SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh takes to the road for the final time during the regular season, as the Mountain Hawks visit one of their oldest rivals, the Navy Midshipmen. The Mountain Hawks have enjoyed a record-setting start to this season, winning their first 15 duals before falling 21-12 to Central Michigan in the finals of the Virginia Duals last weekend. Navy was also at the Virginia Duals last weekend, as the Midshipmen captured seventh place at the tournament winning three duals and beating two ranked opponents in the process. Lehigh and Navy are meeting for the 89th time tonight, as the Brown and White have only wrestled against Penn State more often than they have the Midshipmen.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh and Navy are wrestling in a dual meet for the 58th consecutive year, the second longest active streak for Lehigh (Penn State - 76).
- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 800-380-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks won their first 15 duals this season, marking the best start in program history.

Lehigh picked up its first win versus a ranked opponent in 2008 with a 22-19 triumph over Navy inside Grace Hall. The two teams earned a 5-5 split of ten bouts, but a second period fall from sophomore Seth Ciasulli over Joe Baker gave the Mountain Hawks a late six point advantage that they would not relinquish. Ciasulli's fall was the second of the dual for Lehigh as Alex Iacocca picked up his first fall of the season with a second period pin of Matt Parsons at 197. Trevor Chinn and Dave Nakasone led Lehigh to an early 6-0 lead with back-to-back wins by decision to open the dual. Lehigh also benefitted from Navy All-America Matt Stolpinski being out as Alex Caruso majored Jason Coyne 10-2.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

NAVY HEAD COACH BRUCE BURNETT

Coach Burnett is in his ninth season leading the Midshipmen. Burnett has led Navy to 10-win dual campaigns in six of the last seven seasons and back-to-back 18th place finishes at the NCAA Championships. Last season, Burnett guided three mids, Joe Baker, Matt Stolpinski and Ed Prendergast to All-American honors and has led five Navy wrestlers to a total of seven All-American medals in his first eight seasons. Burnett has also coached three two-time EIWA Champions in Stolpinski, Prendergast and Mark Conley. Prior to coming to Navy, Burnett was the U.S. national freestyle coach, guiding five wrestlers to medals in the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

IN FRONT BY A CHINN

The lone senior in Lehigh's starting lineup, Trevor Chinn has been making the most of his final season in the Brown and White. Chinn won his first 11 bouts to start the season and leads the Mountain Hawks with a 19-5 record. The senior co-captain is Lehigh's highest ranked grappler in the national polls, at No. 14 at 149. A two-time NCAA qualifier, Chinn boasts a 80-42 career record, including a 45-22 mark in duals.

SCOUTING THE MIDSHIPMEN

Navy carries a 5-3 overall record and 2-0 mark in EIWA duals into this weekend. The Midshipmen will host American on Friday night before the Mountain Hawks visit on Saturday. Like Lehigh, Navy spent last weekend at the Virginia Duals, where the Mids racked up a 3-2 record en route to a seventh place team finish. Navy upset Virginia in the opening round and added wins over EIWA foes Bucknell and Penn along the way. After opening the season with three duals in California, Navy moved onto the tournament circuit, where the Midshipmen won their own Navy Classic then placed fifth at the Reno Tournament of Champions and sixth at the Southern Scuffle. Individually, the Mids have four wrestlers ranked in the latest InterMat rankings, but Navy has been hit hard by the injury bug in recent weeks. Eighth-ranked heavyweight Scott Steele, and senior All-American Joe Baker, ranked tenth at 133, missed the Virginia Duals because of injury. The top-ranked Navy grappler is sophomore Bryce Sadoris, who is ranked fifth at 149. Freshman Luke Robertus comes in at No. 19 at 174.

NO ORDINARY JOE

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who leads the Brown and White with six wins by major decision this season, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

VEGAS BABY, VEGAS

Last month, Lehigh enjoyed its first tournament action of the season, competing at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Senior Trevor Chinn went 6-2 en route to fifth place at 149, leading a group of three Mountain Hawks who placed in the event. Freshman Joe Kennedy placed sixth at 197, while junior Mike Galante took seventh at 165. As a team, Lehigh finished in 16th place with 54.5 points, despite having just eight wrestlers compete in the tournament. The eight Lehigh wrestlers totaled a 26-16 record with 10 bonus wins. Nebraska captured the team title, followed by Cornell and Minnesota.

ANYONE, ANYTIME, ANYWHERE

The Mountain Hawks will once again face one of the nation's toughest dual meet schedules. The Mountain Hawks are currently 6-1 against ranked teams this season, winning six straight duals versus ranked foes before bowing to Central Michigan in the finals of the Virginia Duals.
