### SETTING THE SCENE

Lehigh returns home for the first time in two months as the Mountain Hawks will host West Virginia in the annual Sheridan Dual Friday night before welcoming Navy on Saturday in Lehigh's EIWA dual opener. The Mountain Hawks moved back into the top-10 at No. 9 after reaching the finals of the Virginia Duals last weekend. Senior David Craig led Lehigh with four wins in four bouts last week, while the trio of sophomore Sean Bilodeau, freshman Robert Hamlin and sophomore Joe Kennedy combined to go 9-3 with three pins and five bonus wins. West Virginia visits Bethlehem for the first time in 89 years, while Lehigh and Navy will celebrate the 100th anniversary of their first dual meeting in this, the 90th all-time meeting between the EIWA rivals.

### FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 817-383-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- Lehigh and Navy are wrestling in a dual meet for the 59th consecutive year, the second longest active streak for Lehigh (Penn State - 77).
- A total of nine Lehigh wrestlers are ranked in the top-20 nationally by either InterMat, W.I.N. Magazine or Amateur Wrestling News.

Lehigh opened up the 2009 portion of its schedule in impressive fashion, winning the first nine bouts of the evening in a 35-3 rout. The Mountain Hawks enjoyed four bonus wins, including falls from Zach Rey and Seth Ciasulli and major decisions from Sean Bilodeau and Joe Kennedy to win their 11th straight dual meet to start the season. On a night when scoring was hard to come by, Bilodeau had three of Lehigh's eight takedowns in an 8-0 win over Ryan Goodman at 157. Mike Galante, Alex Caruso and David Craig extended the lead with decisions, while Mitch Berger and Matt Fisk were also winners for the Mountain Hawks.

The Mountain Hawks bounced back from their first loss of the season by winning seven of 10 bouts in a 30-13 victory over Navy at Halsey Field House. Mike Galante helped erase a 13-12 Lehigh deficit with his fourth fall of the season and classmate Seth Ciasulli also added a pin as the Mountain Hawks moved to 16-1 on the dual season. Five of the first six bouts resulted in bonus points with Navy earning a major decision at 125 and a pin at 149. Matt Fisk won by injury default at 133 joining Galante and Ciasulli with six-point wins. The Mountain Hawks captured the last four bouts of the dual, winning all four by decision.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO**

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

This weekend, Lehigh celebrates the 100th anniversary of its first meeting with Navy with the 90th meeting between the two EIWA rivals. Navy is Lehigh's second most often wrestled opponent after Penn State. The Mountain Hawks have won 12 of the last 13 duals against the Midshipmen. **SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS**

West Virginia comes to Bethlehem looking for its first dual win of the season Friday night. The Mountaineers fell to 0-5 in duals this season with a 24-9 loss to Michigan State Saturday in East Lansing, Mich. West Virginia received wins from Shane Young at 125, Donnie Jones at 165 and Kyle Rooney at 197. The Mountaineers' lone ranked wrestler is sophomore Colin Johnston, who comes in at No. 19 at 133. Jones is not ranked by InterMat but has appeared in the top-20 in other polls. At 141, All-American Brandon Rader recently returned to the lineup after missing most of the last two seasons with injuries. West Virginia competed at the Las Vegas Invitational and the Reno Tournament of Champions and will host the EWL Tournament on March 7. Craig Turnbull is in his 32nd year as head coach of the Mountaineers.

**THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP**

Seniors Matt Fisk (Wyalusing, Pa.) and Seth Ciasulli (Easton, Pa.) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years.

**SCOUTING THE MIDSHIPMEN**

Navy concludes a weekend trip through eastern Pennsylvania with Saturday's dual against the Mountain Hawks. The Midshipmen spent most of the first half of the season on the tournament circuit before opening their dual season with an 18-17 win over American last Friday. The Mids will visit East Stroudsburg Friday before visiting Lehigh on Saturday. Navy won the Navy classic, which it hosted in November, and also competed at the Las Vegas Invitational, Reno Tournament of Champions and most recently the Southern Scuffle. Navy boasts a pair of ranked wrestlers in Bryce Sadoris, the defending EIWA Champion at 149 who has moved up to 157 and is ranked eighth, and heavyweight Scott Steele, who is back in the lineup after missing last season with an injury and is also ranked eighth. Bruce Burnett is in his tenth season as Navy's head coach.

## MATT ON A MISSION

Co-captain Matt Fisk has enjoyed a strong first half of his senior season. Fisk has wrestled 15 bouts and has come away with 11 wins including five bonus victories: two pins, two technical falls and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 13th at 133 by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and is just the sixth three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 78-35 career overall mark with 41 bonus wins and a 47-16 career dual meet record.

## A FRESH START

Freshman Joey Napoli is the latest in a recent string of true freshmen who have earned starting spots in the Lehigh lineup. Since the start of the 2005-06 season, eight true freshmen have started duals for the Brown and White, including Joe Kennedy last season. Napoli made his dual debut at the Northeast Duals in November. He owns a 14-9 overall record and picked up his first career dual meet win, over Quentin Fuentes of Oklahoma State at the Virginia Duals last weekend.

## ZACH ATTACK

Sophomore heavyweight Zach Rey has been Lehigh's best wrestler through the first half of the season. The New Jersey native, who reached the EIWA Finals and the All-America Round of 12 last year has opened this season with 16 straight victories before falling in the Midlands semifinals. Rey is 10-1 in dual meets and went 5-0 to take the title at the Nittany Lion Open in December, defeating Missouri's Junior World Champion Dominique Bradley along the way. Rey went 23-6 last year as a freshman, and is currently the only Lehigh wrestler ranked in the top ten nationally.

## MASTERS OF THE MIDLANDS

The Mountain Hawks enjoyed a school-record setting performance at the 47th Midlands Championships last month. A record six of Lehigh's 12 entrants placed in the top eight at their respective weight classes in one of college wrestling's most prestigious and challenging in-season tournaments. Senior Matt Fisk turned in the highest finish with his fourth place medal at 133. Sophomore Zach Rey reached the semifinals at 285 before placing fifth, while senior Mike Galante also placed fifth, at 165. Lehigh's other three place-winners, Seth Ciasulli (141), Robert Hamlin (174) and Joe Kennedy (197) all claimed eighth place.

## WOW, WHAT A COMEBACK!

Lehigh went 3-1 last weekend at the Virginia Duals to place second in the event for the second straight year. The highlight for the Mountain Hawks was a come-from-behind 18-16 win over No. 10 Oklahoma in the semifinals. Lehigh spotted the Sooners a 16-0 lead after 149 before winning the final six bouts, all by decision, beating four ranked wrestlers along the way. Sean Bilodeau started the run, while Mike Galante, Robert Hamlin, David Craig and Joe Kennedy added wins, before Zach Rey completed the comeback with a 3-2 win over Nathan Fernandez at heavyweight. Craig led all Lehigh wrestlers, going 4-0 on the weekend, while Bilodeau went 3-1 with two pins. Kennedy also had a strong weekend, going 3-1 with a pin, a major decision, and a 4-1 win over then-fourth ranked Eric Lapotsky of Oklahoma, Kennedy's second win over a top-10 wrestler in as many weeks.
