SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh returns to the mats for the first time in nearly two weeks as the Mountain Hawks host EIWA rival Bucknell. The Mountain Hawks were idle last weekend, but have won their last four duals since suffering their lone loss of the season in the finals of the Virginia Duals. Two weekends ago Lehigh opened up a regular season-ending seven match home stand with wins over Drexel, Harvard and Brown to run its season record to 19-1. Tonight's match kicks-off the stretch run for the Mountain Hawks, who will host EIWA opponents for the season's final four duals, starting tonight against a Bucknell team that is 9-8 on the dual season and boasts two nationally ranked wrestlers.

FAST FACTS

- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 804-380-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks 19 dual wins are currently tied for the third-highest single-season total in school history.
- Bucknell resurrected its wrestling program four years ago and is making its first visit to Bethlehem since November 1998.

The Mountain Hawks remained alive in the consolations after day one of the Virginia Duals after edging Bucknell 16-15 on criteria. The teams split ten bouts in the dual and despite Lehigh being docked a team point for unsportsmanlike conduct at 174, Alex Iacocca's major decision over Charlie Wonsettler at 197 provided the criteria for Lehigh to advance to day two. Iacocca's major was the only bonus win in a dual that was tight throughout. Seth Ciasulli, Trevor Chinn and Dave Nakasone won decisions to put Lehigh up 9-6. The Mountain Hawks were docked a team point after Alex Caruso's 13-6 win over Rob Waltko at 174.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

BUCKNELL HEAD COACH DAN WIRNSBERGER

Coach Wirnsberger is in his fourth season as head coach of the Bison. He was hired in 2005 with the task of reviving the Bucknell program after a four-year hiatus where it was not a varsity sport. In his first two seasons, he amassed a record of 21-20-2 and led the Bison to ninth and eighth place showings at the EIWA Championships. In each of his two competitive seasons, Wirnsberger has guided three men to the NCAA Championships. Prior to coming to Lewisburg, Wirnsberger spent four years as the head coach at Bloomsburg and six seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia Tech. Wirnsberger is a 1995 graduate of Michigan State where he was a Big Ten Champion and NCAA runner-up.

IN FRONT BY A CHINN

The lone senior in Lehigh's starting lineup, Trevor Chinn has been making the most of his final season in the Brown and White. Chinn won his first 11 bouts to start the season and is among the team leaders in wins with a 22-6 record. The senior co-captain is currently ranked No. 14 at 149. A two-time NCAA qualifier, Chinn boasts a 83-43 career record, including a 48-23 mark in duals.

SCOUTING THE BISON

Bucknell enters tonight's dual at 9-8 overall and 3-2 against EIWA opponents. While Lehigh was off last weekend, the Bison were very busy, traveling to Iowa, where they fell to the top-ranked Hawkeyes 40-3 before returning home to defeat EIWA rival Columbia in their final home dual, 28-12. Within the EIWA, Bucknell owns wins over Franklin & Marshall, Brown and Columbia, but has lost to both Army and Navy. Like Lehigh, Bucknell competed at the Journeymen/Brute Northeast Duals, the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational and the Virginia Duals. Individually, the Bison boast two nationally-ranked wrestlers in juniors David Marble and Andy Rendos. Marble comes in at No. 20 at 133, while Rendos is ranked 14th at 165. Several other Bison wrestlers have experienced success against the Brown and White this season. Freshman Derek Reber knocked Lehigh's John McDonald out of the Las Vegas invitational with a win by major decision, while sophomore David Thompson upset David Craig in that same tournament.

NO ORDINARY JOE

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who is tied for the team lead with six wins by major decision this season, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

ANYONE, ANYTIME, ANYWHERE

The Mountain Hawks will once again face one of the nation's toughest dual meet schedules. The Mountain Hawks are currently 6-1 against ranked teams this season, winning six straight duals versus ranked foes before bowing to Central Michigan in the finals of the Virginia Duals.

GALANTE: GETTING IT DONE

One of the most pleasant surprises for Lehigh this season has been the performance of junior Mike Galante, who is tied for the team lead with 22 wins and is ranked 12th at 165. The sixth place finisher in the EIWA a year ago, Galante is currently 16-2 in duals, and ranks among the team leaders with four falls.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Senior Trevor Chinn (**Canandaigua, N.Y.**) and junior Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2008-09 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as two-time NCAA qualifiers and one-time EIWA runner-ups. Fisk also captained the Mountain Hawks last season, while deferring his eligibility.

RANK AND FILE

Six Lehigh wrestlers are ranked in the latest InterMat poll, led by junior David Craig, who comes in at No. 9 at 184. The Mountain Hawks also have six wrestlers ranked in the W.I.N. Magazine and Amateur Wrestling News polls.
