SETTING THE SCENE

No. 7 Lehigh heads to New England this weekend looking to build momentum heading into the EIWA Championships, which are now just three weeks away. The Mountain Hawks will visit Brown Saturday afternoon before traveling to Harvard for a Sunday dual. Lehigh overcame a 12-3 deficit at intermission to defeat No. 19 Virginia Tech 24-12 last Friday at Leeman-Turner Arena at Grace Hall, while Saturday's scheduled dual with Rutgers was postponed by snow. Brown and Harvard are both struggling this dual season, with a combined 5-20-1 dual record. Lehigh has won 12 straight duals over Brown and 11 in a row against Harvard.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 820-383-23, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks are unbeaten in their last 11 EIWA duals, and are 16-2-1 against EIWA foes since the start of the 2007-08 season.
- Lehigh has beaten both Brown and Harvard on the same weekend in each of the last 11 seasons.
- A total of eight Lehigh wrestlers are ranked in the top 20 nationally by either InterMat, W.I.N. Magazine or Amateur Wrestling News.

Lehigh coasted to a 29-7 win over Brown giving it a 3-0 weekend in its return to Grace Hall. The Mountain Hawks won eight bouts to move to 19-1 on the dual season. Trevor Chinn delivered five team points with a 17-2 technical fall over Dave Foxen at 149, plus three additional Mountain Hawks posted major decision wins. Matt Fisk beat Ross Baldwin 15-2 at 133, Mike Galante added a 14-4 win over Chris Musser at 165 and Zach Rey closed out the day with a 16-4 major decision over Leo Saniuk at heavyweight. Brian Tanen earned a start at 157 and won a 7-4 decision over Bryan Tracy.

On a day in which Lehigh celebrated its 100th season of wrestling, the Mountain Hawks routed Harvard in the opening dual of a doubleheader. Lehigh won nine weight classes and posted bonus point wins in five matches. The highlight of the dual came at 184 where David Craig erased a 2-0 deficit with a takedown in the final seconds to defeat Louis Caputo 3-2. Seth Ciasulli and Joe Kennedy earned pins, with Ciasulli's 37 second pin of Johnny Motley serving as the fastest fall of the season for Lehigh. Brandon Hatchett and Alex Caruso added wins by major decision while Kellen Aura won by forfeit at 125.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

Brown enters the weekend with a 3-10 dual record that includes a 1-5 mark against EIWA opponents. The Bears went 1-3 last weekend, winning their first dual of the weekend versus Boston University before dropping matches to Drexel, Penn and Princeton. Brown will host Harvard Saturday afternoon prior to its dual against Lehigh. The Bears do not have any wrestlers ranked in the national polls, and only have one wrestler ranked in the January 25 EIWA rankings: senior Greg Einfrank at 125. The Brown lineup also features three other experienced seniors in Bryan Tracy (157), Bran Crudden (184) and Branden Stearns (197). Dave Amato is in his 27th season as Bears' head coach.

SCOUTING THE CRIMSON

Despite the presence of some top individuals, Harvard has struggled in duals this season, compiling a 2-10-1 record. The Crimson will be looking to snap a seven-dual losing streak and an eight dual winless streak when they visit Brown on Saturday before hosting Lehigh on Sunday. Harvard is coming off an 0-2 weekend with home losses to Princeton and Penn. The Crimson are led by two seniors who are ranked nationally. Harvard boasts the No. 1 ranked wrestler in the country at 157 in J.P. O'Connor, while classmate Louis Caputo is ranked 11th at 184. In the latest EIWA rankings, O'Connor and Caputo are joined by freshman Steven Keith who is ranked sixth in the conference at 125. Allentown native Jay Weiss is in his 16th season at Harvard. The Crimson and Mountain Hawks had one meeting at the Midlands in December, where Seth Ciasulli defeated Tony Buxton 2-0 at 141.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years

MATT ON A MISSION

Co-captain Matt Fisk has enjoyed a strong senior season. Fisk has wrestled 19 bouts and has come away with 14 wins including six bonus victories: three pins, two technical falls and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 13th at 133 by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and is just the seventh three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 81-36 career overall mark with 42 bonus wins and a 50-17 career dual meet record.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals in November. He owns a 17-10 overall record and enters this weekend's action having won four of his last five dual matches.

LET'S GO JOE!

After starting the season 2-6, sophomore Joe Kennedy has bounced back, winning ten of his last 14 bouts. More than half of Kennedy's bouts have come against wrestlers currently ranked in the InterMat top 20, including nine matches with men ranked in the top 10. Kennedy already owned wins over sixth-ranked Eric Lapotsky of Oklahoma and eighth-ranked Trevor Brandvold of Wisconsin. The Milford, Pa. native then added a 5-4, two-tiebreaker win over No. 5 Cam Simaz of Cornell in Lehigh's 15-15 tie with the Big Red on January 22. The win vaulted Kennedy into the national rankings at No. 19. Kennedy went 20-12 as a true freshman last season before defaulting out of the EIWA Championships with an injury.

ZACH ATTACK

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's most successful wrestler this season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year opened this season with 16 straight victories before falling in the Midlands semifinals. Rey is 13-2 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open in December, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh wrestler ranked in the top ten nationally.

MASTERS OF THE MIDLANDS

The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a school-record setting performance at the 47th Midlands Championships in late December. A record six of Lehigh's 12 entrants placed in the top eight at their respective weight classes in one of college wrestling's most prestigious and challenging in-season tournaments. Senior Matt Fisk turned in the highest finish with his fourth place medal at 133. Sophomore Zach Rey reached the semifinals at 285 before placing fifth, while senior Mike Galante also placed fifth, at 165. Lehigh's other three place-winners, Seth Ciasulli (141), Robert Hamlin (174) and Joe Kennedy (197) all claimed eighth place.

THE RETURNING CHAMPS

The Mountain Hawks boast two wrestlers who claimed major tournament titles last season. Seniors Seth Ciasulli (141) and David Craig (184) both captured EIWA championships to lead Lehigh to a second place team finish. Both men are having strong seasons in 2009-10 as Craig is 15-3 and ranked 15th at 184, while Ciasulli is 14-9 and ranked 17th at 141. Craig owns 80 career victories while Ciasulli is not far behind with 78.

COMEBACK KIDS

Coming from behind in dual meets has become commonplace for the Mountain Hawks this season. Since January 1, Lehigh has enjoyed three impressive comebacks in dual meets. At the Virginia Duals, Lehigh spotted Oklahoma a 16-0 lead after four bouts before winning the final six weight classes, all by decision to upset the Sooners 18-16. Two weeks later in Ithaca, N.Y., Lehigh trailed rival Cornell 15-6 after seven bouts, but three consecutive decisions from David Craig, Joe Kennedy and Zach Rey helped Lehigh earn a 15-15. Last weekend the Mountain Hawks spotted Virginia Tech a 12-3 lead at intermission, before capturing the final five weight classes to win 24-12.

SENIOR SEND-OFF

Lehigh's 11 member senior class was recognized prior to last Friday's dual meet with Virginia Tech. Four members of that group have been multi-year starters for the Brown and White. Three of the four are expected to compete this weekend. Here's a look at the multi-year starters in Lehigh's class of 2010.
