SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh looks for its third straight win tonight as the Mountain Hawks conclude a two-game road swing with a trip to Delaware to take on the Delaware State Hornets at Memorial Hall. Lehigh scored a season best 89 points en route to defeating Longwood 89-78 on Monday evening in Virginia. Rob Keefer established a new career-high with 21 points, while freshman C.J. McCollum also hit for 21 points and senior Zahir Carrington scored his 1,000th career point as Lehigh won back-to-back games for the first time in a month. Delaware State enters tonight's game on a five game losing streak including setbacks to Arkansas, Arizona State, Ohio State and UCLA in its last four. The Hornets fell to the Bruins 66-49 on December 27 in Los Angeles in their most recent contest.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will improve to 3-1 all-time versus Delaware State.
- The Mountain Hawks will win back-to-back road games for the first time since downing Monmouth and NJIT away from home in December of 2008.
- Lehigh will improve its record to 24-17 under head coach Brett Reed versus non-league foes.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Lehigh meets Delaware for only the fourth time this evening with the Mountain Hawks leading the series 2-1. Lehigh has won two straight meetings, including a 76-58 decision last season while the Hornets won the first matchup, 95-86 during the 1998-99 season.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (11/17/08) - Lehigh placed four players in double figures, led by junior captain Marquis Hall who netted a game-high 16 points as the Mountain Hawks moved to 2-0 for the first time since 1997 with a 76-58 victory over Delaware State at Stabler Arena. Phil Anderson scored 13 points and pulled down a career-high eight rebounds, while junior Zahir Carrington and sophomore Rob Keefer netted ten points apiece. Lehigh shot 52% from the field, marking the second straight game it shot at least 50% from the floor. The Mountain Hawks sank ten three-pointers, led by Anderson and Hall's three apiece, while sophomore Michael Ojo sank a pair from beyond the arc. Delaware State was led on offense by Donald Johnson, who scored 16 points.

LAST TIME OUT

FARMVILLE, Va. - Junior Rob Keefer and freshman C.J. McCollum scored 21 points apiece and senior Zahir Carrington threw down a second half dunk to hit 1,000 points for his career as Lehigh downed Longwood 89-78 on Monday evening. For Keefer the 21 points establish a new career-high, while McCollum's 21 are one off his season high. Carrington finished with 10 points and 12 rebounds while classmate Marquis Hall equaled his career high with ten assists. Dana Smith led the Lancers in scoring with a game-high 23 points.

HALL EYES THE TOP SPOT

Senior captain Marquis Hall is close to breaking the school record of 452 assists, held by Scott Layer (1986-90). Hall has totaled 447 helpers during his time in the Brown and White, which is ninth in league history and six shy of the Lehigh mark. In addition, Hall's 5.8 per-game average this season is 24th best in the nation.

CARRINGTON JOINS 1,000 POINT CLUB

Senior Zahir Carrington threw down a second half dunk on Monday to give the Philadelphia native exactly 1,000 career points. Carrington is the 28th member of Lehigh's 1,000-point club and the first since classmate Marquis Hall accomplished the feat last year. Carrington, who missed three games earlier this season due to injury, has averaged 9.8 points and 9.5 rebounds in the four games since his return.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Last season, Lehigh averaged 5.5 made three-pointers per game, while shooting only 32% from beyond the arc. This year the Mountain Hawks are looking to reverse that trend as they are hitting on 37% of their shots from downtown and averaging 6.7 made three's per contest. Lehigh canned a season best 10 three-pointers in its win on Monday.

POINTS IN A FLASH

Juniors Rob Keefer and Michael Ojo continue to provide Lehigh with an offensive spark off the bench. Between them the duo averages 15.1 points per game and they have hit for double figures a combined ten times. Ojo has matched his career-high of 14 points on two occasions this season, while Keefer sank eight-of-ten shots en route to a career best 21 points in only 16 minutes of action on Monday evening.

