SETTING THE SCENE

Fresh off its best dual season start in nine years, Lehigh heads to Las Vegas for its first tournament of the season, the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. The Mountain Hawks went 4-0 at the Journeymen/Brute Northeast Duals last weekend, including Lehigh's first ever dual win over Oklahoma State, which helped propel the Mountain Hawks into the top ten nationally for the first time in almost three years. This weekend, the Brown and White will be tested by one of college wrestling's toughest in-season tournaments. This two-day event features nearly 50 teams, including 11 nationally ranked squads.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh is off to its best dual meet start since the 1999-00 season, when the Mountain Hawks also opened with eight consecutive dual wins.
- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 793-379-22, which ranks seventh among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks are ranked in the top ten in the latest NWCA/InterMat polls for the first time since December 2005.
- Lehigh is making its sixth appearance at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Two Lehigh wrestlers have won this tournament (Matt Ruppel - 1989 and Jon Trence - 2001).

**LAST TIME LEHIGH
COMPETED AT THE LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL
NOVEMBER 30 - DECEMBER 1, 2001**

This weekend's trip to Las Vegas marks Lehigh's first appearance at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational since the 2001-02 season. With a school-best six place winners, Lehigh finished third overall in the tournament with a team score of 120.5 points. Jon Trengre became the first Lehigh wrestler in 12 years to win a Las Vegas championship by defeating Central Oklahoma's Mo Lawal 3-2 in the championship bout at 197. Chris Vitale advanced to the finals at 165 but lost 7-6 to West Virginia's Tom McMath, while Mike Pirozzola took third place at 149 defeating Michigan All-America Mike Kulczycki 9-7. Michigan took the team title, with West Virginia finishing second, but by year's end Lehigh surpassed both teams at the NCAA tournament.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

IT'S A CELEBRATION!

The 2008-09 season marks the 100th season of wrestling at Lehigh. One of the nation's most storied wrestling programs; Lehigh holds a unique record of success that has helped the program become the premier program in Eastern college wrestling. Lehigh leads all Eastern schools with 26 individual NCAA Championships won, and ranks ninth nationally with 127 All-American medals won. Lehigh has also been the dominant program within the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association, with a league-best 193 individual EIWA championships and 34 team titles won.

HE'S LOVIN' IT

Freshman John McDonald was named the EIWA Wrestler of the Week on Sunday, after winning all four of his bouts at the Northeast Duals. McDonald's biggest victory was a 4-3 upset of fifth-ranked Obe Blanc of Oklahoma State, which keyed Lehigh's 18-13 upset win over the Cowboys. McDonald added three additional wins on the day to improve to 6-2 on the season.

LEHIGH AT THE CLIFF KEEN LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL

Lehigh will be making its sixth appearance at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational, in this, the 27th year of the tournament. The Mountain Hawks will be making their first appearance at the event since December 2001, when the Brown and White finished third in the team standings and placed wrestlers in six weight classes. Lehigh has crowned a pair of champions in its five prior trips to Las Vegas, Matt Ruppel, who won at 190 in 1981, and Jon Trengue, who won at 197 in 2001. Lehigh's top team finishes in the event were third place showings in 2000 and 2001.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who picked up his first career win at Pittsburgh, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Senior Trevor Chinn (**Canandaigua, N.Y.**) and junior Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2008-09 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as two-time NCAA qualifiers and one-time EIWA runner-ups. Fisk also captained the Mountain Hawks last season, while deferring his eligibility.
