SETTING THE SCENE

The Mountain Hawks continue their two-game road trip in Nashville as they take on the defending SEC Champions, the Vanderbilt Commodores, in their season opener. Lehigh is coming off a 77-60 win over Lipscomb in its season opener on Friday night. Reigning Patriot League Player of the Year, Erica Prosser, established a new career-high with 27 points in the win. The Commodores return three of five starters from a team that won 26 games last season which included a NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

LEHIGH-VANDERBILT SERIES

This will be the first ever meeting between the two schools. Lehigh has a 0-1 overall record against the Southeastern Conference.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH SUE TROYAN

Sue Troyan (Dickinson '88) is in her 15th season at the helm, carrying a career record of 208-199. No other coach in Lehigh's history has won as many overall games or Patriot League contests as Troyan. She received her second Patriot League Coach of the Year honor in 2009 after she guided the team to 26 overall wins, and a Lehigh-record 12 wins against league opponents. Troyan is also a former head softball coach at Lehigh, instantly turning that program into a perennial Patriot League power.

JOINING THE ELITE

Senior guard Alex Ross sits in second place in the record books in three-pointers made in a career. With three seasons under her belt, Ross has drained 214 shots from behind the arc, including a school-record 93 in 2008-09. Ross sits just 25 made three-pointers behind Sara Ellis for first place on the all-time list.

Ross also became only the 13th player in program history to score over 1,000 career points last season. With 1,020 points Ross will look to keep climbing the record books in 2009-10.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Lehigh went a perfect 17-0 at home in the 2008-09, a winning streak that is the seventh longest in Division I. The Mountain Hawks defeated opponents by a scoring margin of 16.5 points and held them to an average of 52.1 points per game.

MOST VALUABLE PROSSER

Junior point guard Erica Prosser was named the Patriot League's 2008-09 Player of the Year and is only the second Lehigh player to ever win the award. During league play Prosser dominated, leading the league in scoring with 15.9 points per game. She finished the season third overall in scoring with 14.2 points per game and second in assists with 4.4 a game. Prosser was named the 2009-10 preseason Patriot League Player of the Year.

FROM DOWNTOWN

Senior guard Alex Ross is well on her way to becoming the most prolific three-point shooter in school history. With 214 career 3-pointers she only needs 25 more to surpass Sara Ellis '07 to take over the school's all-time lead. Last season Ross set a Mountain Hawk single season record with 93 3-pointers and her 42.1 three-point percentage ranked her 12th in Division I.

HOMECOMING

Senior Alex Ross, a native of Columbia, Tenn., is getting the chance to play in front of her family and friends this opening weekend of the 2009-10 basketball season. It is the first time in her four years that Lehigh has played in her home state. Head coach Sue Troyan tries to get at least one game in all of her players home states before their careers are over as a Mountain Hawk.

FILLING BIG SHOES

The Mountain Hawks graduated four key seniors that helped lead the team to the 2008-09 Patriot League title. Exiting are Claire Sullivan, Haley Crites, Courtney Molinaro and Melissa Rich, who will be replaced by four talented freshmen that expect to fight for playing time in 2009-10. Becky Guman scored more than 1,000 points in her high school career as a guard for Allentown Central Catholic in Allentown, Pa. Kelly Peterson scored more than 1,600 points in her high school career as a forward for Northgate in Concord, Calif. Sarah Pearce, scored over 1,000 points in her high school career as a forward for Bishop Fenwick in Franklin, Ohio. The final newcomer, Marybeth Egan from Cicero-North High School in Syracuse, N.Y. scored over 1,000 career points and was First Team All-League for three seasons.

SEASONED BACKCOURT

After losing just one senior guard to graduation, the Mountain Hawks will bring back one of the most experienced backcourts in the Patriot League this year. Junior Erica Prosser, who was first on the team in scoring (14.2) and assists (14.4) is back after being named Patriot League Player of the Year. Tricia Smith, who racked up a team-leading 5.9 rebounds per contest, returns for her fifth season. Senior Alex Ross also returns after she was selected to the All-Patriot League Second Team last season. Ross averaged 13.7 ppg last season and set a new Lehigh record for three-pointers in a season with 93. Coming off the bench to provide the Mountain Hawks with depth is senior Kristen Dalton who saw action in 32 games last season.

MAKING HER IMPACT

Freshman Becky Guman came in and played 11 minutes off the bench for the Mountain Hawks against Lipscomb. She added two points and six rebounds in the 77-60 win for Lehigh. Guman will be expected to come in and contribute as part of the guard rotation for the Brown and White this season.

BIG ON THE BOARDS

In only her 10th career start sophomore Alexa Williams helped Lehigh shutdown Lipscomb for its first win of the season.
