SETTING THE SCENE

No. 11 Lehigh returns to action after a one-month layoff at the prestigious Midlands Championships, hosted by Northwestern. The Mountain Hawks have been off since going 2-1 at the Journeymen/Asics Northeast Duals Thanksgiving weekend. Lehigh brings a contingent of 12 wrestlers to one of the nation's premier in-season tournaments, led by third-ranked heavyweight Zach Rey. Five Mountain Hawks are ranked in the latest InterMat poll, with seniors Seth Ciasulli and David Craig both having a good chance to join Rey as top-8 seeds.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 814-382-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks are making their first Midlands appearance since December 2004, and their first full-squad Midlands appearance since 2002.
- Two Lehigh wrestlers have won a total of three undergraduate Midlands titles: Darryl Burley (1981) and Jon Trence (2002 and 2004)
- Ranked No. 3 at heavyweight, sophomore Zach Rey is Lehigh's highest ranked individual since Cory Cooperman (141) and Troy Letters (165) were ranked third late in the 2006 season.

**LAST TIME LEHIGH
COMPETED AT THE MIDLANDS CHAMPIONSHIPS
DECEMBER 29-30, 2004**

Senior Jon Trence became the first Lehigh wrestler to win two undergraduate Midlands Championships, defeating Ohio State's J.D. Bergman 6-4 in the finals to claim the title at 197 at the 42nd Midlands. Trence went 5-0 in the two-day tournament to earn his second title leading a contingent of six Mountain Hawks who competed in the tournament. Despite not fielding a full team, three of the six Lehigh entrants did place at the prestigious event. Sophomore Matt Ciasulli took third at 133 while sophomore Paul Weibel became Lehigh's first heavyweight place-winner at the Midlands, taking eighth. Also representing the Brown and White were Andrew Rizzi (125), Brian LaMay (165) and Dave Helfrich (184).

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

ABOUT THE MIDLANDS...

The Midlands is a national invitational/open event for outstanding college teams, clubs and individuals. It is one of the premier wrestling events in the nation, annually drawing 350 of the country's best wrestlers. The Midlands is in its 47th year, with Lehigh sending a contingent of wrestlers to Evanston for the first time since 2004, and a full squad for the first time since 2002. Over 30 colleges will send wrestlers to this year's Midlands. The top ten teams from last year all return, including defending champion Iowa and top five teams Iowa State, Missouri, Wisconsin and host Northwestern.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years.

LEHIGH AT THE MIDLANDS

The Mountain Hawks are making their first trip to the Midlands since 2004 and their first full-squad entry since 2002. It is believed to be the 29th time in 47 tournaments that Lehigh will have at least one wrestler entered in the Midlands. Lehigh undergraduates have won three Midlands titles, with Jon Trengre capturing titles in 2002 and 2004 and Darryl Burley winning as an undergrad in 1981. Burley was also a three-time finalist. Tihamer Toth-Fejel '76 was a five-time Midlands placer as a post-graduate competitor and also won a Midlands title. Here's a look at Lehigh entries at the Midlands throughout the years with information compiled by Lehigh wrestling historian Denny Diehl '70.

COMING UP NEXT

The Mountain Hawks will return to action at the 30th annual Virginia Duals, January 8-9 in Hampton, Va. Last year Lehigh went 3-1 at the duals, reaching the finals, before suffering its only dual loss of the season in against Central Michigan. The Mountain Hawks will be one of eight ranked teams in the field, for the tournament which begins January 8.

MATT ON A MISSION

Co-captain Matt Fisk is off to a strong start to his senior season. Fisk has wrestled eight bouts and has come away with six wins including three bonus victories: a pin, a technical fall and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 16th at his weight class by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and recently became just the sixth three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 73-33 career overall mark with 39 bonus wins and a 47-16 career dual meet record.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals last month, dropping a pair of matches. He owns a 12-6 overall record and has placed third at both the Clarion and Nittany Lion Opens this season.

HAMLIN HAS MAJOR IMPACT

Freshman Robert Hamlin won the starting spot at 174 and has shined early this season with wins in his first five varsity duals and a 5-2 overall record. Hamlin was Lehigh's Deferred Wrestler of the Year last season, after going 30-5 and placing in the top three in five open tournaments. Hamlin has entered the national rankings coming in at No. 18 at 174.

ZACH ATTACK

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's best wrestler through the first part of the season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year has opened this season with 13 straight victories to climb to No. 3 in the latest polls. Rey is a perfect 8-0 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh regular without a loss this season.

THE RETURNING CHAMPS

The Mountain Hawks boast two wrestlers who claimed major tournament titles last season. Seniors Seth Ciasulli (141) and David Craig (184) both captured EIWA championships last season to lead Lehigh to a second place team finish. Both men are off to strong starts this year as Craig is 7-1 and ranked 11th at 184, while Ciasulli is 5-3 and ranked 15th at 141. Craig owns 71 career victories while Ciasulli is not far behind with 69.

TOURNAMENT TESTED

While the Midlands Championships will mark the first time this season Lehigh's starting lineup will compete in a tournament setting, the Mountain Hawks have had wrestlers compete in five open tournaments this year. Lehigh wrestlers have earned a total of 17 places in open tournaments this season. The Mountain Hawks most recent action came at the Nittany Lion Open on December 6. Nineteen Lehigh wrestlers entered the tournament, including several starters. Sophomore Zach Rey claimed Lehigh's second open tournament title with a win at heavyweight, with Mike Galante, Alex Caruso, Joey Napoli and Brian Tanen all placing as well. All five men have seen action in duals for Lehigh this season. Caruso also owns an open title this year, as he won the East Stroudsburg Open in November.
