 2007. Now, I am inspired to move ahead, aggressively and yet purposefully and strategically. Our staff is on board and is already doing some really great things. Our hope is that you will choose to join us as well.

Academic Achievements

Four Lehigh student-athletes honored with the distinguished Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year award

Jenni Schappert '07 (women's cross country), Gwen Dwyer '07 (women's tennis), Tom Gilbert '07 (Men's Swimming) and Christy Smith '08 (women's lacrosse) were all recognized during the 2006-2007 school year with Patriot League Scholar Athlete of the Year awards. This award is voted on by members of the Patriot League schools and given to one athlete per sport. To be eligible for Scholar-Athlete of the Year, student-athletes must have a cumulative GPA of 3.20 or above, be a starter or a key player in their sport and be at least a sophomore.



Jenni Schappert '07 was selected as the 2006 Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for women's cross country. Schappert posted three of the top six times for the Mountain Hawk women last season and was the top finisher for the women in all four races she competed in. An international relations major with a 3.87 cumulative grade point average, Schappert is the program's first-ever Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Following a remarkable junior season where she became the first-ever Lehigh female athlete to compete at the NCAA Championship Meet, Schappert kicked off her final year in the Brown and White by finishing first

at the Lehigh Valley Cross Country Championships and the Lafayette Dual—the first two meets of the Mountain Hawks' season. She won the Lehigh Valley Cross Country Championships, completing the race in a time of 22:31. Two weeks later at the Lafayette Dual, Schappert shaved nine seconds off her time. The North East, Md. native ran Lehigh's top 6K time of 21:27 at the elite Paul Short Invitational where she finished 24th out of 237 competitors. She capped off her career by finishing fourth overall at the Patriot League Championship Meet by completing the course in a time of 23:47.

Gwen Dwyer '07 was named the 2007 Patriot League women's tennis Scholar-Athlete of the Year, as voted on by the league's sports information directors. Dwyer graduated in May with a 3.55 grade point average, majoring in English, while on the court, Dwyer was a two-year



captain, and a three-time first team all-league selection for the Mountain Hawks.

A native of Philadelphia, Dwyer was one of three Patriot League women's student-athletes to earn a perfect 4.0 in the spring semester, joining Lehigh teammate Francesca Murasko-Blank '07 and Holy Cross' Natalie Lin. Dwyer was a member of the Dean's List and a four-year member of the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll. She was also active in the Lehigh community, working with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Amnesty International.

On the court, Dwyer played first singles and doubles and continually performed at a high level against the opposition's best players. She finished her senior season with a 10-9 record at first singles. Dwyer's Lehigh career ended with 40 singles wins and 39 doubles wins, and she ranks among Lehigh's career leaders in both categories.

Dwyer's honor marks the first time a student-athlete from Lehigh has been named Scholar-Athlete of the Year in women's tennis.

The concept of the multi-sport athlete at the Division I college level has become increasingly rare. In this era of specialization, young student-athletes generally focus on maximizing their potential in one sport on the college level. Christy Smith '08 has emerged as an exception to the rule. The senior from Downingtown, Pennsylvania is one of three Lehigh student-athletes who play field hockey in the fall and lacrosse in the spring; but what sets Christy apart is the success she's experienced. Christy is an all-region performer in field hockey, and is the reigning Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for lacrosse; and oh by the way, she carries a 3.88 grade point average in industrial engineering. It's an extraordinary time commitment, but one she clearly balances well.



It doesn't hurt to have a pair of supportive coaches, both of whom successfully mastered the field hockey-lacrosse double in college. Field hockey coach Julie Mazer played both sports at West Chester, and lacrosse coach Liz Ota '95 was a second-team All-America at Lehigh.

"Having two supportive coaches has made a big difference," says Smith. "It's an amazing opportunity to play both sports. The coaches' styles are different, and the personalities on the teams are different, but it helps you appreciate both sides of the spectrum."

"The concept of the two-sport athlete is a dinosaur," explains Ota. "What helps Christy is that she has two head coaches that relate to her exceptionally well. I don't think Julie or I resent the fact that we don't have her for half the year, because we know she's gaining competitive experience in the off season."

"Christy is very talented, she has all the natural gifts," adds Mazer. "She also has a very strong work ethic. Most athletes have either the natural talent or the work ethic, but she has both, and that's why she can excel."

The numbers speak for themselves: a team-best eight goals last field hockey season, followed by 22 goals on the lacrosse field in the spring. But equally important for Christy is what she's accomplished off the field.

When she's not burning opposing players with her speed, Smith has been burning pizza sauce in a lab setting, as part of her Integrated Business and Engineering (IBE) capstone course. As part of this six-credit, year-long course, Smith and a team of students have been working with start-up entrepreneurs to develop and commercialize a new product that will prevent pizza sauce from burning when left cooking on a stove top.

The team has presented the idea of using magnetic stirrers, most commonly used in chemistry labs.

"Christy and the team's first job was to investigate the technology to determine if it indeed could be manufactured to meet pre-established technical specs and then to explore the marketplace to identify potential market applications," says Pat Costa, Christy's professor in this IBE capstone course.

The team will formally present its findings to the Ben Franklin Technology Partners on the Goodman Campus in December.

"Christy has demonstrated strong leadership skills," notes Costa. "She was instrumental in leading the initiative to develop an independent testing protocol. She burnt lots of sauce last semester in the lab, and analyzed the data for its meaningfulness to the project. She has exhibited all the analytical skills that would help her become a successful engineer as well as a visionary business leader."

