SETTING THE SCENE

The Mountain Hawks return to Bethlehem after a two-game road trip in Nashville that saw the team start the season 1-1. After picking up its first win of the season on Friday night 77-60 against Lipscomb, Lehigh fell to No. 20/22 Vanderbilt 90-54 on Sunday. Fairleigh Dickinson comes into the game riding a one-game win streak after dropping its first game of the season against Syracuse 65-45. The Knights rebounded on Monday night to defeat Howard 76-57. Jordan Sykes and Mariyah Laury paced Fairleigh Dickinson with 19 points apiece in the win. Senior Alex Ross will be honored before the tip-off for reaching the 1,000 point milestone last season.

LEHIGH-FAIRLEIGH DICKINSON SERIES

This will be the fifth match-up between Lehigh and Fairleigh Dickinson. The Mountain Hawks hold the all-time series lead 3-1 and are coming off a 90-54 win last season. Lehigh exploded for 59 points in the first half and all 12 of the dressed players saw action in the game.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 15th season at the helm, carrying a career record of 208-200. No other coach in Lehigh's history has won as many overall games or Patriot League contests as Troyan. She received her second Patriot League Coach of the Year honor in 2009 after she guided the team to 26 overall wins, and a Lehigh-record 12 wins against league opponents. Troyan is also a former head softball coach at Lehigh, instantly turning that program into a perennial Patriot League power.

JOINING THE ELITE

Senior guard Alex Ross sits in second place in the record books in three-pointers made in a career. With three seasons under her belt, Ross has drained 216 shots from behind the arc, including a school-record 93 in 2008-09. Ross sits just 23 made three-pointers behind Sara Ellis for first place on the all-time list.

Ross also became only the 13th player in program history to score over 1,000 career points last season. With 1,028 points Ross will look to keep climbing the record books in 2009-10.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Lehigh went a perfect 17-0 at home in the 2008-09, a winning streak that is the seventh longest in Division I. The Mountain Hawks defeated opponents by a scoring margin of 16.5 points and held them to an average of 52.1 points per game.

WHEN PROSSER HITS 10

When junior point guard Erica Prosser has hit double-figures in points Lehigh has a 22-5 overall record during the last two seasons. In games that she doesn't hit the mark the Mountain Hawks are only 5-3.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Senior guard Alex Ross is well on her way to becoming the most prolific three-point shooter in school history. With 216 career 3-pointers she only needs 23 more to surpass Sara Ellis '07 to take over the school's all-time lead. Last season Ross set a Mountain Hawk single season record with 93 3-pointers and her 42.1 three-point percentage ranked her 12th in Division I.

MILESTONE WITHIN REACH

Fifth-year senior Tricia Smith needs only 10 more rebounds to reach 500 for her career. The third year captain for Lehigh, missed the 2006-07 season due to injury, but she was able to rebound and put together quite a career. At only 5-9, Smith has been a monster on the boards for the Mountain Hawks, and she has shown that size doesn't matter when it comes to collecting rebounds. Smith has averaged over five rebounds a game over the last two seasons.

FILLING BIG SHOES

The Mountain Hawks graduated four key seniors that helped lead the team to the 2008-09 Patriot League title. Exiting are Claire Sullivan, Haley Crites, Courtney Molinaro and Melissa Rich, who will be replaced by four talented freshmen that expect to fight for playing time in 2009-10. Becky Guman scored more than 1,000 points in her high school career as a guard for Allentown Central Catholic in Allentown, Pa. Kelly Peterson scored more than 1,600 points in her high school career as a forward for Northgate in Concord, Calif. Sarah Pearce, scored over 1,000 points in her high school career as a forward for Bishop Fenwick in Franklin, Ohio. The final newcomer, Marybeth Egan from Cicero-North High School in Syracuse, N.Y. scored over 1,000 career points and was First Team All-League for three seasons.

BLAKE GETS ON THE BOARD

Sophomore Kelela Blake made the most of her time against Vanderbilt as she grabbed two rebounds and hit two foul shots to record her first career points. Blake saw time in only eight games last season, but she has already seen action in Lehigh's first two games. The forward is expected to contribute as part of the post rotation for the Mountain Hawks.
