SETTING THE SCENE

No. 12 Lehigh returns from the Thanksgiving holiday with three tough matches at the Journeymen/Asics Northeast Duals. The Mountain Hawks went 1-1 on their road trip to Big Ten country last weekend, falling to Ohio State 22-12 before downing Michigan by a 21-9 score to improve to 4-1 on the dual season. Lehigh will open the day against ACC member North Carolina, before squaring off against a pair of top-ten ranked foes in No. 7 Nebraska and No. 6 Maryland in the Mountain Hawks' last dual action of 2009.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 812-381-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks are 27-2 in dual meets in one-plus seasons under head coach Pat Santoro.
- Lehigh owns a 6-2 all-time record at the Northeast Duals. The Mountain Hawks lost to Virginia and Central Michigan here in 2007, but have rolled off six straight wins at the event, including wins over Binghamton and Clarion in 2007, and wins over Oklahoma State, UNC Greensboro, Binghamton and Appalachian State last year.

SCOUTING THE TAR HEELS

North Carolina carries a 2-1 record into the Northeast Duals, where the Tar Heels will wrestle three duals, starting with Lehigh Saturday morning. The Tar Heels opened their dual season by hosting the ACC Challenge on November 15. North Carolina picked up wins over Gardner-Webb and American and fell to Bucknell by a 19-14 score. The Tar Heels boast three ranked wrestlers in junior Nick Stabile (No. 11 at 141), junior Thomas Scotton (No. 14 at 157) and senior Dennis Drury (No. 11 at 197). Former Lehigh captain Trevor Chinn '09 is in his first season as an assistant coach on the Tar Heels staff.

SCOUTING THE CORNHUSKERS

Nebraska enters the Northeast Duals at 1-0 on the dual season. The Cornhuskers opened up dual competition with a 26-17 win over Wisconsin on November 15. Last weekend, three Cornhusker wrestlers won titles at the Kaufman-Brand Open in Omaha, Nebraska, while seniors Jordan Burroughs and Stephen Dwyer competed at the NWCA All-Star Classic in Fullerton, California. Nebraska has four nationally ranked wrestlers, all four of whom are ranked in the top ten. Burroughs is the defending national champion at 157 and is ranked first. Dwyer is ranked fifth at 174, while Craig Brester is ranked second at 197 and Tucker Lane is ranked seventh at heavyweight. Nebraska will also face Binghamton, Hofstra and Appalachian State on Saturday afternoon.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS

Maryland brings a 3-0 dual record into the Northeast Duals. The Terrapins opened their dual season with wins over Drexel and York (Pa.) before spending last weekend in Ithaca, N.Y., where they edged Cornell 18-17 in a dual and then placed second at the Body Bar Invitational. Former Lehigh assistant coach Kerry McCoy is in his second season as head coach as he replaced Pat Santoro, who spent five seasons at Maryland before returning home to coach Lehigh. The Terrapins boast four ranked wrestlers, all of whom are ranked in the top ten. Hudson Taylor is the top-ranked Terp, coming in at No. 3 at 197, while Mike Letts is ranked fourth at 174. Steve Bell (133) and Alex Krom (141) are both ranked seventh at their weight classes, and both competed at the NWCA All-Star Classic on Sunday. Maryland will face Central Michigan and Northern Colorado in addition to Lehigh.

MATT ON A MISSION

Senior co-captain Matt Fisk is off to a strong start to his senior season. Fisk has wrestled five bouts and has come away with four wins including three bonus victories: a pin, a technical fall and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 12th at his weight class by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and recently became just the sixth three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 71-32 career overall mark with 39 bonus wins and a 45-15 career dual meet record.

RANK AND FILE

In InterMat's rankings, Lehigh has wrestlers ranked in five of ten weight classes. Sophomore Zach Rey leads the way for the Mountain Hawks at No. 6 at 285. Senior Mike Galante fell out of InterMat's latest rankings, but remains ranked by W.I.N. Magazine and Amateur Wrestling News. Junior Alex Caruso is ranked by W.I.N. Magazine only.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

HAMLIN HAS MAJOR IMPACT

Freshman Robert Hamlin won the starting spot at 174 and has shined early this season with wins in his first five varsity duals. Hamlin was Lehigh's Deferred Wrestler of the Year last season, after going 30-5 and placing in the top three in five open tournaments. At 5-0 Hamlin joins sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey as the only Mountain Hawks to enter the weekend undefeated in dual competition this season.

NORTHEAST DUALS OVERVIEW

Lehigh is making its third trip in as many years to the Northeast Duals, which is now in its fourth year of existence overall. The Mountain Hawks went 4-0 last year, with wins over Oklahoma State, UNC-Greensboro, Binghamton and Appalachian State. Lehigh is now 6-2 all-time at the Northeast Duals.