Costa concludes, "Christy has the kind of work ethic and personal integrity that has made everyone associated with her in the IBE Program a better student and better teacher because she is part of our community."

In addition, Smith has spent the last two summers gaining valuable experience interning at Synthes, a medical device company out of West Chester.

"I was able to get the internship through alumni contacts," says Smith. "I've been there the last two summers; the first year I worked on the manufacturing side and this past year I worked in product development."

In her first year, Smith worked predominantly on time studies and the plant layout, but in product development she spent time in cadaver labs. Among the medical devices that Synthes specializes in are plates and screws for broken bones.

With her senior year underway, Christy is keeping her post graduation options open. As the field hockey season continues,

Christy is enjoying the opportunity to play in the same mid-field line as her sister Lindsey, a sophomore, who like Christy plays both field hockey and lacrosse for Lehigh and majors in industrial engineering.

"Because of the positive experiences I had early on, I certainly encouraged Lindsey to come to Lehigh too," says Christy. "It's just an added bonus to get to play along side her."

And an added bonus for Lehigh to have a well-rounded student-athlete like Christy Smith on its playing fields and in its classrooms.

Tom Gilbert '07 was named the 2007 Patriot League men's swimming and diving Scholar-Athlete of the Year, as voted on by the league's sports information directors. Gilbert is a four-time All-Patriot League selection in the pool for the Mountain Hawks, and also carries a 3.47 cumulative grade point average as an accounting major.

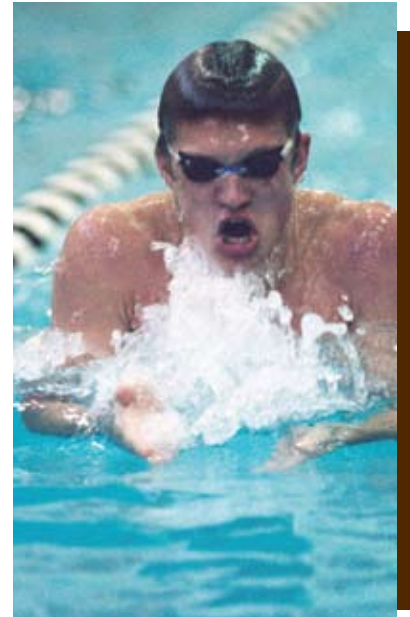
"I am very humbled to win this award," said Gilbert. "I feel our league continues to get faster and faster in the Division I realm of our sport, yet we continue to be tops in the classroom, and to represent that is a great feeling."

Gilbert earned first team all-league honors after posting a pair of second place finishes at February's Patriot League Championships. The Robesonia, Pennsylvania native broke his own school records in both the 100 and 200 yard backstroke events, and added a fourth place finish in the 400 yard individual medley. A team captain, Gilbert also was a member of four top-four finishing relay teams at the championships, and helped lead the Lehigh men to a fourth place finish overall.

In the classroom, Gilbert was twice named to the Patriot League's Academic Honor Roll. As a student, Gilbert successfully met the challenges of being an accounting major, particularly in his junior year and was unhindered in his pursuit of athletic success. Gilbert earned an internship with PricewaterhouseCoopers in the summer of 2006, and parlayed that experience into a job which he accepted early in the academic year.

"Winning this award means a lot to me because four years ago Lehigh gave me an opportunity and an environment to succeed," said Gilbert "I feel this award signifies the hard work and the challenges it took along the way. To see the work finally pay off is a great way to end my senior year."

Gilbert becomes the third Lehigh men's swimmer to be named Scholar-Athlete of the Year, joining Jeff Cline (1996) and Jason Boire (2000).

Blount named Arthur Ashe Scholar

Adrienne Blount '07 was one of 81 women's basketball players nationwide to be named a 2007 Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar, earning an honorable mention. She is the sixth Lehigh student-athlete, and the third from the women's basketball program, to be named an Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar in the last six years. To be considered for the award, student-athletes must compete in an intercollegiate sport, maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.2 and be active on campus or within the community.

Blount joins Teniece Johnson '04 and Carli Toliver '05 as the trio of Lehigh basketball players to be named Arthur Ashe Sports Scholars. Among Lehigh's other past Arthur Ashe Sports Scholars are Lavar Pope (men's track and field), Sabrina Slater (women's rowing) and Laura Tom (women's track and field). Toliver and Pope are both two-time honorees with Toliver being selected in 2002 and 2005 and Pope being a recipient in 2003 and 2005. The award was named after tennis legend Arthur Ashe Jr. and honors students of color who have achieved a winning combination in both academics and athletics.

Blount led the team in points with 12.5 per game last season. Her 8.3 rebounds per game was not only the best on the team, but also in the Patriot League. She was Lehigh's top rebounder in 25 games, including 11 straight. Blount broke single game career-highs for points, assists, field goals made, free throws made and minutes played as well as tied her career-high for rebounds. Blount finished her career in the Brown and White ranked seventh all-time on Lehigh's rebounds list with 614 boards. Blount, who started in 30 games, set new single season highs for rebounds (249) and assists (42). The Mahopac, N.Y. native recorded seven double-doubles, including a pair in the Patriot League Tournament that landed her on the All-Tournament Team. Blount was also selected to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District II Second-Team for her accomplishments in both the classroom and on the court.



