#### SETTING THE SCENE

The Andy Coen era officially gets underway this afternoon as Lehigh opens its 2006 season versus the Great Danes of Albany on Kids Day at Goodman Stadium. Coen was named the 28th head football coach in January and today serves as his first ever game as a head coach. Lehigh is coming off of an 8-3 season in 2005, which marked the eighth consecutive year the Mountain Hawks had won at least eight games, something only one other school (Montana) has accomplished in that time span. Albany arrives in Bethlehem this afternoon with high expectations for the season, as the Great Danes were selected along with Central Connecticut State as the favorites in the Northeast Conference.

#### KEY STATS

- The Mountain Hawks have scored in double digits for 34 consecutive games, dating back to November 23, 2002 when they were held to seven points vs. Lafayette.
- Lehigh led the Patriot League in scoring offense (36.3 ppg), pass offense (243.5 yds), total offense (407.7 yds), pass efficiency (132.5), third down conversions (43.9%), fourth down conversions (83.3%), rushing defense (104.4 yds), and sacks (36) in 2005.
- Junior quarterback Sedale Threatt had the top mark in all of the Patriot League a season ago in terms of pass efficiency, finishing at 126.8. Threatt enters today's game with a career record of 4-1 as a starter.
- Albany ranked 11th in the country last season in both rushing defense (113.1 ypg) and scoring defense (17.6 ppg) and was 15th nationally in total defense (305.4 ypg).

#### THE SERIES

Lehigh and Albany have met only one previous time, which came during the 2004 season. Marques Thompson, then a sophomore, had a career day, scoring three touchdowns as the Brown and White rolled to a convincing 44-14 victory at Goodman Stadium. Thompson finished with 89 yards rushing, while Mark Borda threw for 248 of his own yards and three touchdowns.

#### IF LEHIGH WINS...:

- The Mountain Hawks would pick up their ninth straight opening day victory.
- Lehigh would earn victory number 610 in school history.
- The Mountain Hawks will have defeated a team from the Northeast Conference in their season opener for the third straight season.

#### IF ALBANY WINS...:

- The Great Danes would become the first team to defeat Lehigh in its season opener since Fordham handed the Mountain Hawks an overtime loss in 1997.
- Albany would earn its first-ever win over Lehigh.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH ANDY COEN**

Lehigh head coach Andy Coen (Gettysburg '86) is in his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawk football program. He previously coached at Lehigh from 1994-99 when he served as the offensive line coach for two seasons before adding offensive coordinator duties. Coen then headed to Philadelphia where he was the offensive coordinator for one of the nation's most explosive offensive units at Penn, as the Quakers ranked in the national top ten for scoring on three occasions.

**RAISE THE CURTAIN**

As Lehigh ushers in the Andy Coen era this afternoon, the former Mountain Hawk offensive coordinator will try and become the 16th coach in school history to begin his career with a victory. Here are the last five to have done it.

**PLENTY OF NEW FACES**

Andy Coen isn't the only new head coach in the Patriot League. Fordham and Georgetown both have first-year mentors as well, with Tom Masella taking over the reigns in the Bronx, and Kevin Kelly leading the Hoya program. In all there were 19 coaching changes around the country in the offseason.

## THE THREE CAPTAINS

Two seniors and one junior captain the 2006 Mountain Hawks. Offensive lineman **John Reese** and quarterback **Sedale Threatt** represent the offense. Strong safety **Julian Austin** represents the Lehigh defense. Threatt becomes the third junior captain for Lehigh in the last six seasons, joining Matt Salvaterra (2001) and Kaloma Cardwell (2004).

## LET'S GET IT STARTED

Lehigh has a 77-39-6 all-time record in its opening contests, including eight consecutive season-opening wins.

## SOMETIME AGO

Do you remember where you were on September 7, 1986? That date marks the **last time a Lehigh team was shutout**. Navy topped the Engineers by a score of 41-0 in Annapolis.

## ENTER AT YOUR OWN RISK

Goodman Stadium can be awfully tough on opposing teams, thanks to terrific fan support. The Mountain Hawks have **led the Patriot League in attendance** in each of the last 15 years, and annually rank among the leaders in Division I-AA attendance. Lehigh has a record of 70-25-1 playing at Goodman Stadium.

## NOT SO HEARTY WELCOME

Since the start of the 2000 season, Lehigh is 12-2 at home versus non-conference opponents, including a perfect 3-0 versus teams out of the Northeast Conference. In those three victories over NEC teams, the Mountain Hawks have won by an average count of 41-14. Lehigh has not lost two games at home to non-Patriot League schools in a single season since 1996.

