SETTING THE SCENE

Following a 12-day layoff for final exams Lehigh returns to action this evening as the Mountain Hawks play host to the Dartmouth Big Green at Stabler Arena. Lehigh was last in action on December 5 when the Brown and White traveled to Ohio to face the Dayton Flyers. The Mountain Hawks placed three players in double figures, led by freshman C.J. McCollum with 16 points, but it was not enough as the Atlantic-10 preseason favorites came away with an 89-71 victory at UD Arena. Dartmouth meanwhile has not played since downing Lyndon State 83-54 on Sunday in New Hampshire. The Big Green placed four players in double figures, led by Jabari Trotter who hit for 16 points in the win.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will defeat Dartmouth for the fifth consecutive time.
- The Mountain Hawks will avoid losing two straight non-league games at Stabler Arena for the first time since the 2001-02 season.
- Lehigh will improve its record to 5-4 versus teams from the Ivy League under head coach Brett Reed.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Lehigh meets Dartmouth for the ninth time this evening with the Mountain Hawks leading the series 6-2. Lehigh has won four straight, including last year as the Brown and White earned a 73-60 victory in New Hampshire.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

HANOVER, N.H. - Lehigh won its third straight road contest with a 73-60 victory over the Dartmouth Big Green at Leede Arena. Zahir Carrington scored a game-high 15 points to go along with a career-best 14 rebounds as he registered his second career double-double. Carrington was one of ten Mountain Hawks who scored. Dan Biber led the home team with 15 points, while Kurt Graeber led the Big Green with ten rebounds. Lehigh led 33-20 at halftime and extended to a 16-point advantage early in the second half. Dartmouth got to within nine at the 9:31 mark, but four straight by LU made it a 13-point game.

LAST TIME OUT

DAYTON, Ohio - Lehigh had its hands full with the Atlantic-10 preseason favorite Dayton Flyers as the Mountain Hawks fell 89-71 at UD Arena. Four Mountain Hawks hit for double figures on the day, led by freshman C.J. McCollum with 16 points, while senior Dave Buchberger and junior Rob Keefer added 11 apiece. Dayton was led in scoring by Chris Wright who hit for 16 points and he also totaled a game-high ten rebounds. The teams were tight in the early going but Dayton was simply too much for Lehigh as the Flyers took a 41-26 lead into the locker room. The lead swelled to as many as 27 in the second half before the Mountain Hawks made a late run to provide the final margin.

OUT-BATTLED ON THE BOARDS

Lehigh led the Patriot League in rebounding a season ago, pulling down 39.6 boards per game and the Mountain Hawks' +3.0 rebound margin ranked second in the league. This year Lehigh is averaging 34.5 rebounds per game and sporting a -3.5 rebound margin. The Brown and White has already been out-rebounded in six of its eight games after being out-rebounded just nine times all of last season.

FINALLY, BACK IN ACTION

Lehigh returns to action tonight following its annual break for final exams. The Mountain Hawks have won two straight games following their break, having defeated Monmouth each of the last two seasons, including last year in New Jersey.

THREE UP, THREE DOWN

During its three game win streak Lehigh averaged 80.7 points on 47% shooting while holding opponents to 70.7 points on 41% from the floor. In their last three games however, all losses, the Mountain Hawks are averaging 64.3 points on 38% shooting and the opposition is scoring an average of 78.3 points while shooting 48% from the field.

GROWING UP FAST

Freshman Gabe Knutson has started every game for Lehigh during the early going of his career. The Iowa native has led Lehigh in rebounds in four games, and he currently leads the team with a 6.1 per game average. In his last two games Knutson's offense has come to life as he has averaged 13.5 points on 9-of-13 shooting (69%), and is a perfect 9-of-9 at the foul line.

RETURN TO STABLER

Lehigh returns home to Stabler Arena tonight where the Mountain Hawks will play five of their next eight games. Under Brett Reed Lehigh is 21-11 at the STAR, including a 13-4 mark versus non-league teams. The Mountain Hawks have held their opponents to an average of 61.3 points on 39% shooting during that time.

