SETTING THE SCENE

Following a pair of very difficult road contests to begin the season Lehigh returns home this evening to open its 2009-10 schedule at Stabler Arena versus the Bobcats of Quinnipiac. Lehigh fell to Rider on Monday night in New Jersey in a game in which the Brown and White trailed 19-3 in the first five minutes before rallying to within five only to fall 86-71. Senior captain Marquis Hall continues to do his part as the Oregon native recorded a double-double with 12 points and ten assists, while junior Michael Ojo came off the bench for a team-high 14 tallies. Quinnipiac has played just once in the early going, earning an 85-74 victory over Hartford on November 13 behind a 23-point, five-rebound performance from James Feldeine. Tonight's game is the first of five straight on the road for the Bobcats.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will avoid its first 0-3 start since the 2006-07 season.
- The Mountain Hawks will improve to 18-13 versus non-league teams under Brett Reed.
- Brett Reed will earn his 30th career victory as the head coach at Lehigh.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Lehigh and Quinnipiac tangle for only the third time ever this evening with the Bobcats having won the first two games. These teams last met in 2007 with Quinnipiac earning a hard-fought 92-88 victory here at Stabler Arena in double overtime.

THE LAST MEETING

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (11/28/07) - Marquis Hall and Zahir Carrington both had career nights, combining for 50 points, but it wasn't enough as the Mountain Hawks dropped a double-overtime affair versus Quinnipiac 92-88. The Mountain Hawks led by three with 17 seconds left but Bryan Geffen drilled a three to tie the score at 66. Hall drove down the floor but lost the ball and the teams headed for OT. The first three-pointer of Bryan White's career pulled Lehigh out of a three-point hole and sent the teams into a second extra session. With 28 seconds left and the score knotted at 86, Hall was whistled for a foul and Casey Cosgrove sank a pair at the line to give QU a two-point lead. Lehigh then turned the ball over and the Bobcats held on to seal the win.

LAST TIME OUT

LAWRENCEVILLE, N.J. - Lehigh fell behind Rider by 16 points in the opening five minutes of its game at Rider but the Mountain Hawks regrouped and pulled to within five points before bowing to the Broncs 86-71 at Alumni Gym. Michael Ojo led the Brown and White with 14 points, including three three-pointers, as Lehigh received 49 points from its bench but the Mountain Hawks were unable to recover from a 19-3 start by the Broncs. Novar Gadson led the New Jersey school with a game-high 20 points.

GLASS EATERS

Zahir Carrington pulled down 8.6 boards per game last season, which led the Patriot League. It marked the fourth consecutive season a Mountain Hawk has ranked in the top-three in rebounding in the league after former captain Bryan White '08 ranked first in '07-08, second in '06-07 and third in '05-06.

CLAMPING DOWN

The Mountain Hawks defense returned to form last season as they led the Patriot League and ranked 13th nationally in field goal percentage defense at 39%. Lehigh held 14 opponents below the 40% mark from the field a season ago and limited Richmond to 38.6% in the opener.

SIGHTS SET ON THE TOP SPOT

Senior captain Marquis Hall has dished out 395 assists during his three-plus seasons in the Brown and White, good for an average of 4.3 per game. Hall, who has totaled 118 or more assists in each of his three years at Lehigh, needs 58 helpers to break the school record of 452 set by Scott Layer from 1986-90. He equaled his career-high with ten assists on Monday at Rider.

MOUNTAIN HAWKS SET MARK FOR NON-LEAGUE WINS

Lehigh won a school record ten non-league games a season ago, including its first victory over a Big East member (Rutgers). The Mountain Hawks five non-league road victories were the most since the inception of Patriot League play in 1990.

HALL UP FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Marquis Hall was recently named a candidate for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports. Hall is one of 60 basketball players from around the country who was chosen (30 male and 30 female). Based on criteria focusing on the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition, the award winners will be selected by national balloting of head basketball coaches, national media and college basketball fans.

BENCH PATROL

At Rider on Monday Lehigh received 49 of its 71 points from its bench led by junior Michael Ojo's career-best 14 points. The 49 bench points were the Mountain Hawks' most under Brett Reed. Through two games Lehigh's non-starters are averaging 36.0 points.

SCOUTING THE BOBCATS...

Tom Moore (Boston University '87) is in his third season at the helm of the Quinnipiac program. Moore came to Quinnipiac following a 13-year stint at UConn working under the legendary Jim Calhoun ... Justin Ruty was named to the preseason All-Northeast Conference First-Team. Ruty led the NEC in rebounds a season ago ... the Bobcats were selected third in the preseason NEC poll ... Quinnipiac ranked first in its conference last season in field-goal percentage defense, limiting teams to 40.1% from the floor ... the Bobcats and Mountain Hawks will take on six common opponents this season, including Yale, Navy, Columbia, Dartmouth, Monmouth and St. Francis (Pa.).

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Head Coach Brett Reed has announced seniors Dave Buchberger, Zahir Carrington, Marquis Hall and Matt Shamis are captains for the 2009-10 season.

RETURNING LEADERS

Several returning Mountain Hawks ranked among the Patriot League statistical leaders a season ago. Included on that list is Zahir Carrington who ranked first in rebounding, fourth in scoring, and ninth in blocked shots, Marquis Hall who finished third in assists, and fifth in scoring, made three-pointers, assist/turnover ratio and steals, Prentice Small who checked in at number two in assist/turnover ratio and eight in assists, and Dave Buchberger who finished second in free throw shooting.

SHINING DEBUT

Freshman C.J. McCollum came to Lehigh with a reputation for scoring the basketball and the Ohio native has lived up to that billing in the early going, scoring 12 points versus Richmond and 13 more at Rider. McCollum shooting 47% from the field and has sank five three-pointers through two games. McCollum's 12 points were the most by an LU frosh in his collegiate debut since current junior Prentice Small hit for 13 in the 2007-08 opener at Cornell.

UP NEXT...

Lehigh stays at home as the Mountain Hawks play host to the Monmouth Hawks on Monday, November 23. Tip-off is set for 7:05 from Stabler Arena as Lehigh looks for its second straight win over the New Jersey school.

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.