BACK ON TRACK

After losing three straight earlier this season Lehigh sat at 3-5 overall, but since then the Mountain Hawks have run off three wins in the last four to even their record at 6-6. During those four games Lehigh is averaging 71.8 points on 42% shooting while out-rebounding its opponents by nearly three per game. Lehigh has outscored its opponents 141-118 in the first half and held them to 40.2% shooting overall.

CALL IT A COMEBACK

After trailing 37-36 to Longwood at halftime Lehigh reeled off 53 second half points to earn the road win on Monday. The 53 points were the most the Mountain Hawks have scored in a half this season as they shot a blistering 62.5% (20-32) from the floor, led by Rob Keefer and C.J. McCollum who combined to go 9-of-11 for 27 points in the final 20 minutes. Monday's win marked the first time in the last six games Lehigh outscored an opponent in the second half and it was the first time since February 11, 2009 that the Brown and White won a game after trailing at halftime (at Navy).

SCOUTING THE HORNETS...

Head coach Greg Jackson is in his tenth season as the leader of the Delaware State program ... the Hornets have been held below 50 points in their last three games and below 60 in their last five ... DSU is 0-5 on the road thus far, but 4-1 here at home ... opponents are shooting 51% from the floor this season versus the Hornets ... Marcus Neal leads Delaware State in scoring, field goal attempts, made field goals, three-point attempts, and made three-pointers ... Lehigh and Delaware State will not face any common opponents this season.

POINTS A'PLENTY

Lehigh scored a season-high 89 points in the win over Longwood, marking the second time this season the Mountain Hawks have scored 80+ points. The 89 points were Lehigh's most since totaling 96 in a win over Swarthmore on November 29, 2006.

PLENTY OF MINUTES TO GO AROUND

12 Mountain Hawks are averaging double digit minutes this season led by Marquis Hall (28.8) and C.J. McCollum (27.0). At this time last season nine players were averaging 10 or more minutes per game.

GETTING ON THE GLASS

After being out-rebounded in seven of its first nine games Lehigh has grabbed more rebounds than its opponent in three straight contests. During that time the Mountain Hawks have averaged 42.7 boards, which are 6.3 more than the opposition. Zahir Carrington has led the way with an 11.0 per game average.

REJECTED!

Lehigh blocked a season best seven shots in the win over Dartmouth, led by Zahir Carrington's career high six. The seven blocks were Lehigh's most since swatting ten on November 28, 2007 vs. Quinnipiac.

MEN OF STEAL

In their game at Saint Joseph's the Mountain Hawks recorded a season-high 11 steals, including a career-best five thefts by senior captain Marquis Hall. The 11 steals were Lehigh's most since totaling 13 in the opener at Saint Peter's last season (Nov, 2008).

UP NEXT...

Lehigh returns home and rings in the New Year when the Mountain Hawks play host to the NJIT Highlanders at Stabler Arena on January 2. Tip-off on Saturday evening is set for 7:35 from the STAR.

Anthony D'Orazio: 6-2 guard from Camden Catholic High School (N.J.) ... as a junior, averaged 14.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists, while shooting 47% from the floor ... First-Team Olympic Conference and was named the MVP of the Olympic Cape Challenge and the Prime Time Shootout.

Mackey McKnight: 6-0 point guard from Langham Creek High School (Texas) ... as a junior, averaged 14.6 points, 6.8 assists and 4.3 rebounds per game while shooting 40% from three-point range ... District MVP Runner Up and First-Team All-District honors ... also named to the All-Regional Team.

Kevin McCarthy: 6-9 center who graduated from De La Salle Collegiate High School (Mich.) and is currently attending Philips Exeter Academy (N.H.) ... averaged 10.2 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game last season ... First-Team All-District and All-League and Second-Team All-State.

HITTING THE BOOKS

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. The list included Dave Buchberger (3.58), Marquis Hall (3.23), Rob Keefer (3.21) and Matt Szalachowski '09 (3.50). Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.

COAST TO COAST

This year's Mountain Hawk roster is comprised of student-athletes that hail from ten different states. There is one player each from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, and Oregon, two players from Washington and Ohio, and three players from California and Pennsylvania.

Marquis Hall is a candidate for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports.
