SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh will put its pencils down after finishing up exams and return to the court to face NJIT tonight at Stabler Arena. The Mountain Hawks have been off for 11-days since their last game against Duquesne on Dec. 7. The Brown and White rallied to defeat the Dukes 62-52 after trailing at the half. Senior Alex Ross led the way with a season-high 21 points and now sits two three-pointers away from becoming Lehigh's all-time leader. After dropping three straight games NJIT got back in the win column against Colgate on Dec. 9, defeating the Raiders 52-41.

LEHIGH-NJIT SERIES

This will be the fourth match-up between NJIT and Lehigh with the Mountain Hawks leading the all-time series 3-0. The two teams have played in each of the last three seasons with the Brown and White earning a 65-54 win last year in New Jersey.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 15th season at the helm, carrying a career record of 214-201. No other coach in Lehigh's history has won as many overall games or Patriot League contests as Troyan. She received her second Patriot League Coach of the Year honor in 2009 after she guided the team to 26 overall wins, and a Lehigh-record 12 wins against league opponents. Troyan is also a former head softball coach at Lehigh, instantly turning that program into a perennial Patriot League power.

IF LEHIGH WINS TONIGHT...

LEHIGH VS THE GREAT WEST

Even though this will be Lehigh's fourth all-time game against NJIT, it will be its first against the Great West Conference. Only in their fourth year in Division I, the Highlanders officially joined the conference this season. Other members include: Cal Poly, Chicago State, Houston Baptist, North Dakota, South Dakota, Southern Utah, Texas Pan-American, UC Davis and Utah Valley.

SCOUTING THE HIGHLANDERS

Coming off a disappointing 2008-09 season NJIT is looking to rebound this year. The Highlanders are one win away from half of their win total from last season and return several players from last years team. NJIT has already played two Patriot League teams this season losing to American 65-57 and beating Colgate 52-41.

NJIT HEAD COACH MARGARET MCKEON

Margaret McKeon is in her third season at the helm of the Highlanders, where she has earned a 21-45 record. In her first season with the team she doubled NJIT's win total from its first season against division I competition (2006-07).

SHARING THE ROCK

Against Villanova on December 5, five different Mountain Hawks scored in double figures (Prosser 17, Gratch 17, Ross 14, Dalton 12, Dentler 11). It shows how well balanced Lehigh's offensive attack is and on any given night a different player can step up. The last time a Lehigh team had five players score in double figures was a 70-44 victory over NJIT on December 9, 2006. (Adrienne Blount 10, Melissa Rich 11, Sara Ellis 11, Kristen Dalton 11, Alex Ross 10).

LEHIGH'S OPPONENTS GETTING DENTED

Junior Courtney Dentler is making a big impact for the Mountain Hawks this season. Dentler is averaging over 23 minutes a game this season and she has shown her versatility coming off the bench and starting. Dentler has made three consecutive starts and against Duquesne last Monday she played a career-high 33 minutes while contributing eight points. Against Binghamton on November 24, Dentler scored a career-high 17 points in the Lehigh victory.

WHEN PROSSER HITS 10

When junior point guard Erica Prosser has hit double-figures in points Lehigh has a 28-6 overall record during the last two seasons. In games that she doesn't hit the mark the Mountain Hawks are only 5-3.

ELITE COMPANY

Two Mountain Hawks are on the verge of career milestones as senior Alex Ross and junior Erica Prosser continue to cement their place in Lehigh history. Ross needs only two more three-pointers to become the Brown and White's all-time leader with 239. Prosser is a few games away from reaching 1,000 points as she currently has 926.

HITTING THEIR MARK

The Mountain Hawks are 5-0 this season when they score at least 75 points in a game, including a season-high 80 points in a win over Big East foe Villanova. The Brown and White is averaging 70.4 points per game which is tops in the Patriot League this season.

FROSH LEGS

When you have two All-League selections starting in your back court it is important to have subs that can come in the game to spell them. Freshman Becky Guman has been that for the Mountain Hawks, seeing action in all nine games. She is averaging 13.4 minutes per game this year. The Brown and White's other three freshmen have also seen action this season, coming off the bench late in games. Kelly Peterson recorded her first career rebounds (4) and had a block against Princeton. Sarah Pearce scored her first career points off free throws against La Salle on November 29.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

With all of the success the women's basketball team had in 2008-09 there was one thing that wasn't accomplished and that was no player recorded a double-double. This season is a different story as two Mountain Hawks have already earned a double-double in only nine games. Sophomore Alexa Williams had 13 points and 15 rebounds to help the Brown and White defeat Lipscomb 77-60. Against FDU, her classmate Emily Gratch recorded her first career double-double as she added 13 points and 11 rebounds to pick up the win 75-45.

WELCOME BACK WILLIAMS

Lehigh had its toughest stretch of non-league games the past few weeks and came away with a 2-1 record. This was done without sophomore Alexa Williams who was out due to a medical reason. The 6'3" forward is rested and ready to start cleaning the glass again as her 8.7 rebounds per game are tops on the team.
