SETTING THE SCENE

The final weekend of the dual meet season brings two tough conference duals for the seventh-ranked Mountain Hawks. Lehigh will host one of the nation's hottest teams, No. 22 Rutgers, Saturday at Stabler Arena in the make-up of the February 6 dual that was postponed because of snow. On Sunday, Lehigh will wrap-up the dual season against Penn at the famed Palestra. The Mountain Hawks are 8-1-1 since January 1 and are coming off a pair of convincing wins over Brown and Harvard on the road last weekend. Lehigh will look to end the dual season on a strong note and improve its individual seeding for the upcoming EIWA Championships.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 822-383-23, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- Rutgers is riding a school-record 14 dual unbeaten streak.
- The Mountain Hawks are unbeaten in their last 13 EIWA duals, and are 52-5-1 against EIWA foes since the start of the 2002-03 season. Penn is the only EIWA team to beat Lehigh twice during that span.
- A total of eight Lehigh wrestlers are ranked in the top 20 nationally by either InterMat, W.I.N. Magazine or Amateur Wrestling News.

In its first action in two weeks, Lehigh won eight of ten bouts in a convincing win over Rutgers at the College Avenue Gym. The Mountain Hawks received bonus wins from Matt Fisk, Trevor Chinn and Joe Kennedy as they moved to 9-0 and picked up their second dual win over an EIWA foe. After dropping the opening bout at 125, Fisk gave Lehigh a lead it would not relinquish, with a 10-2 major decision over Brian Bollette at 133. Chinn handed David Seidenberg a loss by major decision 11-3 at 149, while Kennedy impressed in a 12-1 major over Karim Mahmoud at 197. Rutgers' lone wins came at 125 and 157.

Lehigh set a new school record for dual victories in a season with its win over Penn. The dual was tied at 12 after seven bouts before the Mountain Hawks captured the final three matches as David Craig and Joe Kennedy picked up wins by decision and Zach Rey ended the dual with a first period pin of Trey McLean. The Mountain Hawks finished the dual season at 23-1, including a 9-0 record against EIWA opponents. Matt Fisk, Seth Ciasulli and Trevor Chinn all won narrow decisions early on for Lehigh and Mike Galante added an 8-3 win at 165. Craig's 7-2 win over Colin Hitschler put the Mountain Hawks ahead for good.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In one-plus seasons he holds a 37-4-1 dual record. Last season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers brings one of its strongest teams in recent memory into Stabler Arena. The Scarlet Knights are 18-4-1 in duals and are currently riding a school-record 14-dual unbeaten streak. Last weekend Rutgers defeated Liberty and American on the road with the two victories moving the Scarlet Knights up one spot to No. 22 in the latest rankings. Rutgers has eight wrestlers in the latest NWCA Coaches Panel rankings, led by heavyweight Dominick Russo, who comes in at No. 10. In the latest AWN rankings only Russo and Darryl Coccozzo (No. 20 at 157) are ranked in the top 20. Lehigh and Rutgers wrestlers crossed paths at the Midlands with Zach Rey defeating Russo 7-2 in the quarterfinals, and Rutgers' Trevor Melde upsetting Seth Ciasulli in the Round of 16. The Scarlet Knights will have several familiar faces on their bench as John Leonardis (Lehigh '97) and Cory Cooperman (Lehigh '06) serve on the staff of third-year head coach Scott Goodale. Rutgers will face Drexel on Thursday before visiting Lehigh on Saturday.

MATT ON A MISSION

Co-captain Matt Fisk has enjoyed a strong senior season. Fisk has wrestled 21 bouts and has come away with 16 wins including eight bonus victories: four pins, two technical falls and two major decisions. Fisk is ranked 13th at 133 by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and is just the seventh three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 83-36 career overall mark with 44 bonus wins and a 52-17 career dual meet record.

