#### SETTING THE SCENE

No. 17 Lehigh will face two of its oldest in-state rivals this weekend as the Mountain Hawks welcome No. 15 Penn State to Stabler Arena on Friday and Pittsburgh to Grace Hall on Sunday. The Mountain Hawks won nine-of-ten bouts on their way to a convincing 31-3 win over Rider in the dual season opener on Sunday. On Friday, Lehigh welcomes Penn State and new head coach Cael Sanderson in the 98th all-time meeting between the rivals, while on Sunday, Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro will square off against his alma mater, and his mentor, Rande Stottlemeyer.

#### FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 809-380-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- Lehigh has wrestled Penn State more often than any other school in its history, with Friday's dual serving as the 98th all-time meeting between the rivals.
- Mountain Hawks' head coach Pat Santoro won two national championships and is Pittsburgh's only four-time All-America. Santoro wrestled for current Panthers head coach Rande Stottlemeyer.

In a dual that came down to the final bout, Mike Galante earned a 9-5 decision over Mark Friend to lead No. 9 Lehigh to a 17-16 victory over No. 16 Penn State at Rec Hall. The Mountain Hawks trailed by two after nine bouts, but Galante racked up four takedowns in the victory, which improved the Brown and White to 12-0 on the season. Bonus points keyed the Lehigh effort as the teams split ten bouts, but David Craig won a 12-2 major decision over Jack Decker at 184 and Joe Kennedy won 15-3 over Clay Steadman at 197. Zach Rey capped an early run with a win at 285 and Seth Ciasulli earned a hard-fought 3-2 decision over Frank Molinaro at 141.

Sean Bilodeau pinned Adam Counterman 2:27 into the first period, keying a six-bout Lehigh run as the Mountain Hawks moved to 2-0 with a 27-9 victory at the Petersen Events Center. David Craig added his second pin in as many bouts as Lehigh won seven bouts on the evening to spoil the Panthers' dual meet opener. Bilodeau's fall broke a 6-6 deadlock and gave the Mountain Hawks a 12-6 lead at the halfway point. Trevor Chinn defeated Mark Powell 3-2 at 149 kicking off the six-bout run, with Mike Galante, Alex Caruso and Joe Kennedy chipping in wins by decision, to go with the pins by Bilodeau and Craig.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO**

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

**PENN STATE HEAD COACH CAEL SANDERSON**

Coach Sanderson enters his first season as head coach of the Nittany Lions after spending the previous three seasons as head coach at his alma mater, Iowa State. Sanderson guided the Cyclones to a 44-10 dual meet record in three seasons, while leading Iowa State to three Big XII titles and three top-five finishes at the NCAA Tournament. He qualified 10 wrestlers for Nationals in each of his three seasons and mentored 15 All-Americans and a pair of national champions. Sanderson is regarded as one of the greatest college wrestlers of all-time, with a 159-0 career record and four NCAA Championships from 1999-2002. He also won an Olympic Gold Medal at 84kg (185 lbs.) in 2004.

**PITTSBURGH HEAD COACH RANDE STOTTEMYER**

Coach Stottlemyer is in his 31st season at Pittsburgh, where he has mentored among others Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro. Stottlemyer has coached 28 NCAA All-Americans, 124 national qualifiers and 34 Eastern Wrestling League Champions. His 251 dual wins are the most in school history. Last season, Stottlemyer guided the Panthers to a 38th place finish at the NCAA Championships. Stottlemyer, a three-time All-American at Pitt, has a Lehigh connection as well. His daughter Tara is a 2007 Lehigh graduate who earned All-Patriot League honors on the soccer field for the Brown and White.

**SERIES HISTORIES**

This weekend, Lehigh will face its two most-often wrestled in-state rivals in Penn State and Pittsburgh. Lehigh has wrestled Penn State more often than any other school in history, with Friday’s dual marking the 98th meeting in the series. The Mountain Hawks snapped a four dual Penn State winning streak with their win last season. Lehigh and Pittsburgh meet for the 55th time on Sunday, with the Mountain Hawks winning 11 of the last 12 duals in the series.

Lehigh could also face current No. 5 Oklahoma State, No. 13 Edinboro, No. 16 Oklahoma, No. 18 Kent State, No. 20 Virginia and No. 22 Old Dominion plus Penn State, Michigan and Virginia Tech at the Virginia Duals.