## FROM COAST TO COAST

The Lehigh coaching staff prides itself in bringing in student-athletes from across the nation. This season, 20 states are represented on the Mountain Hawks roster, including California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, and West Virginia.

## ABOUT ALBANY

Albany opens the 2006 season as the favorite, along with Central Connecticut State, in the Northeast Conference. The Great Danes tied for third place last season in the Northeast finishing with an overall record of 4-3 in league play and 5-6 overall. Linebacker Colin Disch, who was named the *Football Gazette* mid-major linebacker of the year in 2005, has been honored as a preseason All-American, and he is joined by 16 other returning starters, including all 11 on defense. The Great Danes, who enter this afternoon's game ranked fourth in the preseason Mid-Major poll, won five of their last six games to close out the 2005 season, including a 41-0 rout of Patriot League member Fordham.

## ALBANY HEAD COACH BOB FORD

Bob Ford (Springfield '59) is in his 34th season as head coach of the Great Danes, sporting a record of 201-132 during that time. Ford has been UAlbany's only head coach since the program was reinstated after a 46-year absence. Ford saw the program rise from club status up through Divisions III and II before its present day status of Division I-AA. More than 100 of Ford's former assistants, who started their careers under his tutelage, are currently employed with 60 different high schools, colleges and professional teams from around the world.

## LEHIGH-ALBANY IN THE PAST

Behind a strong performance from both its offense and defense, Lehigh defeated Albany 44-14 in the lone meeting all-time between these schools. Sophomore Marques Thompson scored three touchdowns for the Brown and White, while Mark Borda threw for 248 yards. The game's final score came when senior defensive end Tom Alfsen scooped up a fumble and rumbled 74 yards for a touchdown.

## LAST TIME OUT

### BROWN & WHITE GAME

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (4/22/06) - Lehigh's defense topped the offense by a 30-24 score in the first Brown and White spring game under new head coach Andy Coen. In addition to battling each other, the units had to contend with Mother Nature, who brought drenching rains and gusty winds to Goodman Stadium. The scrimmage consisted of the first team offense vs. the first team defense, the second team units pitted against one another, and so on. There was a modified scoring system in place by which the defense earned points for stops, turnovers, and sacks, among other things. Trailing by a 14-6 score, quarterback Sedale Threatt found Frank Trovato on a pretty 35-yard wobble play, to make the score 14-8 (the offense received two points for a play of 20+ yards). Threatt then connected with Trovato's high school teammate, Pete Donchez in the back of the end zone for a touchdown, giving the offense the lead for the first time. On assessing the day overall, Coen was pleased with the team's progress. "We made strides on our toughness this spring, and that showed (today)," he said. "Come September, our goal is to be the toughest team out there each and every Saturday. We've still got some work to do."

### SHUTTING DOWN THE BIG GUNS

Lehigh has not allowed 40 points in a game since a playoff loss at Delaware in 2000. That day, the Blue Hens topped the Mountain Hawks 47-22. In the regular season, the last time a Lehigh team allowed 40+ points in a game: a 45-38 loss to Hofstra in 1997.

### STRONG OUT OF THE GATE

Lehigh has won its last eight home openers, by an average score of 41-11. The last time the Mountain Hawks fell in a home opener was 1997 when Fordham won 42-35 in overtime. Coincidentally, that was the only time the Rams have ever beaten Lehigh.

### SAY HELLO TO...

Lehigh has a number of new faces in its starting lineup this afternoon, nine in all at their respective positions. In that group is Frank Trovato (WR), Brian Jackson (DL), Eric Rakus (DL), Rusty Champion (LB), Chris LaMont (LB), Micah Greene (LB), and Aaron Gillard (DB). In addition, Pete Morelli (OL) and Matt Mohler (LB) are both starting for the first time at new positions.

### TIME TO STEP UP

With so many newcomers in the lineup, Andy Coen and his staff will be challenged to help replace a number of key losses on both sides of the ball. The Mountain Hawks lost 1,883 yards receiving, 1,638 yards passing, 930 yards rushing and 378 tackles from last season's team.

### FAMILIAR FACE

One Mountain Hawk starter has been granted a medical hardship waiver and a fifth year of eligibility in 2006. Fullback **Greg Fay (Jackson, Tenn.)** returns to the Lehigh lineup this season. Fay is a civil engineering and environmental science major.