SCOUTING THE QUAKERS

Penn enters the final weekend of the regular season at 9-5 overall and 3-1 within the EIWA. The Quakers split a pair of home duals last weekend, losing 31-3 to Cornell on Saturday before rallying to knock off Columbia 22-13 on Sunday. Penn will travel to Princeton on Saturday before hosting the Mountain Hawks on Sunday. The Quakers have won five of their last six duals. Rob Eiter is in his second season as head coach of the Quakers and currently has seven men ranked in the NWCA Coaches Panel rankings, led by senior Cesar Grajales, who is ranked 11th at 149. Penn has three men ranked in the top 20 by Amateur Wrestling News: Grajales (No. 18 at 149), junior Scott Giffin (No. 12 at 174) and freshman Micah Burak (No. 20 at 197). Among probable starters from both Penn and Lehigh only the match between Matt Fisk and Bryan Ortenzio at 133 and one between Sean Bilodeau and Matt Dragon at 157 would be rematches from last year. Dragon did not compete for Penn in the two meets last weekend.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years

COMING UP NEXT

The Mountain Hawks will host the 106th EIWA Championships at Stabler Arena, March 6-7. Lehigh is hosting for the first time since 2006 which is the year of its last team title. The Mountain Hawks will try to prevent Cornell from winning its fourth straight team championship.

RANK AND FILE

The NWCA released its second set of Coaches Panel rankings on Friday, February 12. The Mountain Hawks have eight men ranked in the top-33 of those rankings, which play a role in determining automatic qualifier spots for the NCAA Championships. Sophomore Zach Rey is the highest rated Mountain Hawk, coming in at No. 6 at 285. Lehigh has seven men ranked by InterMat and Amateur Wrestling News and five men ranked by W.I.N. Magazine.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals in November. He owns a 19-10 overall record and enters this weekend's action having won six of his last seven dual matches.

LET'S GO JOE!

After starting the season 2-6, sophomore Joe Kennedy has bounced back, winning 12 of his last 16 bouts. More than half of Kennedy's bouts have come against wrestlers currently ranked in the InterMat top 20, including nine matches with men ranked in the top 10. Kennedy already owned wins over sixth-ranked Eric Lapotsky of Oklahoma and eighth-ranked Trevor Brandvold of Wisconsin. The Milford, Pa. native then added a 5-4, two-tiebreaker win over No. 5 Cam Simaz of Cornell in Lehigh's 15-15 tie with the Big Red on January 22. Kennedy went 20-12 as a true freshman last season before defaulting out of the EIWA Championships with an injury.

ZACH ATTACK

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's most successful wrestler this season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year opened this season with 16 straight victories before falling in the Midlands semifinals. Rey is 14-2 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open in December, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh wrestler ranked in the top ten nationally.

THE RETURNING CHAMPS

The Mountain Hawks boast two wrestlers who claimed major tournament titles last season. Seniors Seth Ciasulli (141) and David Craig (184) both captured EIWA championships to lead Lehigh to a second place team finish. Both men are having strong seasons in 2009-10 as Craig is 16-4 and ranked 15th at 184, while Ciasulli is 16-10 and ranked 17th at 141. Both men currently own 80 career victories.

MASTERS OF THE MIDLANDS

The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a school-record setting performance at the 47th Midlands Championships in late December. A record six of Lehigh's 12 entrants placed in the top eight at their respective weight classes in one of college wrestling's most prestigious and challenging in-season tournaments. Senior Matt Fisk turned in the highest finish with his fourth place medal at 133. Sophomore Zach Rey reached the semifinals at 285 before placing fifth, while senior Mike Galante also placed fifth, at 165. Lehigh's other three place-winners, Seth Ciasulli (141), Robert Hamlin (174) and Joe Kennedy (197) all claimed eighth place.

COMEBACK KIDS

Coming from behind in dual meets has become commonplace for the Mountain Hawks this season. Since January 1, Lehigh has enjoyed three impressive comebacks in dual meets. At the Virginia Duals, Lehigh spotted Oklahoma a 16-0 lead after four bouts before winning the final six weight classes, all by decision to upset the Sooners 18-16. Two weeks later in Ithaca, N.Y., Lehigh trailed rival Cornell 15-6 after seven bouts, but three consecutive decisions from David Craig, Joe Kennedy and Zach Rey helped Lehigh earn a 15-15. Last weekend the Mountain Hawks spotted Virginia Tech a 12-3 lead at intermission, before capturing the final five weight classes to win 24-12.
