SETTING THE SCENE

No. 7 Lehigh returns to the mats for the first time in two weeks as the Mountain Hawks will wrap-up their home dual schedule with matches against Virginia Tech and Rutgers. The Mountain Hawks were off last weekend after rallying from a 15-6 deficit with three bouts remaining to tie Cornell 15-15 in Ithaca, N.Y. back on January 22. Lehigh will have to contend with two more ranked foes this weekend. Virginia Tech has risen to 19th in the latest polls, with wins in four of its last five duals, while Rutgers entered the rankings at No. 23 this week, and is in the midst of a school-record 12-dual unbeaten streak.

FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 819-383-23, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks are unbeaten in their last 11 EIWA duals, and are 16-2-1 against EIWA foes since the start of the 2007-08 season.
- Rutgers has beaten Lehigh just once in 39 all-time meetings, and the Brown and White have won 35 straight duals versus the Scarlet Knights.
- A total of eight Lehigh wrestlers are ranked in the top-20 nationally by either InterMat, W.I.N. Magazine or Amateur Wrestling News.

In quarterfinal round action at the Virginia Duals, Lehigh easily defeated Virginia Tech 27-6 to reach the semifinals. Bruce Kelly got the Mountain Hawks started with a win over four-time Virginia state champ Mike Akers at 125, while Troy Minarovic impressed with a win over three-time Virginia champ Andrew Shuler. Lehigh's two losses were at 133 and 141, but Minarovic's win started a seven bout Lehigh run to end the dual. Travis Doto delivered bonus points with a first period pin of Chris Martin at 165.

In its first action in two weeks, Lehigh won eight of ten bouts in a convincing win over Rutgers at the College Avenue Gym. The Mountain Hawks received bonus wins from Matt Fisk, Trevor Chinn and Joe Kennedy as they moved to 9-0 and picked up their second dual win over an EIWA foe. After dropping the opening bout at 125, Fisk gave Lehigh a lead it would not relinquish, with a 10-2 major decision over Brian Bollette at 133. Chinn handed David Seidenberg a loss by major decision 11-3 at 149, while Kennedy impressed in a 12-1 major over Karim Mahmoud at 197. Rutgers' lone wins came at 125 and 157.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

SCOUTING THE HOKIES

Virginia Tech brings a 14-4 dual record into Bethlehem on Friday night. Since the New Year, the Hokies have posted an 8-3 record and have soared into the top 25 in the NWCA Coaches Poll. Virginia Tech had won four straight duals, including its second win this season over rival Virginia, before dropping a 21-17 decision to Central Michigan in Blacksburg, Va. last weekend. The Hokies boast five ranked wrestlers, led by Jesse Dong, who was named the Outstanding Wrestler at the Virginia Duals and is ranked fifth at 157. Other ranked Hokies include Jarrod Garnett (No. 14 at 125), Chris Diaz (No. 10 at 141), Matt Epperly (No. 20 at 165) and Tommy Spellman (No. 19 at 184). Kevin Dresser is in his fourth season as head coach at Virginia Tech and led the Hokies to a record 20 dual wins and eight NCAA Qualifiers last season.

SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers brings one of its strongest teams in recent memory into Stabler Arena. The Scarlet Knights are 16-4-1 in duals and are currently riding a school-record 12-dual unbeaten streak. Last weekend Rutgers picked up impressive wins over Virginia and Navy, which vaulted the Scarlet Knights into the national rankings at No. 23. Rutgers has three wrestlers currently ranked by InterMat, led by heavyweight Dominick Russo, the reigning EIWA Wrestler of the Week, who comes in at No. 8. Also ranked for the Scarlet Knights are senior Lamar Brown (No. 17 at 197) and junior Daryl Coccozo (No. 20 at 157). Lehigh and Rutgers wrestlers crossed paths at the Midlands with Zach Rey defeating Russo 7-2 in the quarterfinals, and Rutgers' Trevor Melde upsetting Seth Ciasulli in the Round of 16. The Scarlet Knights will have several familiar faces on their bench as John Leonardis (Lehigh '97) and Cory Cooperman (Lehigh '06) serve on the staff of third-year head coach Scott Goodale.

THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years

MATT ON A MISSION

Co-captain Matt Fisk has enjoyed a strong first half of his senior season. Fisk has wrestled 18 bouts and has come away with 13 wins including six bonus victories: three pins, two technical falls and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 13th at 133 by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and is just the seventh three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 80-36 career overall mark with 42 bonus wins and a 49-17 career dual meet record.

A FRESH START

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals in November. He owns a 17-9 overall record and enters this weekend's action having won his last four dual matches.

LET'S GO JOE!

After starting the season 2-6, sophomore Joe Kennedy has bounced back, winning nine of his last 13 bouts. More than half of Kennedy's bouts have come against wrestlers currently ranked in the InterMat top 20, including nine matches with men ranked in the top 10. Kennedy already owned wins over sixth-ranked Eric Lapotsky of Oklahoma and eighth-ranked Trevor Brandvold of Wisconsin. The Milford, Pa. native then added a 5-4, two-tiebreaker win over No. 5 Cam Simaz of Cornell in Lehigh's 15-15 tie with the Big Red on January 22. The win vaulted Kennedy into the national rankings at No. 19. Kennedy went 20-12 as a true freshman last season before defaulting out of the EIWA Championships with an injury.

ZACH ATTACK

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's most successful wrestler this season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year opened this season with 16 straight victories before falling in the Midlands semifinals. Rey is 12-2 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open in December, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh wrestler ranked in the top ten nationally.

MASTERS OF THE MIDLANDS

The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a school-record setting performance at the 47th Midlands Championships in late December. A record six of Lehigh's 12 entrants placed in the top eight at their respective weight classes in one of college wrestling's most prestigious and challenging in-season tournaments. Senior Matt Fisk turned in the highest finish with his fourth place medal at 133. Sophomore Zach Rey reached the semifinals at 285 before placing fifth, while senior Mike Galante also placed fifth, at 165. Lehigh's other three place-winners, Seth Ciasulli (141), Robert Hamlin (174) and Joe Kennedy (197) all claimed eighth place.

THE RETURNING CHAMPS

The Mountain Hawks boast two wrestlers who claimed major tournament titles last season. Seniors Seth Ciasulli (141) and David Craig (184) both captured EIWA championships to lead Lehigh to a second place team finish. Both men are having strong seasons in 2009-10 as Craig is 15-3 and ranked 15th at 184, while Ciasulli is 14-9 and ranked 17th at 141. Craig owns 79 career victories while Ciasulli is not far behind with 78.

SENIOR SEND-OFF

This weekend's duals mark the final home duals for Lehigh's 11-member senior class. The Mountain Hawks wrestling class of 2010 will be recognized prior to Friday night's match with Virginia Tech. Here's a look at Lehigh's 11 seniors and their accomplishments in the Brown and White:
