SETTING THE SCENE

Two tough road tests await No. 15 Lehigh as the Mountain Hawks head to the Midwest for a pair of duals this weekend. Lehigh first heads to Central Michigan to face the 21st-ranked Chippewas before heading down to Oklahoma to face No. 10 Oklahoma. The Mountain Hawks have won their last three duals, including wins over Rutgers and Bucknell last weekend, to move to 8-4 on the dual season. With top-five grapplers Zach Rey and Robert Hamlin leading the charge, Lehigh will open up the weekend against the ten-time defending MAC champions from Central Michigan, before tangling with an Oklahoma squad that boasts eight nationally ranked wrestlers.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 849-393-21, which ranks fifth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks are making their first ever visit to Mount Pleasant, Mich. and their first visit to Norman, Okla. since December 2005.
- Eight Mountain Hawks are ranked in the top 33 at their respective weight classes according to the initial NCAA coaches' panel rankings, unveiled last week.

No. 11 Lehigh won seven of ten bouts and beat three ranked wrestlers as the Mountain Hawks headed into final exams with a 23-9 win over No. 14 Central Michigan inside Lee-man-Turner Arena at Grace Hall. Junior Brian Tanen and sophomore Robert Hamlin delivered bonus wins for Lehigh. The visiting Chippewas won two of the first three bouts but Frank Cagnina provided the first upset, with a 3-2 decision over Scotti Sentes at 133. The Mountain Hawks would go on to win six of the final seven bouts. Brandon Hatchett won an 8-6 decision over Mike Miller in a battle of ranked wrestlers at 165, while Zach Rey closed the dual with a tiebreaker win over Jarod Trice.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro is in his fourth season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In three seasons Santoro, the 2009 EIWA Coach of the Year, has led the Mountain Hawks to a 62-14-1 dual meet record. He has coached four individuals to EIWA titles, three Mountain Hawks to a total of four All-American medals, and last year mentored his first national champion, Zach Rey. He spent five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers' only four-time All-American.

Trailing 16-0 after the first four weight classes, No. 11 Lehigh mounted a furious rally, capturing decisions in the final six bouts to rally for an 18-16 win over No. 10 Oklahoma in the semifinals of the Virginia Duals. Four of Lehigh's six victories came over ranked Sooner wrestlers, and sixth-ranked sophomore Zach Rey's 3-2 win over No. 12 Nathan Fernandez completed the comeback for the third-seeded Mountain Hawks. Sean Bilodeau swung momentum in Lehigh's favor with a wild 8-7 win over Chad Terry at 157, while Mike Galante, Robert Hamlin and Joe Kennedy all knocked off ranked foes to help the Mountain Hawks climb back from the 16 point deficit.

THE VERMON-STER CONTINUES TO ROLL

Junior Robert Hamlin bounced back from his only loss of the season with a strong showing in a 6-2 win over Navy's Luke Rebertus in the opening bout of Lehigh's win over the Mids two weeks ago. The first NCAA wrestling All-American from the state of Vermont, Hamlin enjoyed a spectacular sophomore season that saw him win an EIWA Championship and advance to the NCAA finals at 184. Hamlin went 32-3 last season and has won 18 of his first 19 bouts this season. He won the UB Open in November and last month became the fourth Lehigh Undergraduate to win a Midlands title. Hamlin owns a 68-16 career record, and is expected to face two ranked wrestlers this weekend, including Ben Bennett in a rematch of the Midlands Finals.

REY REACHES MILESTONE

Earlier this month, Senior Zach Rey became the 12th Lehigh wrestler to win 100 career bouts. Rey pinned his way to the heavyweight title at the Shorty Hitchcock Memorial Classic, including a first-period fall against Virginia Tech's Dan Garwood for win No. 100. Rey captured Lehigh's 27th individual national championship last March, capping a spectacular 34-1 junior season. He now owns a 105-12 career record Rey will bid to become Lehigh's 15th three-time All-American and its first two-time national champion since Darryl Burley (1979, 1983). The last Lehigh grappler to win NCAA titles in consecutive seasons was Mark Lieberman who did so in 1978 and 1979.

MASON MOVES UP

True freshman Mason Beckman has impressed in his move up to 133. Beckman went 3-2 at the Midlands in his first event up at the new weight class, including two wins over Central Michigan Chippewas. He upset nationally ranked Aaron Kalil of Navy two weekends ago, which started an active streak of eight straight victories. Beckman picked up major decision wins against Rutgers and Bucknell to move to 19-6 on the season. He is one of four true freshmen who have competed in duals for Lehigh this season.