INSTANT OFFENSE

Since moving out of the starting lineup six games ago junior Rob Keefer has provided the Mountain Hawks offense with a boost off the bench. Keefer is averaging 8.3 points in those contests, while shooting 57% from three-point range and 78% from the foul line. Keefer has hit for double figures three times, including an 11-point performance in only 15 minutes of action at Dayton.

SCOUTING THE BIG GREEN...

Head coach Terry Dunn is in his sixth season at the helm of the Dartmouth program ... Dartmouth's win over Lyndon State was the 1,200th in program history ... Dartmouth was selected to finish eighth in the Ivy League preseason poll ... the Big Green has scored more than 60 points just twice this season and both times they won (Hartford, Lyndon State) ... Dartmouth is shooting just 29% from three-point range this season ... Lehigh and Dartmouth will take on five common opponents this season, including Army, Colgate, Quinnipiac, Bucknell and Columbia.

CARRINGTON NEARING MILESTONE

Senior Zahir Carrington is closing in on the 1,000-point plateau for his career. The Philadelphia native enters tonight's game with 961 career points, 39 shy of 1,000. Carrington will become the 28th member of Lehigh's 1,000-point club with current Mountain Hawk Marquis Hall the latest entry into the club.

ASSISTED WINS

In their three wins this season the Mountain Hawks have totaled more assists than turnovers in each game, averaging 21 assists to just 10 TOs. In its five losses however, Lehigh has registered more assists than turnovers just once (Rider). The Mountain Hawks are averaging 17 turnovers and 14 assists in their five setbacks.

LOOKING TO SNAP THE STREAK

Under Brett Reed Lehigh has lost four straight games just once, which came at the conclusion of last season when the Mountain Hawks dropped their final three regular season games along with their Patriot League Tournament quarterfinal contest.

DISHING IT OUT

The Mountain Hawks handed out a season-best 24 assists in the win over Monmouth. The 24 helpers were Lehigh's most under head coach Brett Reed and the Mountain Hawks most since totaling 27 in a win over Delaware Valley on December 17, 2003.

UP NEXT...

Lehigh completes its Atlantic-10 tour when the Mountain Hawks travel to Philadelphia to take on the Hawks of Saint Joseph's. Tip-off on Sunday, December 20 is set for 7:00 from the newly renovated Michael J. Hagan '85 Arena. Lehigh has already taken on Richmond and Dayton this season out of the Atlantic-10.

Head coach Brett Reed has announced the Lehigh basketball class of 2014. The three newest Mountain Hawks will arrive on campus in the fall of 2010. They include:

Anthony D'Orazio: 6-2 guard from Camden Catholic High School (N.J.) ... as a junior, averaged 14.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists, while shooting 47% from the floor ... First-Team Olympic Conference and was named the MVP of the Olympic Cape Challenge and the Prime Time Shootout.

Mackey McKnight: 6-0 point guard from Langham Creek High School (Texas) ... as a junior, averaged 14.6 points, 6.8 assists and 4.3 rebounds per game while shooting 40% from three-point range ... District MVP Runner Up and First-Team All-District honors ... also named to the All-Regional Team.

Kevin McCarthy: 6-9 center who graduated from De La Salle Collegiate High School (Mich.) and is currently attending Philips Exeter Academy (N.H.) ... averaged 10.2 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game last season ... First-Team All-District and All-League and Second-Team All-State.

HITTING THE BOOKS

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. The list included Dave Buchberger (3.58), Marquis Hall (3.23), Rob Keefer (3.21) and Matt Szalachowski '09 (3.50). Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.

COAST TO COAST

This year's Mountain Hawk roster is comprised of student-athletes that hail from ten different states. There is one player each from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, and Oregon, two players from Washington and Ohio, and three players from California and Pennsylvania.

HALL UP FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Marquis Hall is a candidate for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Hall is one of 60 basketball players from around the country who was chosen (30 male and 30 female). Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.
