SETTING THE SCENE

The 14 EIWA member institutions converge on Philadelphia for the 105th EIWA Championships, hosted by Penn at the famed Palestra. The EIWA is the nation's oldest wrestling conference, with Lehigh being the historically dominant team in the conference with 193 individual titles and 34 team championships. The Mountain Hawks are looking to bounce back from a fifth place finish last year and win their first team title since 2006, but Lehigh will have to contend with two-time defending champions Cornell, along with host Penn, Army and Navy among others. Also at stake are 38 automatic berths to the NCAA Championships in St. Louis, Mo.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh has won 34 EIWA team championships, the most of any member school.
- The Mountain Hawks have won at least one individual title in each of the last nine EIWA tournaments.
- Lehigh qualified five wrestlers for the NCAA Championships last year, and has qualified at least five wrestlers in each of the last nine EIWA tournaments.
- Mountain Hawk wrestlers have captured the Sheridan Award for most falls in the quickest time in five of the last six EIWA tournaments: Troy Letters (2003 and '06), Matt Ciasulli ('04), Jon Trenge ('05), and Matt Fisk ('07).

THE 2008 EIWA CHAMPIONSHIPS
MAYSER CENTER - LANCASTER, PA.
MARCH 7-8, 2008

Senior Dave Nakasone captured Lehigh's 193rd individual EIWA title to lead the Mountain Hawks to a fifth place finish at the 104th EIWA Championships on the campus of Franklin & Marshall College. Nakasone scored two third period takedowns to upset top seed and eventual NCAA Champion Jordan Leen of Cornell 5-2 in the finals at 157, leading a contingent of five Mountain Hawks who earned berths to the NCAA Championships. Lehigh finished fifth in the team standings with 67.5 points, 60.5 behind Cornell, which edged Penn by a 128-127.5 margin to capture its second straight team title. Penn's Cesar Grajales was named the tournament's outstanding wrestler.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

GALANTE: GETTING IT DONE

One of the most pleasant surprises for Lehigh this season has been the performance of junior Mike Galante, who is second on the team with 24 wins and is ranked 14th at 165. The sixth place finisher in the EIWA a year ago, Galante posted an 18-3 record in duals, and ranks among the team leaders with four falls.

NO ORDINARY JOE

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who is tied for the team lead with six wins by major decision this season, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Senior Trevor Chinn (**Canandaigua, N.Y.**) and junior Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2008-09 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as two-time NCAA qualifiers and one-time EIWA runner-ups. Fisk also captained the Mountain Hawks last season, while deferring his eligibility.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

The EIWA received 38 automatic bids to the NCAA tournament when the NCAA announced its qualifier allocations last week. In a change from previous seasons, each qualifying tournament was awarded spots per weight class based on current year data including Division I winning percentage, RPI and a coaches ranking. Under the new system, the number of automatic qualifiers varies in each weight class within the EIWA. Wrestlers who fail to qualify this weekend will be eligible for one of 52 at-large berths which will be announced on Wednesday, March 11.