Athletic Success

Two are named All-Americans for Men's Soccer

John O'Reilly '07 and Joe Verdi '07 were named to the NCAA Division I Men's NSCAA Adidas All-America team. O'Reilly and Verdi become just the ninth and tenth All-Americans in Lehigh's history and the first since Evan Bruno '02 (pictured, middle) garnered the accolade in 2001. O'Reilly was named a First-Team selection, while Verdi was honored as a Third-Team selection. Lehigh is one of just six schools in the nation to have two players selected, joining Maryland, Notre Dame, SMU, UC Santa Barbara and West Virginia.

O'Reilly and Verdi become just the third and fourth All-Americans at Lehigh since 1947. They are the first teammates

to receive the honor for the Brown and White since Lewis Byers and John Williams accomplished the feat back in 1931.

2006 Patriot League Coach of the Year Dean Koski offers his thoughts on his pair of All-Americans.

"Having two players named as All-Americans is the capstone to an unprecedented season of team and individual accomplishments. I am delighted for Joe Verdi and John O'Reilly who were the backbone of our nationally ranked defense. It is another opportunity for our program to be recognized

on the national landscape of Division I soccer and we are very proud to have Joe and John as All-Americans." O'Reilly and Verdi are the second and third All-Americans under Koski, joining Bruno.

O'Reilly and Verdi were also both honored as First-Team All-Region selections, joining teammates Jim Taranto and Jim Morahan. One of the team's two center backs, O'Reilly helped keep opponents out of Lehigh's defensive end as the Mountain Hawks allowed only ten goals—the fewest goals allowed since 1964. On the offensive side of the ball, O'Reilly scored six times—four of which were off dead balls with his other two resulting off dead ball situations. The Arlington, Mass. native also had the winning shootout attempt against Rhode Island in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to send the Mountain Hawks into the sweet sixteen of the tournament.

Verdi served as the team's other center back, partnering with O'Reilly to make it tough for the opponent's to penetrate the Lehigh defensive zone by going down the middle of the field. Offensively, Verdi tallied a career high three goals and one assist. He was named two times to national teams of the week—once by College Soccer News and once by SoccerAmerica.com. The Ivyland, Pa. native earned his second All-League selection by being named to the First-Team.



Marquis Hall garners Rookie of the Year award

Marquis Hall '10 was named the 2007 Patriot League Rookie of the Year last year to become Lehigh's first-ever Rookie of the Year. Hall and classmate Zahir Carrington are the first Mountain Hawk teammates to be named to the All-Rookie Team since 1996-97 when Jared Hess and Fido Wilybiro were selected.



"For Marquis to be rewarded for the season he had was nice recognition, and also for Zahir, it's great to see our young men rewarded for all of their hard work and accomplishments this season," former Lehigh head coach Billy Taylor said.

Hall was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Week a league record eight consecutive times, and nine times overall. The Portland, Oregon native averaged 32.3 minutes, 11.0 points, 4.2 assists and 3.4 rebounds, while having started 29 of Lehigh's 30 games. Hall scored in double figures 16 times, including ten times in league play, and led the Mountain Hawks in assists 23 times and in steals 12 times. During Patriot League play, Hall averaged 13.9 points per game, while shooting 45 percent from the field and 43 percent from three-point range. The business major who also garnered freshman mid-major All-American accolades netted a career-high 24 points in a victory over archrival Lafayette on January 20. For the season, Hall's 339 points place him in third place all-time for freshman scoring in school annals.

Steve Suarez honored as Co-Rookie of the Year for Men's Golf



Steve Suarez '10 was honored as the 2007 Patriot League Co-Rookie of the Year in 2007 while collecting an honorable mention accolade from the Patriot League for his play in the month of April. Suarez led the Mountain Hawks in every match they played in during April but one, including the 2007 Patriot League Championships as the freshman shot a 220, good for a fourth-place tie overall.

Suarez began the month shooting an 81 at the Navy Spring Invite, as he finished in a tie for 80th place, playing with the likes of St. Bonaventure, Penn, Seton Hall and Delaware. On April 14, Suarez finished in a tie for 12th place as he shot a 77 and helped lead the Moun-

tain Hawks to the team crown at the Lafayette Invitational. Lehigh defeated teams such as LIU, Monmouth, Manhattan, Lafayette and Hofstra to claim the title.

Suarez captured individual medalist honors at the Lehigh Valley Invite on April 18, shooting a 71 as Lehigh again won the team championship, defeating local rivals Lafayette, Muhlenberg and Moravian. At the Patriot League Championships Suarez shot individual rounds of 75, 72, and 73 to finish in a tie for fourth and claim the league's Rookie of the Year honor. He is Lehigh's first-ever Rookie of the Year honoree.

Kate Marvel and Lisa Sweeney honored as Pitcher and Player of the Year

Lehigh softball players **Kate Marvel '08** and **Lisa Sweeney '09** were named the Patriot League's Player and Pitcher of the Year, respectively, for 2007 while being recognized on the ECAC Division I softball All-Star team. Marvel and Sweeney were among the 12 student-athletes named to the team and both played significant roles in a season that saw the Mountain Hawks win 35 games and capture their ninth straight Patriot League regular season title.

