SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh returns home for a busy weekend of action, beginning with the annual Sheridan Dual as No. 9 Michigan visits Stabler Arena for a top 25 showdown on Friday night. The Mountain Hawks improved to 2-0 on the season with a 27-9 victory at Pittsburgh on Saturday and must now contend with a Michigan team that opens its dual season this weekend, but is coming off a seventh-place finish at last year's NCAA Championships. The busy weekend concludes on Sunday, when former Lehigh All-American and assistant coach Chris Ayres returns to Bethlehem with his Princeton Tigers.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh is 2-0 in dual competition for the first time since the 2005-06 season. The Mountain Hawks won their first three duals that season and won five straight to open 2004-05.
- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 787-379-22, which ranks seventh among all Division I wrestling programs.
- Lehigh is wrestling a dual against Michigan for the 32nd straight season, while the Mountain Hawks will face Princeton for the first time since 2003 and just the third time since 1974.

Lehigh wrapped up action at the Wolverine Quad with a 33-9 setback to host Michigan. The seventh-ranked Wolverines won seven bouts including five bonus wins to drop Lehigh to 0-3 at the duals and 4-9 on the season. Michigan picked up three falls including a defensive fall by Josh Churella over Trevor Chinn at 149, plus one technical fall and one major decision. Seth Ciasulli did nab his first dual win of the season, 5-3 over Chris Diehl at 133. Dave Nakasone also won for the Brown and White, downing nationally ranked Jeff Marsh 4-3 at 157. Justin Allen picked up Lehigh's third win in the dual's final bout.

Fifth-ranked Lehigh won its ninth straight dual with a 31-12 victory over Princeton. Freshman Derek Zinck, senior Ted Dufresne and junior Jon Trence all picked up wins by fall for the Mountain Hawks. The back-to-back falls by Zinck and Dufresne helped Lehigh take a 12-9 lead after Princeton won the first three bouts. A win by technical fall from junior Brad Dillon put the Mountain Hawks up 17-9. The Tigers earned their fourth and final win at 184, but Trence's first period pin of Matt Fisher cemented the dual for Lehigh. Joe Sahl and Mario Stuart added wins by major decision as Lehigh improved to 13-3 on the season.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

MICHIGAN HEAD COACH JOE MCFARLAND

Coach McFarland is in his tenth season as head coach of the Wolverines. He has played a major role in molding Michigan wrestling into a national power. Under McFarland's guidance, Michigan has won three Big Ten dual meet titles and placed in the top ten at the NCAA Championships in eight straight seasons. McFarland's wrestlers have won a pair of NCAA titles, 36 All-America medals and 14 Big Ten championships. McFarland is a 1985 graduate of Michigan, where he was a four-time All-America and two time NCAA finalist. His 166 career wins rank third in school annals.

PRINCETON HEAD COACH CHRIS AYRES

Lehigh EIWA Champion and All-American Chris Ayres begins his third season as head coach of the Tigers. Sunday's dual marks a return home for Ayres, who wrestled for the Brown and White from 1995-1999 and coached on Greg Strobel's staff for five seasons, before moving on to Princeton. Ayres won an EIWA title at 150 in 1998 and earned All-American honors with a sixth place finish at 157 in 1999. Ayres wrestled under and then coached alongside Pat Santoro, and succeeded him as Lehigh's Harmon-Rauch Assistant Coach in 2003.

SERIES HISTORIES

Lehigh and Michigan are wrestling in a dual meet for the 32nd straight season. The Wolverines lead the series versus Lehigh 23-11 and have won the last three duals in the series. The Mountain Hawks have not faced Princeton since 2003, but hold a commanding edge in the series. Lehigh has won seven straight versus the Tigers, covering a span of 40 years. Princeton is 0-26 all-time in dual meets at Lehigh.

Lehigh could also face current No. 15 Edinboro, No. 17 Central Michigan, No. 20 Old Dominion and No. 24 Virginia, plus Oklahoma State and Penn at the Virginia Duals.

SCOUTING THE WOLVERINES

Michigan opens its dual season with Friday night's dual against the Mountain Hawks. The Wolverines sent contingents to both the Eastern Michigan and Michigan State Opens earlier this month, but Michigan will officially begin its season with matches against Lehigh on Friday and against Penn on Saturday in Philadelphia. The Wolverines were 16-8 a year ago and finished in a tie for seventh at the NCAA Championships. All-Americans Josh Churella and Eric Tannenbaum have graduated, but Michigan still boasts three top-five talents, led by senior Steve Luke, who is ranked No. 1 at 174. Tyrel Todd has bumped to 197, where he is ranked third and sophomore Kellen Russell is ranked fifth at 141 after an impressive freshman campaign.

RETURNING IN GRAND STYLE

After missing the second half of last season due to academics, junior David Craig has been impressive in his return to the mats, with wins by fall in each of his first two bouts this season. Craig reached the Round of 12 at the NCAA Championships as a true freshman, but was just 6-4 in early season action as a sophomore. Of his 39 career victories, 13 have come by fall, and 21 have earned bonus points.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who picked up his first career win last week at Pittsburgh, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

Like Michigan, Princeton will open its dual season with two matches this weekend. The Tigers will join the Wolverines in Philadelphia, where both teams will face Penn on Saturday, then on Sunday, Princeton will head up to Lehigh as head coach Chris Ayres faces off against his alma mater for the first time. Ayres is still working towards building a strong program at Princeton. The Tigers were 0-18 in duals last year, and are 0-35 in Ayres' first two years. There have been improvements, however, as Princeton did score 10.5 points at last year's EIWA tournament, with current senior Marty Everin (157) and sophomore Tony Comunale (125) leading the way.

REMEMBERING THE GREATS OF THE PAST

This weekend's matches have some extra meaning for the Lehigh wrestling program. The Michigan match has been designated the 2008-09 Sheridan Dual, in honor of Billy Sheridan, Lehigh's legendary wrestling coach, who coached at Lehigh for 41 seasons and helped bring the program into national prominence. Prior to Sunday's dual with Princeton, Lehigh will host a memorial service inside Grace Hall for coach Gerry Leeman, who passed away last month. Leeman succeeded Sheridan with 18 winning seasons as he continued to guide the Lehigh program to unparalleled success. In addition, as part of the 100th season celebration, Lehigh is welcoming back all former wrestlers and coaches for a pre-match social and alumni parade.

HISTORY OF THE SHERIDAN DUAL

Tonight's dual marks the fifth consecutive season that Lehigh's legendary former coach, Billy Sheridan, is honored with a single dual meet against a major out-of-conference opponent. From 2000-2003 Lehigh hosted the Sheridan Duals, a series of duals in which the Mountain Hawks faced three opponents on the first or second Saturday in December at Stabler Arena. Before that, Lehigh hosted the Sheridan Tournament, which began in 1979. Here's a history of the Sheridan since moving to the dual format:
