#### SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh looks for its fourth straight victory this evening as the Mountain Hawks welcome the Stony Brook Seawolves to Stabler Arena. Lehigh was last in action on November 25 when the Mountain Hawks earned their first road win of the season with a 76-67 victory over the St. Francis (Pa.) Red Flash in Loretto, Pa. Freshmen C.J. McCollum and Holden Greiner combined for 38 points and a 10-0 run by the Brown and White with less than ten minutes remaining sealed the road win. Lehigh has won its last five non-league games here at Stabler Arena, including both of its contests earlier this month against Quinnipiac and Monmouth. Stony Brook is off to a hot start having won four of its five games, including a 60-46 victory over NJIT this past weekend in New York. Including tonight's contest, eight of the Seawolves first 11 games are on the road.

#### LEHIGH HEAD COACH BRETT REED

Brett Reed (Eckerd '95) is in his third season as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In two years on the sideline Reed has totaled the second most victories by a Lehigh head coach in their first two seasons in school annals. He has also won over 65-percent of his games at Stabler Arena, which is good for third best on the Lehigh leaderboard. His 2008-09 accomplishments included Lehigh's most non-league wins ever, the best start to a season in decades, the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a member of the Big East. Reed has been at Lehigh since the 2002-03 season, serving as the associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

#### IF LEHIGH WINS...

- Lehigh will improve its record to 9-3 during the last two Novembers.
- The Mountain Hawks will improve to 5-2 all-time versus Stony Brook.
- Lehigh will improve its record to 14-3 under head coach Brett Reed versus non-league teams at Stabler Arena.

## TONIGHT'S GAME

Lehigh meets Stony Brook for the seventh time this evening with the Mountain Hawks leading the series 4-2. The teams first met in 2002 when the Brown and White emerged with a 54-48 win in New York. Lehigh's last win was a 76-61 victory here in Bethlehem in 2007. SBU won last year's matchup 71-50 in New York.

### THE LAST MEETING

STONY BROOK, N.Y. (12/5/08) - After holding a nine-point lead with 13:53 remaining, Lehigh saw Stony Brook unleash a 22-4 run over a span of nine minutes that propelled the Seawolves to a 71-50 victory at Pritchard Gymnasium. Junior Marquis Hall (13) and sophomore Rob Keefer (10) both netted double-figure points for the Brown and White, while Chris Martin sank all 11 of his free throw attempts en route to a game high 19 tallies for the Seawolves. A John Adams free throw gave Lehigh a 38-29 lead with 13:38 to go, but from there Stony Brook began its game changing run. The Seawolves took their first lead of the game at the 8:32 mark on a Demond Adedeji bucket and never looked back.

### LAST TIME OUT

LORETTO, Pa. - Behind a combined 38 points from freshmen C.J. McCollum (20) and Holden Greiner (18) Lehigh earned its third consecutive victory with a 76-67 win over St. Francis (Pa.). McCollum went a perfect ten-of-ten at the foul line, while Greiner sank eight-of-ten shots from the field to give the Mountain Hawks their first road win of the season. Two players for the Red Flash scored 14 points, while Devin Sweetney totaled 11.

### BENCH PATROL

Lehigh's bench has been nearly unstoppable during the early going as the non-starters are averaging 37.2 points per game, with a high of 49 at Rider. The 49 bench points were the most Lehigh has scored under head coach Brett Reed. Leading the way off the bench at St. Francis (Pa.) was freshman Holden Greiner, who hit eight-of-ten shots, including two three-pointers, en route to 18 points in the road win. The Mountain Hawks' bench has outscored their counterparts in each game thus far.

### FABULOUS FRESHMEN

Lehigh has received a large number of contributions from freshmen C.J. McCollum and Gabe Knutson. McCollum has led the Mountain Hawks in scoring in each of the last three games, including a season best 22 points last week versus Quinnipiac while Knutson has led the team in rebounds in two games and leads the team overall with 34 boards.

### SECOND HALF SURGE

During its three game win streak Lehigh has outscored opponents a combined 135-120 in the second half. The Mountain Hawks are shooting 50% from the field during those second halves (42-84), 80% at the foul line (40-50) and 39% from three-point range (11-28). Dating back to last season, Lehigh has won six straight non-league games when outscoring its opponent in the second half.

### DISHING IT OUT

The Mountain Hawks handed out a season-best 24 assists in the win over Monmouth. The 24 helpers were Lehigh's most under head coach Brett Reed and the Mountain Hawks most since totaling 27 in a win over Delaware Valley on December 17, 2003. Lehigh enters tonight's game averaging 19.8 assists per game led by Marquis Hall's 7.8 per game. Hall, who has totaled 118 or more assists in each of his three years at Lehigh, needs 35 helpers to break the school record of 452 set by Scott Layer from 1986-90.

### STEADY PLAY AT THE STAR

Lehigh has enjoyed playing at Stabler Arena in the early going as the Mountain Hawks have outscored their opponents a combined 165-145, and shot a higher percentage from the field, foul line and three-point range than the opposition in two home games. In addition, four Lehigh players (McCollum, Keefer, Ojo, Hall) are averaging double figure points at the STAR. In three road contests Lehigh has been outscored on average by six points per game, and shot a lower percentage from those three areas. Only McCollum is averaging more than ten points on the road.

### SCOUTING THE SEAWOLVES...

Head coach Steve Pikiell is in his fifth season at the helm of the Stony Brook program ... Stony Brook's 4-1 start is its best since the 1993-94 season ... the Seawolves are outscoring their opponents by nearly 15 points per game this season and outrebounding them by over six per game ... three Stony Brook players are averaging double digit minutes in the early going this season ... Lehigh and Stony Brook will take on four common opponents this season, including NJIT, Columbia, Colgate, and Holy Cross.

**CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN**

Head Coach Brett Reed has announced seniors Dave Buchberger, Zahir Carrington, Marquis Hall and Matt Shamis are captains for the 2009-10 season.

**RETURNING LEADERS**

Several returning Mountain Hawks ranked among the Patriot League statistical leaders a season ago. Included on that list is Zahir Carrington who ranked first in rebounding, fourth in scoring, and ninth in blocked shots, Marquis Hall who finished third in assists, and fifth in scoring, made three-pointers, assist/turnover ratio and steals, Prentice Small who checked in at number two in assist/turnover ratio and eight in assists, and Dave Buchberger who finished second in free throw shooting.

**CARRINGTON NEARING MILESTONE**

Senior Zahir Carrington is closing in on the 1,000-point plateau for his career. The Philadelphia native enters tonight's game with 961 career points, 39 shy of 1,000. Carrington will become the 28th member of Lehigh's 1,000-point club with current Mountain Hawk Marquis Hall the latest entry into the club. Hall surpassed the magic number last season in a win over archrival Lafayette and now has 1,199 career points.

**UP NEXT...**

Lehigh hits the road for two straight as the Mountain Hawks travel to Columbia on Thursday evening and then head to Ohio to face a tough Dayton Flyers squad on Saturday afternoon. The Mountain Hawks and Lions tip things off at 7:00 on December 3 from the Big Apple.

**HITTING THE BOOKS**

During the 2009 spring semester, four Mountain Hawks achieved a grade point average of 3.2 or better. The list included Dave Buchberger (3.58), Marquis Hall (3.23), Rob Keefer (3.21) and Matt Szalachowski '09 (3.50). Hall was also named the 2009 Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year - the first time a Lehigh men's basketball student-athlete earned this award.

**COAST TO COAST**