The Mountain Hawks' leadoff hitter and starting center fielder, Marvel put together a stellar junior season en route to earning first team All-Patriot League honors for the third straight year. Marvel was later named the league's Player of the Year and first team NFCA Mid-Atlantic All-Region team performer for the second straight year. The Manasquan, N.J. native was the Patriot League's leading hitter, with a .415 average. Marvel also led the league in runs scored (37), triples (8) and tied for the league lead with 61 base hits.

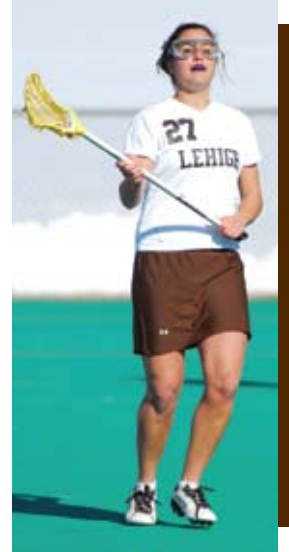
Sweeney parlayed her second straight Patriot League Pitcher of the Year Award into her second consecutive first team All-Region nod, and now adds ECAC All-Star to the list of honors. In her sophomore campaign, Sweeney led the Patriot League with 19 victories and a 1.47 earned run average. The Lumberton, N.J. native also led the league in saves and opponents batting average, while her 155 strikeouts were one off the league lead. Sweeney also threw five shutouts in 2007, including no-hitters versus Harvard and Penn; the third and fourth no-hitters of her career.



Inneka Carmola voted Patriot League Rookie of the Year

Inneka Carmola '10 was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Year for the spring of 2007 in women's lacrosse. After leading Lehigh to a second place regular season finish in the league. For the second consecutive season, a Mountain Hawk was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Year, as Carmola follows Sara MacIntyre's honor of a year ago. She becomes the fourth Lehigh player to earn Rookie of the Year honors, joining MacIntyre '09, Kristin Gillis (1992), and Jill Altshuler (1993).

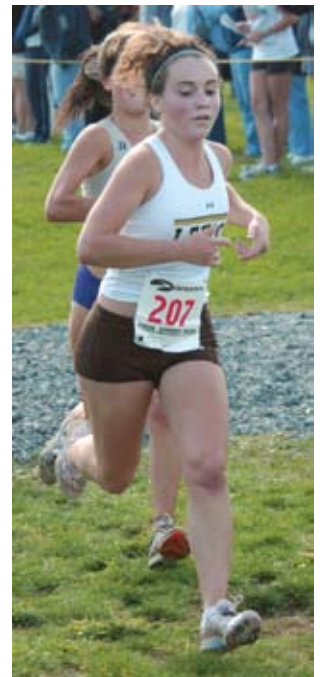
Carmola was also named a First-Team All-League selection, scoring 44 goals during the regular season, and more than one on 12 occasions, including a career-best seven in a league victory over Colgate. Carmola led the Brown and White in points, goals, shots, game-winning goals and she led the Patriot League in free-position goals.



Kaitlin Grimm grabs Patriot League Rookie of the Year award

In just one season of racing in the Brown and White, **Kaitlin Grimm '10** has already earned a spot in Lehigh history as she became the first-ever Mountain Hawk to be named the Patriot League's Rookie of the Year. Grimm has been a top runner for the Mountain Hawk women, being just one of two freshmen to compete in all five varsity races for the Brown and White.

Grimm started her collegiate career with a fifth place finish at the Lehigh Valley Championships where she ran a season-best 23:10. In the four regular season meets, the Pittsburgh native ran sub 24:00, including a 23:26.6 at the Arkansas Chile Pepper Festival and a 23:36 in the Paul Short Collegiate Meet—both races where the Mountain Hawks competed against nationally ranked competition.

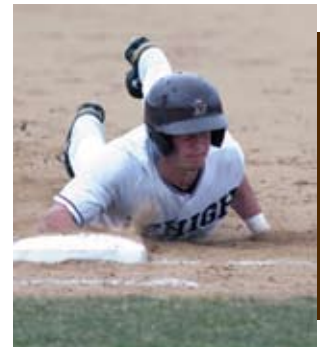

Community Outreach by Athletes who Care about Helping (C.O.A.C.H.) is a service program that operates in accordance with the National Consortium for Academics and Sports to help (along with parents, teachers and coaches) elementary, middle and high school student-athletes and their peers, make informed choices regarding their education, drug and alcohol issues and other factors which may affect reaching their full potential. The participating Lehigh student-athletes talk about substance abuse, time management, academic motivation and other concerns of younger students and student-athletes. This program offers Lehigh student-athletes as "C.O.A.C.H."es for elementary, middle and high school students.

The vision for the program is to involve as many Lehigh athletes as possible in meaningful community service experiences that reach as many young people as possible. The intent of the program is to inspire both the youth of our community and the Lehigh student-athletes to set high goals, to serve others less fortunate than ourselves, and to believe in the power of clear values, healthy and smart decision-making, mentoring, and dreams.

The Lehigh Athletics C.O.A.C.H program had some inspiring outcomes in the 2006-2007 school year as they established new records across the board. The group combined for over 500 hours of community service in the Lehigh Valley which included visiting local schools to promote responsibility, education, leadership, passion and inspiration. The program had 145 student-athlete participants and almost 5,000 children's lives were touched by the program. The student-athletes raised over \$50,000 through various charitable activities including Adopt-A-Family, Fall Breakfast for a Buck for Muscular Dystrophy, Spring Breakfast for a Buck for St. Jude Children's Hospital and Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, and Breast Cancer.

