The Mountain Hawks stay in Bethlehem to take on another opponent from the Northeast Conference as they host the St. Francis (Pa.) Red Flash on Friday night. Lehigh and FDU battled it out during the first half of the game on Wednesday as there was eight lead changes. The Mountain Hawks used a 22-2 run to start the second half to put away the Knights for good and win their second game. The Red Flash have struggled out of the gate losing to Marquette 74-38 in their season opener and to Delaware 77-64 on Tuesday night.

LEHIGH-ST. FRANCIS (PA.) SERIES

This will be the fourth match-up between the two teams with Lehigh leading the all-time series 2-1. The Mountain Hawks are coming off a big 82-62 win over the Red Flash last season. The Brown and White used a big first half in which the team scored 53 points to take control of the game. Lehigh had no problem holding off St. Francis to pick up its third win of the season.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 15th season at the helm, carrying a career record of 209-200. No other coach in Lehigh's history has won as many overall games or Patriot League contests as Troyan. She received her second Patriot League Coach of the Year honor in 2009 after she guided the team to 26 overall wins, and a Lehigh-record 12 wins against league opponents. Troyan is also a former head softball coach at Lehigh, instantly turning that program into a perennial Patriot League power.

JOINING THE ELITE

Senior guard Alex Ross sits in second place in the record books in three-pointers made in a career. With three seasons under her belt, Ross has drained 218 shots from behind the arc, including a school-record 93 in 2008-09. Ross sits just 21 made three-pointers behind Sara Ellis for first place on the all-time list.

Ross also became only the 13th player in program history to score over 1,000 career points last season. With 1,038 points Ross will look to keep climbing the record books in 2009-10.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Lehigh went a perfect 17-0 at home in the 2008-09, a winning streak that is the seventh longest in Division I. The Mountain Hawks defeated opponents by a scoring margin of 16.5 points and held them to an average of 52.1 points per game. In 2009-10 Lehigh is off to a 1-0 home start and a win tonight would extend the winning streak to 19 games.

WHEN PROSSER HITS 10

When junior point guard Erica Prosser has hit double-figures in points Lehigh has a 23-5 overall record during the last two seasons. In games that she doesn't hit the mark the Mountain Hawks are only 5-3.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Senior guard Alex Ross is well on her way to becoming the most prolific three-point shooter in school history. With 218 career 3-pointers she only needs 21 more to surpass Sara Ellis '07 to take over the school's all-time lead. Last season Ross set a Mountain Hawk single season record with 93 3-pointers and her 42.1 three-point percentage ranked her 12th in Division I.

MILESTONE WITHIN REACH

Fifth-year senior Tricia Smith needs only three more rebounds to reach 500 for her career. The third year captain for Lehigh, missed the 2006-07 season due to injury, but she was able to rebound and put together quite a career. At only 5-9, Smith has been a monster on the boards for the Mountain Hawks, and she has shown that size doesn't matter when it comes to collecting rebounds. Smith has averaged over five rebounds a game over the last two seasons and is averaging 6.0 in 2009-10.

FILLING BIG SHOES

The Mountain Hawks graduated four key seniors that helped lead the team to the 2008-09 Patriot League title. Exiting are Claire Sullivan, Haley Crites, Courtney Molinaro and Melissa Rich, who will be replaced by four talented freshmen that expect to fight for playing time in 2009-10. Becky Guman scored more than 1,000 points in her high school career as a guard for Allentown Central Catholic in Allentown, Pa. Kelly Peterson scored more than 1,600 points in her high school career as a forward for Northgate in Concord, Calif. Sarah Pearce, scored over 1,000 points in her high school career as a forward for Bishop Fenwick in Franklin, Ohio. The final newcomer, Marybeth Egan from Cicero-North High School in Syracuse, N.Y. scored over 1,000 career points and was First Team All-League for three seasons.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

With all of the success the women's basketball team had in 2008-09 there was one thing that wasn't accomplished and that was no player recorded a double-double. This season is a different story as two Mountain Hawks have all ready earned a double-double in only three games. Sophomore Alexa Williams had 13 points and 15 rebounds to help the Brown and White defeat Lipscomb 77-60. On Wednesday night her classmate Emily Gratch recorded her first career double-double as she added 13 points and 11 rebounds to pick up the win over FDU 75-45.