**SCOUTING NITTANY LIONS**

Penn State opens its dual season with Friday night's dual against the Mountain Hawks. American wrestling legend Cael Sanderson takes over a Penn State program that was 8-12-2 in duals last season before crowning two All-Americans en route to a 17th place finish at the NCAA Championships. The Nittany Lions feature five ranked wrestlers including four men ranked in the top ten. Cyler Sanderson followed his brother to Penn State and is the highest-ranked Nittany Lion at No. 5 at 157. Returning All-American Frank Molinaro is ranked sixth at 141, but will compete at 149 while he works his weight down. Returning All-American Quentin Wright is expected to defer his eligibility this season, along with a highly ranked Penn State true freshman class.

**THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP**

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years.

**SCOUTING THE PANTHERS**

Pittsburgh opens its dual season on Friday with matches against Sacred Heart and Drexel in Philadelphia, before taking on the Mountain Hawks on Sunday. The Panthers unofficially opened their season on Nov. 1 by placing 14 wrestlers at the UB Open in Buffalo, N.Y. Dane Johnson (141), Matt Wilps (197) and Ryan Tomei (285) each picked up titles for Pittsburgh, which was 4-7-1 in duals last season. The Panthers feature a pair of nationally ranked wrestlers, in senior Jimmy Conroy, who is 14th at 133 and sophomore Tyler Nauman, who ranks 13th at 141. At heavyweight, Tomei steps into the starting lineup for graduated All-American Zach Sheaffer, who edged Lehigh's Zach Rey in the tiebreakers in the Round of 12 at last year's NCAA Championships.

## LAST TIME OUT

Bolstered by bonus point victories at the first three weights, No. 19 Lehigh opened its dual season with a convincing 31-3 win over Rider Sunday afternoon inside Leeman-Turner Arena at Grace Hall. Senior Matt Fisk won by technical fall at 133 while sophomore John McDonald (125) and senior Seth Ciasulli (141) each won by major decision as Lehigh built a 13-0 lead and went on to win nine of ten bouts on the day as the Mountain Hawks won their second straight season opener. Rider picked up its lone win at 149 as Michael Kessler edged Brian Tanen, but from there Lehigh won the final six bouts by decision to coast to the victory.

## LEHIGH-PENN STATE CONNECTIONS

There are several interesting connections between the Lehigh and Penn State programs heading into Friday's dual meet. Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro was a graduate assistant coach at Penn State from 1991-93. Lehigh assistant coach John Hughes was a three-time All-America and 1994 NCAA Champion for Penn State before serving as an assistant coach for the Nittany Lions from 2003-08. On the Penn State side, assistant coach Troy Letters is Lehigh's most recent national champion after capturing the 165 lb. title in 2004. Letters, a three-time All-America for the Brown and White, graduated from Lehigh in 2006.

## LEHIGH-PITTSBURGH CONNECTIONS

Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro wrestled for the Panthers from 1985-1989, under the guidance of head coach Rande Stottlemeyer. Pittsburgh's only four-time All-American, Santoro amassed a 167-13 record in four seasons for the Panthers, and won national championships at 142 in 1988 and 1989. A three-time EWL Champion, Santoro is also the Panthers' career leader with 43 falls and posted an incredible 97-3 record over his final two seasons. Pittsburgh's most recent national champion, Keith Gavin, captured the 174 lb. title in 2008. Gavin is currently training in freestyle for the Lehigh Valley Athletic Club, which is coached by Lehigh volunteer assistant Jason Kutz.

## BATTLE TESTED BUNCH

With eight returning starters, the Mountain Hawks enter the dual season with plenty of experience. Lehigh's senior quartet of Matt Fisk, Seth Ciasulli, Mike Galante and David Craig have all been four-year starters for the Brown and White, while Lehigh's four sophomore starters, John McDonald, Sean Bilodeau, Joe Kennedy and Zach Rey all started as freshmen. All eight wrestled in the duals against Penn State and Pittsburgh last year. The group of eight combined to go 5-3 against both Pittsburgh and Penn State in last year's meetings.

## HAMLIN ENJOYS STRONG DEBUT

Freshman Robert Hamlin made his varsity dual debut with an 8-2 decision over Rider's Mike Ward in Sunday's win over Rider. Hamlin tilted Ward for a two point near fall in the second period and added an escape, two takedowns and riding time to earn the victory at 174. Hamlin won Lehigh's first Deferred Wrestler of the Year Award at last year's season-ending Lewis Dinner. The Vermont native was 30-5 competing unattached last season and placed in the top three at five different open tournaments, including a first place finish and Outstanding Wrestler Award at the Wilkes Open in December and the title at the Shorty Hitchcock Memorial Open in January.
