SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh plays its final game before taking a holiday break as the Mountain Hawks welcome the Marist Red Foxes to Stabler Arena this evening. Lehigh was last in action on Sunday evening when the Brown and White fell 77-66 at Saint Joseph's in Philadelphia. Four Mountain Hawks hit for double figures, led by senior Dave Buchberger and freshman Gabe Knutson with 13 points each, but Lehigh committed 20 turnovers and was unable to maintain an early 10-0 lead versus the Hawks. Marist enters tonight's game seeking its first win of the season after the Red Foxes fell 70-52 vs. Binghamton in Poughkeepsie, New York. Daje Kaba led Marist with 11 points in the game, but Binghamton shot 57% from the floor compared to the Red Foxes' 29% showing.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will improve to 3-0 all-time versus Marist.
- The Mountain Hawks will improve to 15-4 under Brett Reed at home versus non-league foes.
- Lehigh will win for the fourth straight year in its final game before the annual holiday break.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Lehigh meets Marist for only the third time ever tonight and the first time since the 1990-91 season. The Brown and White came away with a 73-70 victory that year. The only other meeting took place during the 1981-82 season.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

POUGHKEEPSIE, N.Y. (12/7/90) - The then-Engineers used a 65% second half shooting performance to break a 36-36 halftime deadlock and win the consolation game of the Pepsi-Marist Classic. Dozie Mbonu has 21 points and 11 rebounds, while Bob Krizansky added 19 points as Lehigh snapped a three-game losing streak. Both teams struggled at the foul line as Lehigh hit only 14-of-25 attempts and Marist was 14-of-22.

LAST TIME OUT

PHILADELPHIA - Lehigh raced out to a 10-0 lead on Saint Joseph's Sunday evening at Michael J. Hagan Arena, but the Mountain Hawks were unable to hold it, and eventually fell to the Hawks 77-66. Four Mountain Hawks scored in double figures, led by senior Dave Buchberger and freshman Gabe Knutson with 13 apiece but Lehigh committed 20 turnovers and was unable to maintain its early hot shooting. Darrin Govins led five Hawks in double digits for the home team with 15 tallies. Lehigh led 52-45 with 10:37 to go before Saint Joseph's unleashed a 13-0 run. The Hawks lead eventually swelled to as many as 15 points and they never looked back from there, as they snapped a six-game losing skid. Joining Govins in double figures for the home team were Carl Baptiste, Carl Jones and Chris Prescott with 13 points apiece and Bryant Irwin who added 11 tallies.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior captain Marquis Hall continues to move up the Lehigh and Patriot League leaderboards. The Oregon native enters tonight's contest with 1,249 career points, which ranks 13th in school history and 42nd in Patriot League annals. Hall is also close to breaking the school record of 452 assists, held by Scott Layer. Hall has totaled 437 helpers during his time in the Brown and White, which is ninth in league history and 16 shy of the Lehigh mark.

OUT-BATTLED ON THE BOARDS

Lehigh led the Patriot League in rebounding a season ago, pulling down 39.6 boards per game and the Mountain Hawks' +3.0 rebound margin ranked second in the league. This year Lehigh is averaging 35.5 rebounds per game and sporting a -2.8 rebound margin. The Brown and White has already been out-rebounded in seven of its ten games after being out-rebounded just nine times all of last season.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Last season, Lehigh averaged 5.5 made three-pointers per game, while shooting only 32% from beyond the arc. This year the Mountain Hawks are looking to reverse that trend as they are hitting on 37% of their shots from downtown and averaging 6.5 made three's per contest.

GROWING UP FAST

Freshman Gabe Knutson has started every game for Lehigh during the early going of his career. The Iowa native has led Lehigh in rebounds in five games, including a season best 10 vs. Dartmouth, and he currently leads the team with a 6.6 per game average. In his last four games Knutson's offense has come to life as he has averaged 11.3 points on 16-of-32 shooting (50%), to go with a 13-of-14 showing at the foul line.

INSTANT OFFENSE

Junior Michael Ojo has given Lehigh an instant lift off the bench this season as he leads all Mountain Hawk bench players with a 7.9 points per game average. The California native has hit for double figures five times, including a career-best tying 14 points in the win over Dartmouth. In his last two games Ojo is averaging a team best 13.0 points, including a 6-of-10 showing from three-point range, as well as 5.0 rebounds.

STRONG AT THE STRIPE

Lehigh has done a nice job at the free throw line during the early going as the Mountain Hawks have sunk 75% of their chances (161-214). Eight players are shooting better than 70% at the stripe, led by Justin Maneri who is shooting 90.9%. Last year Lehigh shot only 68% at the foul line with just two players shooting over 70%.

SCOUTING THE RED FOXES...

Head coach Chuck Martin is in his second season at the helm of the Marist program ... including tonight's game, the Red Foxes have played seven of their first nine contests away from home ... Marist has been outscored by 100 points during the first half of games this season (290-190) ... Marist's last victory came in the opening round of last season's MAAC Tournament when the Red Foxes downed Iona 43-40 on March 7 ... Lehigh and Marist will take on three common opponents this season, including Holy Cross, Rider, and Bucknell.

ASSISTED WINS

In their four wins this season the Mountain Hawks have totaled more assists than turnovers in each game, averaging 19 assists to just 10 TOs. In its six losses however, Lehigh has registered more assists than turnovers just once (Rider). The Mountain Hawks are averaging 18 turnovers and 14 assists in their six setbacks.

PLENTY OF MINUTES TO GO AROUND

12 Mountain Hawks are averaging double digit minutes this season led by Marquis Hall (28.0) and C.J. McCollum (26.9). At this time last season nine players were averaging 10 or more minutes per game.

REJECTED!

Lehigh blocked a season best seven shots in the win over Dartmouth, led by Zahir Carrington's career high six rejections. The seven blocks were the Mountain Hawks most since swatting ten on November 28, 2007 vs. Quinnipiac.

MEN OF STEAL

In their game at Saint Joseph's the Mountain Hawks recorded a season-high 11 steals, including a career-best five thefts by senior captain Marquis Hall. The 11 steals were Lehigh's most since totaling 13 in the opener at Saint Peter's last season (Nov, 2008).

SHINING STAR AT STABLER

Lehigh head coach Brett Reed is 22-11 at Stabler Arena during his two-plus years at the helm. Reed's win percentage of 66% at the STAR ranks third all-time in school annals behind Billy Taylor (76%) and Fran McCaffery (73%).

UP NEXT...

Lehigh has the next five days off for the holiday break before returning to action at Longwood on Monday, December 28. The Mountain Hawks and Lancers will tip theirs off at 7:00 on Monday in Virginia.

Head coach Brett Reed has announced the Lehigh basketball class of 2014. The three newest Mountain Hawks will arrive on campus in the fall of 2010. They include:

Anthony D'Orazio: 6-2 guard from Camden Catholic High School (N.J.) ... as a junior, averaged 14.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists, while shooting 47% from the floor ... First-Team Olympic Conference and was named the MVP of the Olympic Cape Challenge and the Prime Time Shootout.

Mackey McKnight: 6-0 point guard from Langham Creek High School (Texas) ... as a junior, averaged 14.6 points, 6.8 assists and 4.3 rebounds per game while shooting 40% from three-point range ... District MVP Runner Up and First-Team All-District honors ... also named to the All-Regional Team.

Kevin McCarthy: 6-9 center who graduated from De La Salle Collegiate High School (Mich.) and is currently attending Philips Exeter Academy (N.H.) ... averaged 10.2 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game last season ... First-Team All-District and All-League and Second-Team All-State.

HITTING THE BOOKS

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. The list included Dave Buchberger (3.58), Marquis Hall (3.23), Rob Keefer (3.21) and Matt Szalachowski '09 (3.50). Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.

COAST TO COAST

This year's Mountain Hawk roster is comprised of student-athletes that hail from ten different states. There is one player each from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, and Oregon, two players from Washington and Ohio, and three players from California and Pennsylvania.

HALL UP FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Marquis Hall is a candidate for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Hall is one of 60 basketball players from around the country who was chosen (30 male and 30 female). Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.
