SETTING THE SCENE

The Mountain Hawks will hit the road in search of their third consecutive win and fourth straight over Binghamton. Lehigh is coming off a 75-63 win over the Red Flash of St. Francis (Pa.) last Friday night. The Mountain Hawks are getting contributions from several different players this season including junior Courtney Dentler who came off the bench and scored 10 points and collected eight rebounds against the Red Flash. Binghamton is 0-2 on the young season after it suffered losses to St. Bonaventure 63-42 and Syracuse 87-74.

LEHIGH-BINGHAMTON SERIES

This will be the ninth match-up between the two teams with Lehigh leading the all-time series 5-3. The Mountain Hawks are coming off a big 78-45 win over the Bearcats last season. Senior Alex Ross put on a shooting clinic as she hit nine three-pointers and scored a career-high 29 points in the win. Ross and the Mountain Hawks will look to win their fourth straight against Binghamton on Tuesday night.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 15th season at the helm, carrying a career record of 210-200. No other coach in Lehigh's history has won as many overall games or Patriot League contests as Troyan. She received her second Patriot League Coach of the Year honor in 2009 after she guided the team to 26 overall wins, and a Lehigh-record 12 wins against league opponents. Troyan is also a former head softball coach at Lehigh, instantly turning that program into a perennial Patriot League power.

JOINING THE ELITE

Senior guard Alex Ross sits in second place in the record books in three-pointers made in a career. With three seasons under her belt, Ross has drained 220 shots from behind the arc, including a school-record 93 in 2008-09. Ross sits just 19 made three-pointers behind Sara Ellis for first place on the all-time list.

Ross also became only the 13th player in program history to score over 1,000 career points last season. With 1,052 points Ross will look to keep climbing the record books in 2009-10.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Lehigh went a perfect 17-0 at home in 2008-09, a winning streak that is the seventh longest in Division I. The Mountain Hawks defeated opponents by a scoring margin of 16.5 points and held them to an average of 52.1 points per game. In 2009-10 Lehigh is off to a 2-0 home start and will look to keep the streak going December 5, against Villanova.

WHEN PROSSER HITS 10

When junior point guard Erica Prosser has hit double-figures in points Lehigh has a 24-5 overall record during the last two seasons. In games that she doesn't hit the mark the Mountain Hawks are only 5-3.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Senior guard Alex Ross is well on her way to becoming the most prolific three-point shooter in school history. With 220 career 3-pointers she only needs 19 more to surpass Sara Ellis '07 to take over the school's all-time lead. Last season Ross set a Mountain Hawk single season record with 93 3-pointers and her 42.1 three-point percentage ranked her 12th in Division I.

WATCH OUT FOR WILLIAMS

Sophomore Alexa Williams has become quite the thief on the basketball court in 2009-10. Williams not only is Lehigh's leading rebounder (8.8), but she also leads the entire Patriot League in steals per game with 3.5. The 6-3 sophomore has used her height and agility to out work her opponents and steal the ball away. In Lehigh's season opener against Lipscomb Williams recorded a career-high six steals and against St. Francis she had five.

FILLING BIG SHOES

The Mountain Hawks graduated four key seniors that helped lead the team to the 2008-09 Patriot League title. Exiting are Claire Sullivan, Haley Crites, Courtney Molinaro and Melissa Rich, who will be replaced by four talented freshmen that expect to fight for playing time in 2009-10. Becky Guman scored more than 1,000 points in her high school career as a guard for Allentown Central Catholic in Allentown, Pa. Kelly Peterson scored more than 1,600 points in her high school career as a forward for Northgate in Concord, Calif. Sarah Pearce, scored over 1,000 points in her high school career as a forward for Bishop Fenwick in Franklin, Ohio. The final newcomer, Marybeth Egan from Cicero-North High School in Syracuse, N.Y. scored over 1,000 career points and was First Team All-League for three seasons.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

With all of the success the women's basketball team had in 2008-09 there was one thing that wasn't accomplished and that was no player recorded a double-double. This season is a different story as two Mountain Hawks have all ready earned a double-double in only four games. Sophomore Alexa Williams had 13 points and 15 rebounds to help the Brown and White defeat Lipscomb 77-60. On Wednesday night her classmate Emily Gratch recorded her first career double-double as she added 13 points and 11 rebounds to pick up the win over FDU 75-45.

TROYAN VERSUS BINGHAMTON

Lehigh head coach Sue Troyan is the only coach in program history to face Binghamton. In Lehigh's eight games against the Bearcats the Mountain Hawks hold all-time with a 5-3 record. A win Tuesday night would give the Brown and White four straight over Binghamton.
