SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh faces one of its toughest tests of the season this afternoon as the Mountain Hawks travel to Ohio to take on the Flyers of Dayton. Lehigh is looking to snap a two game skid that includes a 75-70 setback on Thursday evening at Columbia. Marquis Hall and Gabe Knutson scored season highs for the Mountain Hawks, who led 33-31 at halftime, but Brian Grimes and Jeremy Foley netted 21 points apiece for the Lions as they pulled away for the win. Dayton has faced a tough schedule in the early going having taken on the likes of Creighton, Georgia Tech, Villanova and Kansas State to name a few, and the Flyers are off to a 4-2 start, including a 65-58 victory on Wednesday over Miami (Ohio) in Oxford. Chris Wright and Chris Johnson hit for double figures in the victory, while Marcus Johnson became the 41st player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will defeat a team from the Atlantic-10 for the first time since the inception of the league in 1976.
- The Mountain Hawks will improve their record to 5-3 during the last two Decembers.
- Lehigh will improve to 21-15 versus non-league foes under head coach Brett Reed.

TODAY'S GAME

Lehigh and Dayton meet for the first time this afternoon. The Mountain Hawks have played in this arena before however when they took on Florida A&M in the opening round of the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

LAST TIME OUT

NEW YORK, N.Y. - Two Mountain Hawks, including senior Marquis Hall (19) and freshman Gabe Knutson (17), scored season highs on Thursday but Brian Grimes and Patrick Foley netted 21 points apiece for Columbia as the Lions held off Lehigh 75-70 at Levien Gym. Lehigh led 33-31 at the half after trailing early but was unable to hold onto the lead and fell for the second consecutive game. Hall sank 7-of-14 shots on the night, including three three-pointers, while Knutson was five of six from the field and sank all seven of his free throws. Columbia led 11-4 after four minutes but the Mountain Hawks ripped off 13 straight points capped by a Holden Greiner lay-up off a feed from Hall, which put the Brown and White ahead 15-12. The teams were tied at 27 with 4:13 to go in the first half when Greiner sent Foley to the foul line, who sank both shots to give Columbia a 29-27 lead. Lehigh took a 33-29 lead with under two minutes remaining but then Grimes hit a jumper to send the game into halftime with the Mountain Hawks up 33-31. Columbia took a 45-40 lead eight minutes into the second half but Lehigh battled back and eventually tied things at 53 on a Justin Maneri bucket. The Lions scored eight of the game's next nine points however and went back in front 61-54 with 5:39 on the clock. A four-point play by Hall got the Mountain Hawks within three but that was as close as they would get.

CALL ON THE RESERVES

Lehigh's bench has been nearly unstoppable during the early going as the non-starters are averaging 34.1 points per game, with a high of 49 at Rider. The 49 bench points were the most Lehigh has scored under head coach Brett Reed. The Mountain Hawks' bench has outscored their counterparts in each game thus far, led by juniors Rob Keefer and Michael Ojo who are averaging 14.0 points between them.

DISHING IT OUT

The Mountain Hawks handed out a season-best 24 assists in the win over Monmouth. The 24 helpers were Lehigh's most under head coach Brett Reed and the Mountain Hawks most since totaling 27 in a win over Delaware Valley on December 17, 2003. Lehigh enters today's game averaging 16.9 assists per game led by Marquis Hall's 6.4 per game. Hall, who has totaled 118 or more assists in each of his three years at Lehigh, needs 29 helpers to break the school record of 452 set by Scott Layer from 1986-90.

MORE POINTS MEANS MORE WINS

In its three wins this season Lehigh is averaging 80.3 points and shooting 47% from the floor and 41% from downtown. Three Mountain Hawks are averaging double figures in those wins. In the team's four losses Lehigh has scored an average of just 61.5 points on 37% shooting from the field and 37% from three. Only one player is averaging 10+ points in those games.

OUT-BATTLED ON THE BOARDS

Lehigh led the Patriot League in rebounding a season ago, pulling down 39.6 boards per game and the Mountain Hawks' +3.0 rebound margin ranked second in the league. This year Lehigh is averaging 36.0 rebounds per game and sporting a -1.9 rebound margin. The Brown and White has already been out-rebounded in five of its seven games after being out-rebounded just nine times all of last season.

BUCHBERGER RETURNS HOME

Senior Dave Buchberger will be playing in his home state this afternoon as the Mountain Hawks take on the University of Dayton. The Lehigh coaching staff attempts to have each member of the team play near his hometown at least once during their four-year career. Buchberger, one of four captains this season, was a First-Team All-District selection at Sycamore High School in Cincinnati. He has started 37 games during his Lehigh career.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Through seven games Lehigh has sunk 50 three-pointers, good for an average of 7.1 per game. The 50 made threes are five more than last season at this time and eight more than the 2007-08 campaign. Leading the way this year has been C.J. McCollum and Marquis Hall with 13 made three-pointers apiece.

SCOUTING THE FLYERS...

Head coach Brian Gregory is in his seventh season at the helm of the Dayton program ... nine of the Flyers' first 15 games are at home, including a January 5 meeting with Ball State, which is coached by former Lehigh head coach Billy Taylor ... Dayton is the pre-season favorite to win the Atlantic-10 conference, while Chris Wright and Chris Johnson were preseason All-League selections ... Lehigh and Dayton will take on two common opponents this season, including Saint Joseph's and Richmond.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN

Lehigh has received a large number of contributions from freshmen C.J. McCollum and Gabe Knutson. McCollum has led the Mountain Hawks in scoring in three games, including a season best 22 points versus Quinnipiac while Knutson has led the team in rebounds in three games and leads the team overall with 43 boards. Knutson scored a season-best 17 points last time out at Columbia.

CARRINGTON NEARING MILESTONE

Senior Zahir Carrington is closing in on the 1,000-point plateau for his career. The Philadelphia native enters today's game with 961 career points, 39 shy of 1,000. Carrington will become the 28th member of Lehigh's 1,000-point club with current Mountain Hawk Marquis Hall the latest entry into the club.

SMALL CONTROLS THE BALL

Prentice Small ranked second in the Patriot League last season with a 1.98 assist-to-turnover ratio (89 assists, 45 turnovers). This season Small has picked up right where he left off, totaling 14 assists and only three turnovers through seven games, good for a 4.7 assist-to-turnover ratio.

REED IN THE NON-LEAGUE

In his two-plus years on the Lehigh sideline head coach Brett Reed has led the Mountain Hawks to a 20-15 mark in non-league games, including a school record ten wins a season ago. Lehigh has won six of its last 11 non-league road games.

UP NEXT...

Lehigh has nearly two weeks off for final exams before returning to action on Thursday, December 17 versus the Big Green of Dartmouth. Tip-off from Stabler Arena is set for 7:05.

HITTING THE BOOKS

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. The list included Dave Buchberger (3.58), Marquis Hall (3.23), Rob Keefer (3.21) and Matt Szalachowski '09 (3.50). Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.

COAST TO COAST

This year's Mountain Hawk roster is comprised of student-athletes that hail from ten different states. There is one player each from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, and Oregon, two players from Washington and Ohio, and three players from California and Pennsylvania.

HALL UP FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Marquis Hall is a candidate for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Hall is one of 60 basketball players from around the country who was chosen (30 male and 30 female). Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.