"The thing about the C.O.A.C.H. program is that we're the ones helping out with these great causes, but we get so much joy out of helping young children and throughout the

community," explained Courtney Elder '07, one of two C.O.A.C.H. program chairs. "You see the looks on the people's faces and it makes you feel really good about what you're doing."

This award-winning, student run program organized the bi-annual Breakfast for a Buck events. Over 700 students and members of the Lehigh community packed Rathbone Dining Hall on Wednesday, October 25, for the fall 2006 "Breakfast" event, which was sponsored by several campus groups including Residential Services and the C.O.A.C.H. program.

Every semester the program chooses a different cause to raise money for. Proceeds from this particular event went to the fight against muscular dystrophy. For a dollar, Lehigh students, student-athletes and staff were able to enjoy breakfast at night and were provided an opportunity to spend time with friends and relax. Many student-athletes saw the event as a pleasant diversion during a week filled with rigorous four o'clock exams. In all, over a thousand dollars was raised on the evening.

The spring 2007 **Breakfast for a Buck** event was truly special. The event was held on April 11th and raised money for St. Jude Children's Hospital and Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma in support of the family of a former Lehigh student-athlete and C.O.A.C.H. participant. Over 1,000 people attended the spring late night breakfast and contributed to the almost \$20,000 raised, Breakfast for a Buck's largest amount ever.

"I feel our student athletes with the support of the Lehigh community worked very hard to make Breakfast for a Buck another successful event," Roseann Corsi, Lehigh's Public Relations Coordinator said. "By working together, the reward was knowing that we have helped a great cause."

Lehigh student-athletes also took the opportunity to give back to the community by hosting the C.O.A.C.H. program's annual **Adopt-A-Family** event. For this program, each athletic team at Lehigh adopted an underprivileged family from the Bethlehem community. Each family had a holiday wish list which our student-athletes made come true. The teams raised money throughout the fall semester in order to purchase gifts for their family. Many of the wish lists included necessities such as beds, toiletries, clothes and money for food. In addition to these essentials the student-athletes were able to make holiday wishes come true by purchasing gifts such as televisions, bicycles, and toys for their families.

A reception was held so that the teams could meet their families, present them with their gifts, and share in a truly magical evening. Food and drinks were provided to make the evening special for all parties involved and Santa Claus was on hand to spread holiday cheer, along with Jolly Holly the Clown and Lehigh's own mascot the Mountain Hawk. The event took on a Christmas Eve-type atmosphere when the children were allowed to open a few special gifts with their team.

"We spend so much time training throughout the year, that sometimes we lose sight of the important things," said Colin Mistele '07, a member of the men's lacrosse team. "The holidays are an important time for so many people, that if we can put the time and effort in with our teammates, we can make a

lot of people's holidays better. It really means a lot to all of us to be able to help out in anyway we can."

The Adopt-A-Family program is now in its ninth year. By participating in community outreach programs, like Adopt-A-Family, many Lehigh student-athletes are doing their best to make a difference in the community around them.

In all, the group accounted for over 500 hours of community service in the Lehigh Valley, coordinated over 22 events, and is responsible for thousands of smiles on the faces of the special people of our community. For their efforts the C.O.A.C.H. Program has received the National Consortium for Academics and Sports award for its outstanding outreach and community service for five consecutive years.

Advancement for the Future

The summer of 2007 will be one that I always remember as filled with purposeful and promising organizational change within our Lehigh Athletics Department. As the semester began, we had 10 new full-time staff members (with one more vacancy to be resolved), 2 staff with new assignments, and 4 staff that have been promoted. This totaled 17 significant personnel moves that occurred over the summer, not including the implications for other full-time staff or the new graduate assistant and part-time staff members that came aboard. Indeed, it was a busy summer!

The first steps that have been taken as a result of this clarity about our financial model were steps that enhance our capacity to focus on revenue enhancement in several revenue producing areas. Specifically, the following organizational adjustments took place this summer:

1. We added a full-time staff member to our external events/facilities management team (**Kristy Miles**) and we promoted **Jason Gall** in order to provide more support for the revenue generating potential in this area. In Jason's case, he will be responsible for our golf practice complex and the revenue opportunities it provides us.
2. We reorganized our equipment and laundry operations, adding formally the responsibilities for our athletics merchandising initiatives as well as the concessions operations. A new position, filled by **Meghan Gove '06**, was created to manage athletics merchandising and concessions, and the position descriptions of **Kim Miller '96** and **Tyler Osler** were modified to align with the expanding focus of this area.
3. The ticket operation was relieved of the burden of managing concessions in order to focus full attentions on enhancing ticket sales. A corollary objective for this year is to achieve a much better understanding of the constituency that attends our events so that we can begin to appropriately tailor our promotional, merchandising, and event experience efforts. Special attention will be given to student attendance and spirit initiatives.
4. Our summer camps operations will be enhanced in some way by some augmentation of staffing support. This commitment, which has yet to be finalized, will provide appropriate staffing support for an enterprise that is nearly a \$1 million gross revenues operation, and it will enable us to apply **Julie Oltman**'s considerable talents with systems and technology to several of our key "business" activities in the department. As we seek to grow our revenues we have to be efficient and compliant in all that we do and Julie has the ability to contribute substantially to this obligation.
5. The expansion of our administrative staff also includes the addition of **Chris Wakely**. Chris will assume a role where he will oversee and help evaluate our recruiting operations

and effectiveness, while providing support to our head coaches in this vital area. Additionally, Chris will take on some of the very time consuming reporting and information management responsibilities that have previously been handled by Karen Adams or myself, thereby freeing us to use that time for other purposes. He will also apply his 16 years of coaching experience to provide administrative support for several programs and to the orientation and mentoring of all new head coaches.

6. The non-varsity dimensions of our athletics programming are less visible than the varsity programs yet they serve a larger population and have the potential to enrich the student experience in deeply meaningful and life-long ways. Non-varsity programming is an important but comparatively undeveloped priority within our strategic plan, primarily because we have not allocated the kind of resource support (staff or program dollars) that are necessary. Given the realities of financial self-reliance, it became critical for us to find a way to expand resource support for our non-varsity programs. Accordingly, **Barb Turanchik '75** has moved to a role where she will direct our club sports program and also initiate some revenue generating and fund raising initiatives for the broad non-varsity program areas (intramural sports, club sports, recreation, fitness, and instructional programming). This move allows us to reorganize the duties of **Jane Josephson** and **Doug Strange** so that each can devote more attention to priority initiatives. Barb's successful experience with our Athletics Partnership program will serve well the non-varsity programming that involves more than 3000 student participants.

7. The decision to address our non-varsity sport area by adding staffing and adopting a revenue generating strategy obviously created a major void in the critical area of our Athletics Partnership program. Less obvious but no less important is the absence of the kind of organizational structure that would provide additional leadership, coordination, mentoring, and creativity for our revenue generating units. Additionally, a different organizational structure will enhance the development of marketing, communications, imaging, and media plans that are cohesive, effective, and supportive of our resource intentions. These voids will be more than filled by a distinctively qualified individual. A fortuitous set of circumstances and timing presented the opportunity for alumnus, Athletics Hall of Fame member, former alumni chair of our Athletics Partnership program, former president of the Lehigh Alumni Association, and former Alumni Trustee, **Bill Griffin '79** to join our staff as Associate Director for External Relations and Advancement. Bill will bring to our department his 28 year business career in sales, marketing, and business development and his many years of direct and influential alumni service. He will provide leadership and coordination for most of our revenue generating opera-

tions and will direct our Athletics Partnership program. Bill will also help Karen Adams and me to oversee and provide support for our head coaching staff.

8. Senior Associate Director **Karen Adams** will continue to lead the department in our day-to-day, week-to-week, month-to-month, and in our annual operations. Her distinctive abilities to promote quality planning, evaluation, and accountability have resulted in exceptional financial manage-

ment of available resources, and wise counsel for many of our varsity programs. Karen will continue to lead the internal operations of the department; she will monitor our overall operating effectiveness; and she will continue to provide oversight and support for a number of program managers and head coaches.

I have work yet to do in all of these areas, but the "summer of 2007" has been one of significant progress and leaves us poised to do some exciting things in the year ahead.



Cassese Named Head Coach of Men's Lacrosse program

Following an extensive national search, Lehigh has named former Duke assistant coach **Kevin Cassese** to the newly endowed Smith Family

(Daniel E. Smith '71) Head Men's Lacrosse Coach. Cassese replaces Chris Wakely, who stepped down last month due to a medical concern. "I'm excited for this wonderful opportunity to be the head coach at Lehigh University," Cassese said on Thursday. "Lehigh is an excellent school, one of the top academic institutions in the country and I am looking forward to being a part of the Mountain Hawk family."

Cassese continued, "There are terrific kids within this program who received great direction under Chris Wakely for the past six years and I plan to continue the tradition that Coach Wakely started and also build a tradition of excellence with the intention of bringing the program to new heights."

"Kevin Cassese has all the qualities to be an exceptional college head coach," Lehigh Dean of Athletics Joe Sterrett explained. "He inspired everyone during his interview and his references were even more impressive, both in terms of the individuals who encouraged us to consider him, and in terms of the specific things they had to say about him. I believe our athletes will find his enthusiasm and passion for lacrosse, his organization, his preparation, his attention to detail, his personal values and his self-confidence to be truly distinctive qualities."

One of the most decorated student athletes in Duke history, Cassese served as an assistant at his alma mater since 2005, helping lead the Blue Devils to an appearance in the 2007 National Championship game. He also served as Duke's interim head coach for part of the summer of 2006. Prior to Duke, Cassese spent one season at Stony Brook as an assis-

tant where he directed the nation's top extra man offense and helped the Seawolves to a 10-6 record in 2004.

A two time captain and three time All-ACC selection while at Duke, Cassese helped lead the Blue Devils to three NCAA Tournament appearances and a pair of ACC Championships during his collegiate career. Cassese earned All-America honors on three separate occasions including First-Team accolades in 2002 and 2003. Cassese, who scored 80 goals and handed out 38 assists during his time at Duke, was a two time finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy and garnered ACC Player of the Year honors in 2001. In 2002, Cassese was the recipient of the Lt. Donald MacLaughlin, Jr. Award as the nation's top midfielder.

An accomplished player on the national level as well, Cassese helped the United States to the gold medal at the 2002 International Lacrosse Federation world championships and he was also a member of the United States team that placed second at the 2006 ILF world championships in London, Ontario. Cassese was the number two overall election in the Major League Lacrosse draft by the Rochester Rattlers in 2003, where among his professional accomplishments are a pair of MLL Rookie of the Week honors and a spot on the 2005 All-Star team.

Wakely offered his thoughts on his successor. I am excited for the entire Lehigh Lacrosse family as I am profoundly confident that Lehigh University has selected the right individual, at the right time, to lead the excellent young men of the men's lacrosse program."

A native of Port Jefferson Station, New York and graduate of Comsewogue High School, Cassese earned his bachelors degree in sociology from Duke in 2003, garnering USILA Scholar All-American and ACC Academic Honor Roll honors as well as the ACC's Weaver-James-Corrigan Honorary Award for outstanding athletic and academic achievement.

Cassese and his wife, the former Katie Granson who attended nearby Freedom High School, were recently married in Bethlehem in December of 2006.



Meltzer named Lehigh Rowing Coach

Lehigh University has named **Liz Meltzer** as the Steven J. '69 and Karen A. Lee Head Rowing Coach. Meltzer, who has served as an assistant coach at Lehigh since the start of the 2005-06 season, replaces Paul Savell who left Lehigh in July

to become the Director of Rowing at Drexel University. Her duties include overseeing the entire rowing program, coaching the women's teams and directing the recruitment efforts. "I am honored to be appointed to lead the rowing program at Lehigh University and am excited to build on the successful traditions that Paul Savell instilled during his time as the Head Coach," Meltzer explained.

"I know I am inheriting a stable program that enjoys the support of the Lehigh University Athletic Department and is full of stellar student athletes. I

plan to build on our successful spring season by promoting a team culture that is deliberate in our acquisition of boat speed and relentless in our pursuit of excellence in all endeavors, be it on the water or in the classroom."

Meltzer quickly appointed Jason Moorehead as the program's Head Men's Varsity Coach. Moorehead has been an assistant at Lehigh for the past seven years. During his time with the Lehigh Crew, Jason has been very successful on the freshman level and I am confident that he will be able to produce fast varsity crews consistently."

During her time at Lehigh, Meltzer has been responsible for a number of duties, including the planning, organization and oversight of the rowing program's recruitment effort. Through her efforts, the program secured commitments from 28 rowers this past June, making up the first-ever Lehigh rowing recruiting class. On the water, the Washington, D.C. native led the Lehigh freshmen women's crew to a second place finish at the 2006 Navy Day Regatta, as well as first and second place finishes at the 2006 Frostbite Regatta and a top-ten finish at the 2007 Dad Vail Regatta.

Prior to coming to Lehigh, Meltzer served as the head coach of the American University rowing program in Washington, D.C. for three years. While at American, Meltzer also coached DeMatha High School's freshmen men, Walter Johnson High School's varsity and novice teams and she served as the associate coach for the intermediate masters of the D.C. Strokes Rowing Club. While under Meltzer's leadership, the American University crew won the 2003 Dad Vail Novice Lightweight 8 Championship race, and had crews take first and second at the Head of the Schuylkill Regatta as well as the Head of the Occoquan.

Meltzer earned her bachelors degree from The Johns Hopkins University in 2002 where she served as captain of the crew. She later went onto earn her masters degree from American University in Health Promotion Management in the summer of 2005.



Maurer set to lead Volleyball Program

With plenty of energy and a desire to teach the game, **Jenny Maurer** enters her first season at the helm of the Mountain Hawks as the volleyball program's 11th head coach. What makes Maurer's appointment unique is that Lehigh is the first collegiate team she has coached.

"It is a dream come true," said Maurer, a native of St. Louis, Mo. "I have a deep passion to teach the game and stepping into this position, I will be doing just that. I have met the team and have found them to be a classy and resilient group of athletes. Last year's record speaks nothing to who they are as people or athletes and they are ready to learn and do whatever it takes to bring the volleyball program back to Patriot League prominence and beyond."

Teaching and coaching will be no strange tasks for Maurer, who spent the last seven years as a Social Studies teacher for the Rockwood School District in Missouri while serving as head coach of St. Joseph's Academy in St. Louis. At St. Joseph's, Maurer was 182-63 and led the team to five District and Sectional championships. She also guided her teams to consecutive second place finishes in the Missouri Class 4 State Championships for the last three years and saw her team rank nationally in the top 100 for the last four.

Maurer played all four years of her collegiate career at Washington University under legendary Teri Clemens, who was the winningest coach in NCAA history at the time of her retirement in 1998. Maurer was a member of the Washington University squad that won the NCAA Division III National Championship in 1995 and 1996, advanced to the NCAA Final Four in 1997 and made it to the NCAA quarterfinals in 1998.

Individually, Maurer was a distinguished athlete with multiple conference, regional, and national honors to her name. She was named First-Team All-University Athletic Association three times and was also a three-time First-Team All-South honoree. At the 1996 Final Four, Maurer was selected to the Final Four All-Tournament Team. In 1997 and 1998, Maurer received First-Team All-American status from two different outlets—the AVCA and Asics/Volleyball Magazine. From 1996-98, she was selected as Division III National Player of the Week three times.

Maurer graduated from Washington University with a B.A. in Psychology in 1999 and then received her masters in Education from Lindenwood University in May 2003.

Maurer and her husband, Todd, have a son, Hudson, who was born in 2006.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. - Construction is nearly complete on a golf practice complex on the Goodman Campus that will house driving, putting and chipping ranges as well as a clubhouse. The idea was a brainchild of Lehigh's ILE (Integrated Learning Experience) project, which consisted of a group of students ranging anywhere from finance and accounting to civil engineering and architecture majors, whose assignment was to finalize a business plan for the practice complex.

Lehigh's new project will cover approximately 75 acres of leased farmland that straddles Bethlehem and Lower Saucon Township on the Goodman campus. The facility, which is not being marketed to the public, will feature two practice greens (one for putting, one for chipping and bunker shots) and a driving range overlooking Goodman Stadium and Stabler Arena.

Lehigh's men's and women's golf teams will benefit from the range, which will give them a designated place to practice. The teams play rounds at Saucon Valley Country Club but use ranges at Center Valley, Wedgewood or Bethlehem Municipal. In addition, students, faculty and Lehigh alumni will be able to use the facility.

Sterrett and economics professor Vincent Munley last year convened a team of engineering, architecture, business and journalism majors to market-test the golf project on campus and design the facility. With an endowment from an anonymous donor (a Lehigh graduate), the golf facility is scheduled to be built without money from the school's athletic budget. Sterrett hopes the project will be self-operating and won't require university investment.

"We didn't want to be in the golf course business," Sterrett said, "but we are in the education business. To have a place where people can learn to play the game will be enormously valuable to a community like this."

This is the second project on the Goodman Campus that Lehigh's ILE program has designed, with the Ronald J. Ulrich Sports Complex, a soccer, field hockey and lacrosse facility with lighted grass and astro turf surfaces, which was completed in the summer of 2001.

Honoring Coach Bill Leckonby



Over 100 Lehigh football players met to honor former, longtime head coach and athletic director William B. Leckonby on Saturday, September 30, 2006 for the dedication of Lehigh's football locker rooms at the A. Haigh Cundey Varsity House. The Athletics Partnership sponsored event was held in conjunction with the 1961 Lambert Cup Team reunion.

As Lehigh's football coach, he had an 85-53-5 mark for 16 seasons between 1946 and 1961. He coached the 1950 Lehigh team to the school's only perfect-record season in 109 years of football. His 1957 squad won the first Lambert Cup, when it was established for mid-sized school gridiron eastern supremacy. Lehigh won the Lambert Cup again in his final season on the sideline in 1961.

Leckonby came to Lehigh in 1946, following his Naval duty in World War II. He ranks as one of St. Lawrence University's all-time greatest triple threat backs and played for Jock Sutherland's Brooklyn Dodgers in the National Football League.

As director athletics at Lehigh from 1962 through 1984, Leckonby oversaw a period of vast expansion at the university, which included the development of the Murray H. Goodman campus and the initiation of women's intercollegiate athletic programs.

In honor of his impact as an athlete and legendary collegiate coach, Leckonby was rewarded with inductions into the St. Lawrence and Lehigh Athletics Halls of Fame.

Following the reunion and dedication team members attended the Lehigh vs. Harvard football game at Goodman Stadium. Members of Leckonby teams from different eras were honored at a halftime ceremony.



Honoring Coach Gerry Leeman

Lehigh wrestlers met to honor former coach Gerry Leeman for an All-Leeman Reunion on Sunday, February 18, at the Leeman-Turner Arena in Grace Hall. The event was sponsored by the Lehigh Athletics Partnership and followed the Lehigh vs. Penn wrestling match at Stabler Arena.

Leeman was recruited to join the Lehigh wrestling staff by renowned coach Billy Sheridan in 1950. He took over the head coach position in 1953 and produced 18 winning seasons in 18 years, including Lehigh's all-time finest record of 12-0-0 during the 1961-62 season. He coached six men to nine NCAA titles and 22 men to 36 EIWA crowns. With 161 all-time dual victories, Leeman is fourth in school annals, behind Sheridan, current head coach Greg Strobel, and Thad Turner.

Even after his official retirement as head wrestling coach in 1970, Leeman remained active with Lehigh wrestling and other athletic programs. He served as an assistant to Turner from 1971-1982 and also coached tennis, soccer, cross-country and track. Leeman never had a losing record during his 34 years at Lehigh.

The accomplishments of Leeman's teams can be traced back to his personal success. He was a National AAU champion in 1940 while still in high school, an NCAA champion and "Outstanding Wrestler of the Meet" in 1946 for Northern Iowa, and continued on to become a silver medalist in the 1948 Olympics in London. His medal is housed in the Leeman-Turner Arena, which was dedicated in 2003 by alumni donors Elaine O. and John J. Harmon, class of '59.

In honor of his impact as an athlete and legendary collegiate coach, Leeman was rewarded with inductions into the National Wrestling Museum, United States Wrestling and Lehigh Athletics Halls of Fame.

Over 40 wrestlers and their families returned to Leeman-Turner Arena to celebrate "The Coach's" renowned career and share memories. Current student-athletes learned about Lehigh wrestling traditions from Leeman's wrestlers, including five NCAA national champions.

Attendees paged through archived articles and watched a presentation of photographs, memories and quotes from their teammates about the Leeman years. "It was a splendid 'low key' yet memorable event planned by our Athletic Partnership that Gerry will never forget," said Leon Harbold, Class of '59.
