#### SETTING THE SCENE

No. 14 Lehigh takes to the road for the first time this season as the Mountain Hawks will wrestle two opponents from the Big Ten Conference, Ohio State and Michigan. The Mountain Hawks moved to 3-0 in duals this season with home victories over in-state rivals Penn State and Pittsburgh. Lehigh will get a tough test from the fifth-ranked Buckeyes on Friday, a team that finished second at the last two NCAA tournaments and features seven ranked wrestlers, before visiting Michigan on Sunday in what has become one of Lehigh's most renowned non-conference wrestling rivalries.

#### FAST FACTS

- Lehigh's all-time dual meet record stands at 811-380-22, which ranks sixth among all Division I wrestling programs.
- The Mountain Hawks have won their last 11 duals dating back to last season and are 26-1 in two years under Pat Santoro.
- Ohio State has finished second at the NCAA tournament in each of the last two seasons. The Mountain Hawks and Buckeyes will meet for just the third time on Friday.
- Lehigh is wrestling a dual against Michigan for the 33rd straight season.

In a back-and-forth affair, the Mountain Hawks used a pair of three-bout winning streaks to beat the host Buckeyes in their second match at the Buckeye Duals. Lehigh raced to an early 13-0 lead as Derek Zinck pinned James King in just 22 seconds, Troy Letters won by major decision over John Clark and Brad Dillon won by decision over Anthony Magistrelli. Ohio State won the next three bouts to take a 14-13 lead, but Lehigh's lightweights took the next three bouts, decisions by Mario Stuart, Matt Ciasulli and Taylor Graham to take the lead for good.

Two major decisions for No. 22 Lehigh helped the Mountain Hawks knock off their second ranked team of the year, downing No. 8 Michigan to move to 3-0 on the dual season. The Mountain Hawks won six of the ten matches and benefitted from the bonus points earned by Matt Fisk and Trevor Chinn to pull away for the win. Fisk and Chinn were able to avenge Lehigh losses in prior bouts with major decision wins, Fisk 11-1 over Zac Stevens at 133 and Chinn 17-5 over Justin Chrzanowski at 149. Sean Bilodeau, Mike Galante, David Craig and Zach Rey all added wins by decision for Lehigh.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO**

Coach Santoro enters his second season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In his first season, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year after guiding the Mountain Hawks to a school-record 23-1 dual record and second place at the EIWA Championships. He spent the previous five years resurrecting the Maryland program, as he went 48-41-1 in duals and guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. Prior to his stint at Maryland, Santoro spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Lehigh, including eight as Greg Strobel's top assistant. He was named NWCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2003 after helping guide the Brown and White to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers only four-time All-American.

**OHIO STATE HEAD COACH TOM RYAN**

Coach Ryan enters his fourth season as head coach at Ohio State. The 2009 NWCA National Coach of the Year, Ryan has led the Buckeyes to back-to-back NCAA runner-up finishes. Ryan owns a 43-13 dual record as Ohio State head coach and holds a 152-96-1 record overall, which includes an 11-year stint as head coach at Hofstra. In three seasons at Ohio State, Ryan has mentored a pair of national champions (two-time champ J Jagers and Mike Pucillo) and his wrestlers have totaled 12 All-America medals. Ryan began his college wrestling career at Syracuse before transferring to Iowa where he was a two-time Big Ten Champion and All-American.

**MICHIGAN HEAD COACH JOE MCFARLAND**

Coach McFarland is in his 11th season as head coach of the Wolverines. He has played a major role in molding Michigan wrestling into a national power. Under McFarland's guidance, Michigan has won three Big Ten dual meet titles and placed in the top ten at the NCAA Championships in eight of the last nine seasons. McFarland's wrestlers have won three NCAA titles, 39 All-America medals and 17 Big Ten championships. McFarland is a 1985 graduate of Michigan, where he was a four-time All-America and two time NCAA finalist. His 132 career wins rank third in school annals.

