SETTING THE SCENE

With final exams now complete, Lehigh returns to the mats for the first time in two weeks with a pair of duals against Garden State foes Rutgers and Rider. The Mountain Hawks enter their final two duals of 2008 looking to start the dual season with a 10-0 record for the first time in 41 years. Lehigh's last action was at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational on December 5-6, where the Mountain Hawks finished 16th with three place winners: Trevor Chinn, Joe Kennedy and Mike Galante. Today, the Mountain Hawks will be challenged by a vastly improved Rutgers team that is turning the corner under second-year head coach Scott Goodale, and an always tough Rider squad, led by longtime head coach Gary Taylor.

FAST FACTS

- The Mountain Hawks are off to their best dual meet start since the 1999-2000 season, when they opened with eight consecutive dual wins. Lehigh has not started a dual season 10-0 since the 1966-67 campaign.
- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 789-379-22, which ranks seventh among all Division I wrestling programs.
- Lehigh's No. 9 national ranking is the program's highest since December 2005.

Lehigh opened up the EIWA dual season by winning seven of ten bouts in a 24-13 win over Rutgers. The Mountain Hawks earned six wins by decision and a quick pin from sophomore Mike Galante to win their third straight dual and improve to 3-4 on the season. Galante hit Matt Rigoglioso with a cement job early in their bout at 165 and secured the fall in just 23 seconds to put Lehigh ahead 18-10 after seven bouts. Alex Caruso and David Craig cemented the victory with wins at 174 and 184 respectively, while Justin Allen, Kevin Vinh, Trevor Chinn and Dave Nakasone all added wins by decision for the Brown and White.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

Lehigh won six of the first seven bouts, picking up a pair of falls along the way as the Mountain Hawks downed Rider 24-16 in the final home dual of the season. Seth Ciasulli and Alex Caruso delivered wins by fall and Trevor Chinn upset nationally ranked Don Fisch 3-1 at 149 as Lehigh built a 24-3 advantage before the visiting Broncs captured the final three bouts. Ciasulli continued his pinning dominance inside Grace Hall with a second period fall over Tommy Lorenzo at 133. Freshman Mitch Berger set Lehigh up for a promising evening with an 8-3 triumph over Ilyass Elmsaouri, his first home dual win in the Brown and White. The win was Lehigh's second over Rider in the 2007-08 season.

SERIES HISTORIES

Lehigh leads the all-time series against both schools it will face today. The Mountain Hawks have been dominant against Rutgers, winning 37 of 38 meetings, including the last 34 matches with the Scarlet Knights. Lehigh is making just its second visit to Rutgers since 1976. The Mountain Hawks defeated Rider twice last season, to improve their record versus the Broncs to 12-5. Lehigh and Rider are meeting for the 12th straight season, with Lehigh having won 11 of the last 12 duals in the series.

Lehigh could also face current No. 12 Central Michigan, No. 17 Edinboro, No. 21 Old Dominion and No. 23 Virginia, plus Oklahoma State and Penn at the Virginia Duals.

SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers has been a busy team in the early season, as the Scarlet Knights have already wrestled 14 duals and sent wrestlers to five open tournaments. The Scarlet Knights have been packing multiple duals into every competition day, en route to an 11-3 record. Rutgers wrestled four duals at the Journeymen/Brute Sprawl & Brawl, four matches at the Hoosier Duals, and most recently three matches at the Lock Haven Duals, where Rutgers beat Lock Haven, Drexel and East Stroudsburg. Scott Goodale is in his second season at Rutgers, where he is working to turn the program into a contender within the EIWA. The Scarlet Knights' top wrestlers have been sophomore David Greenwald, who has 17 wins and 15 falls at 141, sophomore heavyweight Dominick Russo, and freshman Scott Winston (157), who was one of the nation's top recruits a year ago.

FRESH START

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who picked up his first career win at Pittsburgh, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

VEGAS BABY, VEGAS

Lehigh was last on the mats two weeks ago at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Senior Trevor Chinn went 6-2 en route to fifth place at 149, leading a group of three Mountain Hawks who placed in the event. Freshman Joe Kennedy placed sixth at 197, while junior Mike Galante took seventh at 165. As a team, Lehigh finished in 16th place with 54.5 points, despite having just eight wrestlers compete in the tournament. The eight Lehigh wrestlers totaled a 26-16 record with 10 bonus wins. Nebraska captured the team title, followed by Cornell and Minnesota.

IN FRONT BY A CHINN

The lone senior in Lehigh's starting lineup, Trevor Chinn has been making the most of his final season in the Brown and White. Chinn won his first 11 bouts to start the season and leads the Mountain Hawks with a 14-2 record. The senior co-captain is Lehigh's highest ranked grappler in the national polls, at No. 11 at 149. Chinn is the only Lehigh starter who has not lost a dual match this season (8-0) and his two losses so far this season were by decision to wrestlers currently ranked second and seventh in the nation. A two-time NCAA qualifier, Chinn boasts a 75-39 career record, including a 40-19 mark in duals.

SCOUTING THE BRONCS

Unlike Rutgers, Rider has had a very low-key start to its season, wrestling just one dual meet, a 27-16 win over Lock Haven at Alumni Gym on November 21. The Broncs have been active in open tournaments, sending wrestlers to the East Stroudsburg and Penn State Nittany Lion Opens, as well as the Keystone Classic, where they placed fourth out of ten teams. Head coach Gary Taylor is in his 31st season, and holds the third most career victories (339) among active NCAA coaches. Rider's top returning wrestler is senior Doug Umbehauer, but the 184-pounder has yet to compete for the Broncs this season. Senior Jason Lapham (165) won the East Stroudsburg Open last month, while junior Michael Kessler (157) finished in second place.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Senior Trevor Chinn (**Canandaigua, N.Y.**) and junior Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2008-09 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as two-time NCAA qualifiers and one-time EIWA runner-ups. Fisk also captained the Mountain Hawks last season, while deferring his eligibility.

COMING UP NEXT...

The Mountain Hawks will have another hiatus of nearly two weeks because of the upcoming holidays. Lehigh's next action will be in 2009, as the Brown and White head to Morgantown, West Virginia to face the Mountaineers on Friday, January 2. The match marks the first meeting between the schools since 1921 and Lehigh's first ever visit to Morgantown. Two days later, Lehigh will conclude its New Year's road trip with its 97th meeting against longtime rival Penn State.
