### SETTING THE SCENE

No. 8 Lehigh will face one of its toughest tests of the dual season tonight as the Mountain Hawks travel to Ithaca, N.Y. to face the sixth-ranked Big Red of Cornell. The Mountain Hawks returned home last weekend and picked up a pair of convincing wins over West Virginia and Navy. Lehigh will now look to knock-off the three-time defending EIWA Champions as the Mountain Hawks and Big Red meet for the 87th time overall, but the first time since 2007. Cornell is just 3-3 in duals, but the Big Red boast seven nationally ranked wrestlers, including five projected starters who are ranked in the top five of their respective weight classes.

### FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 819-383-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks (2002-2006) and Big Red (2007-2009) have combined to win the last eight EIWA Team Championships.
- Lehigh's first ever dual meet was wrestled at Cornell 100 years ago next month. The Brown and White lost to the Big Red five bouts to two.
- The Mountain Hawks finished second to Cornell at last year's EIWA Championships.

Lehigh and Cornell split ten bouts, but back-to-back falls from senior Paul Weibel and sophomore Matt Fisk propelled the 25th-ranked Mountain Hawks over the No. 11 Big Red at Stabler Arena. Both teams were missing key wrestlers, but Lehigh's two pins outshined a fall and major decision from Cornell. Weibel pinned Zach Hammond in the first period, while Fisk secured a fall against Mike Rodriguez in the second. Dave Nakasone, David Craig and Matt Ciasulli all won decisions to propel Lehigh to one of its biggest dual wins of the season.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO**

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

**SERIES HISTORY**

Following a two-season hiatus, longtime rivals Lehigh and Cornell will meet for the 87th time Friday night. The Big Red serve as Lehigh's third most often wrestled opponent, behind just Penn State and Navy. Lehigh won the last meeting, upsetting Cornell 21-19 in 2007 at Stabler Arena. The Mountain Hawks have won six of the last seven duals in the series. Lehigh's first ever dual meet was against Cornell, 100 years ago next month. The Big Red captured that dual, winning five bouts to two.

### SCOUTING THE BIG RED

Cornell returns home for the first time in two months to host Lehigh on Friday before hosting the New York State Intercollegiate Championships on Saturday. The three-time defending EIWA Champions have been off since going 3-2 en route to a sixth place team finish at the NWCA National Duals January 9-10 in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Cornell has had success on the tournament circuit as well. The Big Red were second at the Body Bar Invitational and the Las Vegas Invitational and won the Southern Scuffle in late December. Rob Koll is in his 17th season as coach of the Big Red and has led Cornell to top 10 NCAA tournament finishes in each of the last two seasons. Seven of Cornell's projected starters are ranked nationally by InterMat, led by defending NCAA Champion Troy Nickerson (No. 2 at 125). In addition, freshman Kyle Dake comes in at No. 2 at 141, junior Mack Lewnes occupies the top spot at 174, and EIWA Freshman of the Year Cam Simaz is ranked fifth at 197.

### MATT ON A MISSION

Co-captain Matt Fisk has enjoyed a strong first half of his senior season. Fisk has wrestled 17 bouts and has come away with 13 wins including six bonus victories: three pins, two technical falls and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 14th at 133 by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and is just the sixth three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 80-35 career overall mark with 42 bonus wins and a 49-16 career dual meet record.

### A FRESH START

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals in November. He owns a 16-9 overall record and picked up his first career dual meet win, over Quentin Fuentes of Oklahoma State at the Virginia Duals earlier this month.

### LET'S GO JOE!

After starting the season 2-6, sophomore Joe Kennedy has bounced back, winning eight of his last 12 bouts to even his season record. More than half of Kennedy's bouts have come against wrestlers currently ranked in the InterMat top 20, including eight matches with men ranked in the top 10. Kennedy owns wins over sixth-ranked Eric Lapotsky of Oklahoma and eighth-ranked Trevor Brandvold of Wisconsin. The Milford, Pa. native went 20-12 as a true freshman last season before defaulting out of the EIWA Championships with an injury. Kennedy is expected to face his eighth top 10 wrestler of the season tonight, when he meets Cornell's fifth-ranked sophomore Cam Simaz.

### ZACH ATTACK

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's best wrestler through the first half of the season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year opened this season with 16 straight victories before falling in the Midlands semifinals. Rey is 11-2 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open in December, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh wrestler ranked in the top ten nationally.

### MASTERS OF THE MIDLANDS

The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a school-record setting performance at the 47th Midlands Championships last month. A record six of Lehigh's 12 entrants placed in the top eight at their respective weight classes in one of college wrestling's most prestigious and challenging in-season tournaments. Senior Matt Fisk turned in the highest finish with his fourth place medal at 133. Sophomore Zach Rey reached the semifinals at 285 before placing fifth, while senior Mike Galante also placed fifth, at 165. Lehigh's other three place-winners, Seth Ciasulli (141), Robert Hamlin (174) and Joe Kennedy (197) all claimed eighth place.

### WOW, WHAT A COMEBACK!

Lehigh opened 2010 by going 3-1 at the Virginia Duals to place second in the event for the second straight year. The highlight for the Mountain Hawks was a come-from-behind 18-16 win over No. 10 Oklahoma in the semifinals. Lehigh spotted the Sooners a 16-0 lead after 149 before winning the final six bouts, all by decision, beating four ranked wrestlers along the way. Sean Bilodeau started the run, while Mike Galante, Robert Hamlin, David Craig and Joe Kennedy added wins, before Zach Rey completed the comeback with a 3-2 win over Nathan Fernandez at heavyweight.

### RANK AND FILE

In InterMat's rankings, Lehigh has wrestlers ranked in six of ten weight classes. Sophomore Zach Rey leads the way for the Mountain Hawks at No. 5 at 285. Six Mountain Hawks are ranked by W.I.N. Magazine, while eight Lehigh men are ranked by Amateur Wrestling News.
