### SETTING THE SCENE

No. 11 Lehigh returns to dual meet competition for the first time since late November as the Mountain Hawks return to the prestigious Virginia Duals for the third time in as many seasons. The Mountain Hawks have not wrestled a dual since going 2-1 at the Northeast Duals Thanksgiving weekend in Troy, N.Y. Last week, the Brown and White returned to action at the Midlands Championships, where Lehigh placed seventh as a team and set a school record with six place winners. Lehigh is making its ninth appearance at the Virginia Duals, having won the tournament in 2003 and placing second in 2004 and 2009. The Mountain Hawks are seeded third and will open up with UC Davis on Friday before taking on either Edinboro or Ohio in their second dual.

### FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 814-382-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks won their lone Virginia Duals title in 2003 and have placed in four of their last five trips to the event (2000, 2003, 2004, 2009).
- A total of eight Lehigh wrestlers are ranked in the top-20 nationally by either InterMat, W.I.N. Magazine or Amateur Wrestling News.

**SERIES HISTORY**

**LEHIGH AGAINST THE VIRGINIA DUALS FIELD**

Lehigh has faced 13 of the other 15 schools in the field in its history. The Mountain Hawks are 88-114-4 all-time versus the teams in the field, largely in part to Lehigh's 34-61-3 record with rival Penn State. This season, Lehigh has already beaten Penn State and Michigan, while the Mountain Hawks will wrestle Virginia Tech next month.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO**

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

Lehigh could also face current No. 4 Oklahoma State, No. 10 Oklahoma, No. 13 Kent State, No. 16 Edinboro, No. 23 Virginia and No. 25 Old Dominion plus Penn State at the Virginia Duals.

**MATT ON A MISSION**

Co-captain Matt Fisk has enjoyed a strong first half of his senior season. Fisk has wrestled 15 bouts and has come away with 11 wins including five bonus victories: two pins, two technical falls and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 13th at 133 by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and is just the sixth three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 78-35 career overall mark with 41 bonus wins and a 47-16 career dual meet record.

**A FRESH START**

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals last month, dropping a pair of matches. He owns a 13-8 overall record and has placed third at both the Clarion and Nittany Lion Opens this season.

**HAMLIN HAS MAJOR IMPACT**

Freshman Robert Hamlin won the starting spot at 174 and has shined in the first half of this season with wins in his first five varsity duals and a 9-5 overall record. Hamlin was Lehigh's Deferred Wrestler of the Year last season, after going 30-5 and placing in the top three in five open tournaments. Hamlin placed eighth at the Midlands and is ranked No. 18 by InterMat.

**ZACH ATTACK**

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's best wrestler through the first half of the season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year has opened this season with 16 straight victories before falling in the Midlands semifinals. Rey is a perfect 8-0 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh wrestler ranked in the top ten nationally.

**MONSTERS OF THE MIDLANDS**

The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a school-record setting performance at the 47th Midlands Championships last week in Evanston, Ill. A record six of Lehigh's 12 entrants placed in the top eight at their respective weight classes in one of college wrestling's most prestigious and challenging in-season tournaments. Senior Matt Fisk turned in the highest finish with his fourth place medal at 133. Sophomore Zach Rey reached the semifinals at 285 before placing fifth, while senior Mike Galante also placed fifth, at 165. Lehigh's other three place-winners, Seth Ciasulli (141), Robert Hamlin (174) and Joe Kennedy (197) all claimed eighth place. As a team, the Mountain Hawks ten-man scoring team accumulated 65.5 points, good for seventh place overall. That score does not include the 16 team points Galante would have earned as one of the two "non-scorers" for Lehigh.

**LEHIGH ALL-TIME VIRGINIA DUALS RESULTS**

Lehigh is making its ninth appearance at the Virginia Duals, and its third in the last three seasons. The Mountain Hawks are 16-12 all-time in the duals, including a 3-1 showing at last year's duals, en route to a second place finish. Lehigh captured its only Virginia Duals title in 2003.