SAMUELS STEPS IN AND SUCCEEDS

An injury to senior captain Joe Kennedy has allowed fifth-year senior Kadeem Samuels to step into Lehigh's lineup at 197. Samuels has made the most of his opportunity winning three of his four dual bouts since stepping into the lineup. A Midlands place winner at 184 last season, Samuels is 6-1 in his last seven dual meet appearances. showing incredible improvement since going 0-11 in duals at 184 as a true freshman in 2007-08.

LEHIGH AT THE MIDLANDS

Junior Robert Hamlin won a 5-2 decision over Central Michigan's Ben Bennett to win the 184 lb. weight class at the 49th Ken Kraft Midlands Championships, Dec. 29-30 at Northwestern's Welsh-Ryan Arena. With the win Hamlin became the fourth Lehigh undergraduate to win a Midlands title, and the second in as many years. Hamlin was one of three Mountain Hawks to place in the top eight as senior Joe Kennedy finished fifth at 197 and junior Shane Welsh placed eighth at 149. As a team Lehigh finished in seventh place with 63.5 points. Both Central Michigan and Oklahoma were both at the Midlands. Lehigh went 4-1 in bouts against the Chippewas and 0-2 against the Sooners.

RANK AND FILE

Four Mountain Hawks are ranked in the latest polls conducted by Amateur Wrestling News and W.I.N. Magazine, while five Lehigh grapplers are ranked by InterMat. Last week the NCAA unveiled the first of three coaches' panel rankings, with eight Mountain Hawks recognized in the top 33 at their weight class.

Lehigh prides itself in bringing in student-athletes from across the nation. This season, 12 different states are represented among the 31 men on Lehigh's roster, including Colorado, Florida, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Texas and Vermont. Seven different states are represented among Lehigh's probable starters.

THE THREE CAPTAINS

Three upperclassmen will captain the Mountain Hawks for the 2011-12 season. All three will enter their second season as captains for the Brown and White. Fifth-year senior **Zach Rey (Hopatcong, N.J.)** along with true senior **Joe Kennedy (Milford, Pa.)** and fourth-year junior **Robert Hamlin (Jonesville, Vt.)** will captain the Mountain Hawks. Rey and Hamlin were NCAA finalists a year ago, while Kennedy fell one win short of earning All-America honors.

SCOUTING THE CHIPPEWAS

Central Michigan owns a 12-3 dual meet record. The ten-time defending Mid-American Conference champions, the Chippewas had won seven straight duals before losing to Michigan 23-14 on Sunday. Head coach Tom Borrelli is in his 21st season in Mount Pleasant. His probable starting lineup features three nationally ranked grapplers, led by Ben Bennett at 184. Heavyweight Peter Sturgeon, a transfer from UNC-Greensboro is also in the top 20 at his weight as is 125-pounder Joe Roth. The Chippewa probable starters also feature two true freshmen from the Lehigh Valley in Zach Horan (Nazareth) and Mike Ottinger (Parkland).

Winners of its last seven duals, Oklahoma owns a 9-2 overall dual record. The Sooners, whose only losses came to rival Oklahoma State and Wyoming, will host Virginia Tech on Friday night before welcoming the Mountain Hawks on Sunday. Mark Cody came to Oklahoma last spring after a successful stint at American University. His Sooner team won the Brockport/Oklahoma Gold tournament and finished third at the Midlands. Eight Oklahoma wrestlers are nationally ranked by Amateur Wrestling News, led by Midlands Champ Kendric Maple, ranked third at 141 and junior Jarrod Patterson, who is ranked seventh at 125.

LAWRENCE WHITE HEAD COACH - PAT SANTORO



He played an integral role in the renaissance of the Lehigh wrestling program in the late 1990s. In his first year back, he led the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23 dual wins, a second place EIWA finish, and was named EIWA Coach of the Year. Now entering his fourth season as head coach, Bethlehem native Pat Santoro looks to return the Mountain Hawks to the top of the EIWA, while molding Lehigh into a perennial top ten team and national championship contender. Santoro was hired in April, 2008 as just the eighth head coach in program history. He holds the title as the Lawrence White Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh.

Santoro's third season in Bethlehem proved to be his best to date on the national level. Lehigh returned to the top ten at the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2006 with an eighth place finish. The Mountain Hawks crowned three All-Americans for the first time in five years and placed two wrestlers in the NCAA finals for the first time since 2003. Heavyweight Zack Rey became Santoro's first national champion and the 27th in Lehigh history with his triumph in Philadelphia. Lehigh enjoyed another strong dual meet season, going 15-6 and finishing eighth in the national rankings. The Mountain Hawks took second at the EIWA Championships with Robert Hamlin winning an individual title, a precursor to his second place NCAA finish.

In 2009-10, Santoro guided the Mountain Hawks to a 16-3-1 dual record and a top-ten national dual meet ranking for most of the season. Lehigh had a

record six place-winners at the Midlands Championships and reached the finals at the Virginia Duals for the second straight season. In March, Santoro guided Rey to an EIWA title and All-America honors with a third place finish at the NCAA Championships, the program's first All-American in four years.

Santoro produced an immediate turnaround in his first season back in Bethlehem. The Mountain Hawks won their first 15 duals to start the season, including victories over the likes of Maryland, Michigan, Penn State and Lehigh's first-ever dual win over Oklahoma State. The team's 23-1 dual mark surpassed the school record for dual wins in a season. Santoro guided Seth Ciasulli and David Craig to individual EIWA Championships, while the Mountain Hawks finished second in the conference and qualified seven wrestlers for the NCAA Championships.

Before returning to Lehigh, Santoro spent the previous five years as the head coach at the University of Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. That year, the Terps went 16-4 and entered the national rankings for the first time since 1993, climbing as high as No. 21. Under Santoro's guidance, Maryland crowned its first All-American since 1997 en route to a top-25 team finish at the NCAA Championships. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark his last two seasons.

Prior to his stint at Maryland Santoro served as an assistant at Lehigh for nine years, including eight seasons as the top assistant on Greg Strobel's staff. During his initial tenure, Santoro was part of some of the most successful teams in school history. In 2003, Santoro was named the national Assistant Coach of the Year by the National Wrestling Coaches Association, after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships, at the time the program's best finish in 24 years.

Before coming to Lehigh, Santoro spent the 1993-94 season as an assistant

coach at Duquesne and the two seasons prior to that as a graduate assistant at Penn State.

Regarded throughout the community as one of the sport's top teachers and recruiters, Santoro has enjoyed success at every level of wrestling, both as a coach and a competitor. After wrestling for Bethlehem Catholic High School and taking a post-graduate year at Blair Academy, Santoro wrestled collegiately at the University of Pittsburgh, where he became the Panthers' only four-time All-America while capturing national titles in 1988 and 1989 at 142 pounds. A three-time Eastern Wrestling League Champion, he was the recipient of Pittsburgh's Golden Panther Award in 1989, recognizing the outstanding athlete of the year.

On the international scene, Santoro enjoyed a stellar career which spanned nearly a decade. He was a four time member of the U.S. National Team between 1995 and 1999 and served as an alternate for the 1996 Olympic Team and the 1999 World Team. Santoro placed fourth at the 2000 U.S. Olympic Trials, third at the 1992 Olympic Trials and was runner-up in the 1992 U.S. Open Freestyle Championships.

Santoro earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Pittsburgh in 1992. In addition to his Bethlehem roots and previous coaching stint at Lehigh, Santoro's father, uncle and brother all wrestled for the Brown and White.

Santoro and his wife Julie have a daughter, Leah and a son, Mack.

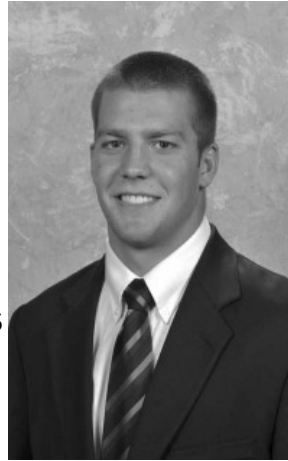

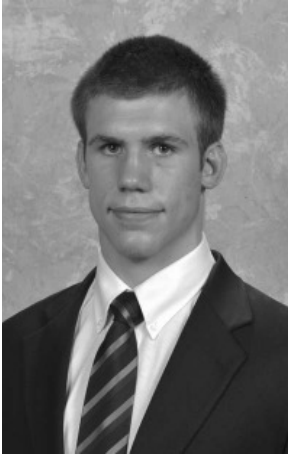
