SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh returns from the Thanksgiving holiday with four big matches at the Journeyman/Brute Northeast Duals. The Mountain Hawks improved to 4-0 on the dual season with a 20-12 upset of No. 9 Michigan in the Sheridan Dual at Stabler Arena on Friday, and then followed with a 41-3 drubbing of Princeton on Sunday. If the Mountain Hawks hope to move to 5-0 in duals for the first time in four years, Lehigh will need to knock-off national power Oklahoma State for the first time in school history. Lehigh will open up a long day of wrestling against the seventh-ranked Cowboys, and will also face UNC Greensboro, Binghamton and Appalachian State on the day.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh is off to its best dual meet start since the 2004-05 season, when the Mountain Hawks opened with five consecutive dual wins.
- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 789-379-22, which ranks seventh among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks will be looking for their first-ever win over Oklahoma State (0-8) and their third win over a ranked opponent this season.
- Lehigh has never faced Southern Conference members UNC Greensboro and Appalachian State.

Lehigh faced its toughest early season test and top-ranked Oklahoma State showed why it is the defending three-time national champions, winning eight of ten bouts over the Mountain Hawks at historic Gallagher-Iba Arena. Senior Cory Cooperman was one of two winners for Lehigh on this night, earning a 5-1 decision over Daniel Frishkorn. David Helfrich was the Mountain Hawks other winner, as he defeated Rusty Blackmon 5-3 at 184. Lehigh had several close losses that cost the Mountain Hawks the dual. Jeff Santo fell to eventual All-American Nathan Morgan by a point. Paul Weibel had success against Jake Rosholt, but couldn't overcome an early five point move in an 8-7 defeat.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

After four straight losses to start the dual season, Lehigh downed Binghamton in its third match of the day at the Northeast Duals. The Mountain Hawks bounced back from a shutout loss to Central Michigan by winning seven bouts and earning bonus points in six of seven victories. Lehigh picked up three wins by fall as Kevin Vinh gave the Mountain Hawks the lead with a first period pin at 133 and later Alex Caruso and David Craig helped cement the dual with consecutive falls at 174 and 184. Trevor Chinn and Mike Galante added wins by major decision for the Brown and White, while Dave Nakasone beat Nate Patterson at 157.

SERIES HISTORIES

Lehigh could also face current No. 15 Edinboro, No. 17 Central Michigan, No. 20 Old Dominion and No. 24 Virginia, plus Oklahoma State and Penn at the Virginia Duals.

SCOUTING THE COWBOYS

With 34 NCAA team titles, 133 individual national champions and 422 All-Americans, Oklahoma State lays claim to the title of most successful program in the history of college wrestling. The Cowboys recently won four straight NCAA titles from 2003-2006 and are coming off a fifth-place finish at last year's NCAA championships. Head coach John Smith's team features six nationally ranked wrestlers, led by junior Jared Rosholt, who is ranked No. 1 in the nation at 285. Lock Haven transfer Obe Blanc is ranked in the top 10 at 125, while senior Brandon Mason has moved down a weight to 165, where he is currently ranked tenth. Oklahoma State opened its dual season with a 30-9 win over Old Dominion last weekend in Stillwater, Okla.

SCOUTING THE SPARTANS

UNC Greensboro opens its dual season with four matches at the Northeast Duals this weekend. Coach Jason Loukides' team was 9-9 in duals last season and tied for 41st at last year's NCAA Championships. UNC Greensboro was picked second in the Southern Conference preseason poll and has competed at the NC State and Virginia Tech Opens as well as the Navy Classic. Freshman Chris Bullins is the Spartans lone ranked wrestler, coming in at No. 19 at 165. UNCG is also lead by senior Chris Bencivenga, a NCAA qualifier at 141, and by Byron Sigmon, who won a SoCon title at 165 last season and has since moved up to 174.

RETURNING IN GRAND STYLE

After missing the second half of last season due to academics, junior David Craig has been impressive in his return to the mats, with four wins including two falls in four bouts this season. Craig reached the Round of 12 at the NCAA Championships as a true freshman, but was just 6-4 in early season action as a sophomore. Of his 41 career victories, 13 have come by fall, and 22 have earned bonus points.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who picked up his first career win at Pittsburgh, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

SCOUTING THE BEARCATS

Colonial Athletic Association member Binghamton brings a 2-2 record into the Northeast Duals. The Bearcats hosted the Journeyman/Brute Sprawl and Brawl last weekend, defeating Wagner and American International, while falling to North Carolina and Penn State. Head coach Pat Popolizio led the Bearcats to 13 dual wins a season ago. The Bearcats' top individual is junior Josh Patterson, who is ranked 17th at 184 and is coming off an impressive win over Penn State's nationally ranked Phil Bomberger last weekend, a win which upped Patterson's season record to 8-1.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS

Lehigh will wrap-up the Northeast Duals against Appalachian State, the Mountain Hawks second Southern Conference opponent of the day. The Mountaineers are 2-1 on the dual season, with wins over Spartanburg Methodist and Gardner-Webb and a home loss to Buffalo. Last weekend, Appalachian State competed at the Keystone Classic, hosted by Penn. Sophomore Austin Trotman led the Mountaineers with a second place finish at 174 as Appalachian State finished sixth of ten teams overall. Trotman is the Mountaineers lone ranked wrestler, coming in at No. 20 at 174. Appalachian State was 14-7 a year ago and finished 38th at the NCAA Championships.

RANK AND FILE

In InterMat's latest rankings, Lehigh has wrestlers ranked in five of ten weight classes. With a 2-0 start, junior Mike Galante is a new addition to the rankings, at No. 17 at 165.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Senior Trevor Chinn (**Canandaigua, N.Y.**) and junior Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2008-09 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as two-time NCAA qualifiers and one-time EIWA runner-ups. Fisk also captained the Mountain Hawks last season, while deferring his eligibility.

JOURNEYMEN/BRUTE NORTHEAST DUALS OVERVIEW

Lehigh is making its second trip in as many years to the Northeast Duals, which is now in its third year of existence overall. The Mountain Hawks went 2-2 last year, with wins over Binghamton and Clarion and losses to Virginia and Central Michigan. Seventeen teams have come to Troy, N.Y. for this year's edition of the duals, including defending national champion Iowa, Oklahoma State and Missouri.

THE LAST MEN STANDING

Three Mountain Hawk wrestlers have survived Lehigh's first four duals without suffering a loss this season: Trevor Chinn, Mike Galante and David Craig. Chinn, Lehigh's lone senior starter, has two major decisions among his four wins, and is ranked 14th nationally by InterMat at 149. Craig's early season success with two falls and a major decision have bumped him to No. 15 at 184. Galante has been one of the most pleasant surprises so far this season for Lehigh, with two wins over ranked wrestlers. The New Jersey native and Blair Academy product placed sixth in the EIWA last season and is hoping to qualify for his first NCAA tournament. He is currently ranked No. 17 at 165.

IT'S A CELEBRATION!

The 2008-09 season marks the 100th season of wrestling at Lehigh. One of the nation's most storied wrestling programs; Lehigh holds a unique record of success that has helped the program become the premier program in Eastern college wrestling. Lehigh leads all Eastern schools with 26 individual NCAA Championships won, and ranks ninth nationally with 127 All-American medals won. Lehigh has also been the dominant program within the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association, with a league-best 193 individual EIWA championships and 34 team titles won.