**SERIES HISTORIES**

Lehigh and Michigan are wrestling in a dual meet for the 33rd straight season. The Wolverines lead the series versus Lehigh 23-12 and had won three straight duals in the series before Lehigh won last year's meeting. The Mountain Hawks have only faced Ohio State twice, losing to the Buckeyes in November 2001 at the Sheridan Duals and defeating Ohio State at the Buckeye Duals in January 2004.

Lehigh could also face current No. 4 Oklahoma State, No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 15 Edinboro, No. 18 Kent State, No. 21 Old Dominion and No. 22 Virginia plus Penn State, Michigan and Virginia Tech at the Virginia Duals.

**SCOUTING THE BUCKEYES**

Ohio State opens its dual season with Friday night's dual against the Mountain Hawks. The Buckeyes have finished second at each of the last two NCAA Championships and are currently ranked fifth in the nation by the NWCA. Ohio State opened its season with a second place finish at the Brockport Oklahoma Gold Classic in New York last weekend. Seniors Reece Humphrey and Lance Palmer won titles and both enter the weekend ranked in the top three in their respective weight classes. Humphrey is ranked first at 141 after bumping up from 133 while Palmer is ranked third at 149. Also ranked third in the nation is senior Mike Pucillo, the 2008 NCAA Champion at 184. Pucillo was ranked No. 1 in the country before losing in the finals on Saturday. Ohio State, which was 16-2 in duals last season, has seven ranked wrestlers in its projected lineup.

**MATT ON A MISSION**

Senior co-captain Matt Fisk is off to a strong start to his senior season. Fisk has wrestled three bouts and has come away with three bonus wins, a pin, a technical fall and a major decision. Fisk is ranked 12th at his weight class by InterMat and comes off a 26-9 season as a junior. The Wyalusing, Pa. native is a three-time NCAA qualifier and recently became just the sixth three-time Lehigh wrestling captain in school annals. Fisk owns a 70-31 career overall mark with 39 bonus wins and a 44-14 career dual meet record.

**THE (CO-)CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP**

Seniors Matt Fisk (**Wyalusing, Pa.**) and Seth Ciasulli (**Easton, Pa.**) will serve as co-captains for the 2009-10 season. Both wrestlers enter this season as three-time NCAA qualifiers. Fisk becomes just the sixth Lehigh wrestler to captain the team three straight years.

**SCOUTING THE WOLVERINES**

Michigan also opens its dual meet season on Sunday when the Mountain Hawks visit Cliff Keen Arena. The Wolverines were 10-8-1 in duals last season and had a streak of eight straight seasons in the top ten at the NCAA Championships snapped with an 11th place finish in St. Louis last March. Michigan enters this season in somewhat of a rebuilding mode as the Wolverines feature zero seniors among their probable starters, while as many as three true freshmen could compete this weekend. The Wolverines feature one nationally ranked wrestler in junior Anthony Biondo, who comes in at No. 13 at 197. Michigan sent wrestlers to both the Eastern Michigan Open (Nov. 7) and the Michigan State Open (Nov. 15). Heavyweight Eddie Phillips won the EMU Open, while three others notched runner-up finishes. Biondo and freshman Dan Yates (165) picked up titles at the Michigan State Open.

### LEHIGH VERSUS THE BIG TEN

### HAMLIN HAS MAJOR IMPACT

Freshman Robert Hamlin won the starting spot at 174 and has shined early this season with wins in his first three varsity duals. Hamlin had his biggest moment in last Friday's dual win over rival Penn State when he won a convincing 17-8 major decision over 20th-ranked David Erwin, which tied the dual at 14 and shifted the momentum to Lehigh's side. Hamlin was Lehigh's Deferred Wrestler of the Year last season, after going 30-5 and placing in the top three in five open tournaments.

### THE LAST MEN STANDING

Lehigh has trotted out the same ten-man lineup in each of its first three duals this season. Of those ten wrestlers, four have emerged unscathed through three matches. Senior Matt Fisk (133) not only is 3-0, but has also produced 15 dual points for the Mountain Hawks with a fall, a technical fall and a major decision. Joining Fisk at 3-0 are freshman Robert Hamlin (174), senior David Craig (184) and sophomore Zach Rey (285).
