SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh seeks its best start in school history as the Mountain Hawks will compete in one of the nation's largest and most prestigious dual meet tournaments, the Virginia Duals. The Mountain Hawks opened 2009 by moving to 12-0 overall with wins at West Virginia and Penn State last weekend and at No. 8 in the national polls, Lehigh earned the top seed in the 16-team field for this two-day dual tournament. Lehigh is making its eighth appearance at the Virginia Duals, having won the tournament in 2003. The Mountain Hawks will open the tournament against Ohio University and will face either No. 8 seed Kent State or EIWA rival Bucknell in its second dual of the tournament.

FAST FACTS

- The Mountain Hawks 12-0 start to the dual season matches the 1961-62 Lehigh team for the best start in school history.
- Celebrating its 100th season of wrestling, Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 797-379-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks won their lone Virginia Duals title in 2003 and have placed in three of their last four trips to the event (2000, 2003, 2004).

LEHIGH AGAINST THE VIRGINIA DUALS FIELD

Lehigh has faced 10 of the other 15 schools in the field in its history. The Mountain Hawks are 109-79-2 all-time versus the teams in the field. This season, Lehigh has already wrestled Rider and Oklahoma State, while the Mountain Hawks have upcoming meets scheduled against Bucknell, Navy and Penn.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

Coach Santoro returns to his native Bethlehem for his first season as head coach of the Mountain Hawks. He returns to Lehigh after spending the last five years as the head coach at Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors. Santoro posted a 48-41-1 record in five seasons at College Park, including an impressive 33-9 dual mark the last two years. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

One of the nation's most storied wrestling programs; Lehigh holds a unique record of success that has helped the program become the premier program in Eastern college wrestling. Lehigh leads all Eastern schools with 26 individual NCAA Championships won, and ranks ninth nationally with 127 All-American medals won. NO ORDINARY JOE

Freshman Joe Kennedy is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, seven true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including four last season. Kennedy, who leads the Brown and White with six wins by major decision this season, will look to match Matt Fisk (2006) and David Craig (2007) as true freshman NCAA Qualifiers for the Mountain Hawks.

VEGAS BABY, VEGAS

Last month, Lehigh enjoyed its first tournament action of the season, competing at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Senior Trevor Chinn went 6-2 en route to fifth place at 149, leading a group of three Mountain Hawks who placed in the event. Freshman Joe Kennedy placed sixth at 197, while junior Mike Galante took seventh at 165. As a team, Lehigh finished in 16th place with 54.5 points, despite having just eight wrestlers compete in the tournament. The eight Lehigh wrestlers totaled a 26-16 record with 10 bonus wins. Nebraska captured the team title, followed by Cornell and Minnesota.

IN FRONT BY A CHINN

The lone senior in Lehigh's starting lineup, Trevor Chinn has been making the most of his final season in the Brown and White. Chinn won his first 11 bouts to start the season and leads the Mountain Hawks with a 16-4 record. The senior co-captain is Lehigh's highest ranked grappler in the national polls, at No. 14 at 149. A two-time NCAA qualifier, Chinn boasts a 77-41 career record, including a 42-21 mark in duals.

RANK AND FILE

Despite its record tying 12-0 start, Lehigh has just three wrestlers ranked in InterMat's latest rankings. Senior Trevor Chinn and Alex Caruso are the only Mountain Hawks to be ranked in all three major polls. Three Lehigh grapplers: juniors Seth Ciasulli and David Craig and freshman Zach Rey are not rated by the NWCA but are ranked by W.I.N. Magazine and/or the Amateur Wrestling News.
