SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh heads to Loretto, Pennsylvania this evening seeking its first road win of the season as the Mountain Hawks take on the Red Flash of St. Francis (Pa.). Lehigh has won its last two games at home, including an 86-74 victory over Monmouth on Monday evening as four Mountain Hawks hit for double figures and the Brown and White shot a season-best 53% from the floor. Freshman C.J. McCollum once again led Lehigh in scoring while juniors Michael Ojo and Rob Keefer came off the bench to contribute 13 points apiece. St. Francis was last in action on November 21 when the Red Flash fell to Bucknell 70-58 in Lewisburg. St. Francis defeated American in its opener but has since dropped three straight. Devin Sweeteny has led the Red Flash in scoring in three of the team's four contests, including a season-best 30 versus Lafayette.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will improve to 4-3 all-time versus the Red Flash of St. Francis (Pa.).
- The Mountain Hawks will improve to 8-3 during the last two Novembers.
- Brett Reed will up his record to 7-2 versus schools from the Northeast Conference.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Lehigh and St. Francis (Pa.) meet for the seventh time this evening with the series knotted at three wins apiece. St. Francis won the first three meetings in 1969, 1976 and 1977 but the Brown and White has won each of the last three meetings, including in 1986, 2007 and last season at Stabler Arena.

THE LAST MEETING

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (11/24/08) - It won't go down as the best looking game of the season for Lehigh, but the Mountain Hawks did emerge with a 61-56 victory over St. Francis (Pa.) at Stabler Arena to move to 3-1 for the first time since the 1997-98 season. Dave Buchberger netted a game-high 15 points for the Mountain Hawks, while Zahir Carrington added 12 and a game-high eight boards. After leading by as many as 17 in the second half, St. Francis cut it to a four-point game before Lehigh held on for the win at home.

LAST TIME OUT

BETHLEHEM, Pa. - Lehigh placed four players in double figures, led by freshman C.J. McCollum as the Mountain Hawks evened their record with an 86-74 victory over Monmouth at Stabler Arena. Joining McCollum in double digits were Rob Keefer and Michael Ojo with 13 points apiece and Marquis Hall who added 11. The Mountain Hawks shot 53% from the field for the game and dished out 24 assists led by senior Zahir Carrington and Ojo with five each. Monmouth pulled to within single digits until Lehigh's Prentice Small got into the lane for a basket, which made the score 64-53. The lead then swelled to 16 points following a three-point play by McCollum and Lehigh was not threatened again.

CARRINGTON NEARING MILESTONE

Senior Zahir Carrington is closing in on the 1,000-point plateau for his career. The Philadelphia native enters tonight's game with 952 career points, 48 shy 1,000. Carrington will become the 28th member of Lehigh's 1,000-point club with current Mountain Hawk Marquis Hall the latest entry into the club. Hall surpassed the magic number last season in a win over archrival Lafayette and now has 1,197 career points.

CLAMPING DOWN

The Mountain Hawks defense returned to form last season as they led the Patriot League and ranked 13th nationally in field goal percentage defense at 39%. Lehigh held 14 opponents below the 40% mark from the field a season ago and limited Richmond to 38.6% in the opener.

SIGHTS SET ON THE TOP SPOT

Senior captain Marquis Hall has dished out 408 assists during his three-plus seasons in the Brown and White, good for an average of 4.4 per game. Hall, who has totaled 118 or more assists in each of his three years at Lehigh, needs 45 helpers to break the school record of 452 set by Scott Layer from 1986-90. He equaled his career-high with ten assists at Rider and again vs. Quinnipiac.

BENCH PATROL

Lehigh's bench has been nearly unstoppable during the early going as the non-starters are averaging 38.3 points per game, with a high of 49 at Rider. The 49 bench points were the most Lehigh has scored under head coach Brett Reed. Leading the way off the bench have been juniors Michael Ojo and Rob Keefer who netted 13 points apiece in the win over Monmouth in only 38 combined minutes. The Mountain Hawks' bench has outscored their counterparts in each game thus far.

DISHING IT OUT

The Mountain Hawks handed out a season-best 24 assists on Monday in the win over Monmouth. The 24 helpers were Lehigh's most under head coach Brett Reed and the Mountain Hawks most since totaling 27 in a win over Delaware Valley on December 17, 2003. Lehigh enters tonight's game averaging 18.8 assists per game led by Marquis Hall's 7.25 per game.

REED VERSUS THE NORTHEAST CONFERENCE

Lehigh has won six of eight games versus schools from the Northeast Conference under head coach Brett Reed. During his two-plus years at the helm Reed has defeated Monmouth three times, St. Francis (Pa.) twice, and Quinnipiac one time while falling to Quinnipiac and Central Connecticut State.

SCOUTING THE RED FLASH...

Head coach Don Friday is in his second season at the helm of the St. Francis program ... Devin Sweetney is shooting better than 50% from the field, 60% from three-point range and 70% from the free throw line ... Lehigh and St. Francis will take on five common opponents this season, including American, Lafayette, Bucknell, Monmouth, and Quinnipiac

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Head Coach Brett Reed has announced seniors Dave Buchberger, Zahir Carrington, Marquis Hall and Matt Shamis are captains for the 2009-10 season.

RETURNING LEADERS

Several returning Mountain Hawks ranked among the Patriot League statistical leaders a season ago. Included on that list is Zahir Carrington who ranked first in rebounding, fourth in scoring, and ninth in blocked shots, Marquis Hall who finished third in assists, and fifth in scoring, made three-pointers, assist/turnover ratio and steals, Prentice Small who checked in at number two in assist/turnover ratio and eight in assists, and Dave Buchberger who finished second in free throw shooting.

SHINING DEBUT

Freshman C.J. McCollum came to Lehigh with a reputation for scoring the basketball and the Ohio native has lived up to that billing in the early going, as he leads the Brown and White in scoring at 15.5 per game. McCollum is shooting 50% from the field and has sank 11 three-pointers through four games. He was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Week on Monday after scoring a season-best 22 points in the win over Quinnipiac on November 18. McCollum's 12 points in the season opener were the most by an LU frosh in his collegiate debut since current junior Prentice Small hit for 13 in the 2007-08 opener at Cornell.

UP NEXT...

Lehigh is off until Monday when the Mountain Hawks return to Stabler Arena to host the Stony Brook Seawolves. Tip-off from the STAR on November 30 is set for 7:05.

HITTING THE BOOKS

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. The list included Dave Buchberger (3.58), Marquis Hall (3.23), Rob Keefer (3.21) and Matt Szalachowski '09 (3.50). Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.

COAST TO COAST

This year's Mountain Hawk roster is comprised of student-athletes that hail from ten different states. There is one player each from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, and Oregon, two players from Washington and Ohio, and three players from California and Pennsylvania.

HALL UP FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Marquis Hall is a candidate for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Hall is one of 60 basketball players from around the country who was chosen (30 male and 30 female). Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.
